# LABOUR FORCE STATUS AND EDUCATIONAL ATTAINMENT, AUSTRALIA FEBRUARY 1989

## SUMMARY OF FINDINGS

## Educational Attainment

In February 1989 the number of persons aged 15 and over in the scope of the survey was estimated as $12,618,100$. This estimate was comprised of $4,852,800$ persons ( $38 \%$ ) who reported having a post-school qualification; $7,197,200$ persons ( $57 \%$ ) who were without a post-school qualification and 568,100 persons ( $5 \%$ ) still attending school.

Of the $4,852,800$ persons with post-school qualifications, 957,600 (20\%) had a degree or higher qualification; $1,670,700$ (34\%) had a trade qualification or apprenticeship; $2,193,200$ ( $45 \%$ ) had a certificate or diploma and 31,400 (1\%) had other qualifications.

Of the $7,197,200$ persons without post-school qualifications only $1,465,900(20 \%)$ had attended the highest level of secondary school available.

## Educational attainment trends - 1984 to 1989

## Employment

In 1984, of the total employed, 44 per cent had post-school qualifications. By 1989 this had increased to 47 per cent. The proportion of employed females with post-school qualifications increased from 39 per cent in 1984 to 43 per cent in 1989, and males increased from 47 per cent to 50 per cent over the same period.

Those without post-school qualifications constituted 55 per cent of the total employed in 1984. This proportion had decreased to 51 per cent by 1989.

## Unemployment

In 1984, of the total unemployed, an estimated 28 per cent had post-school qualifications. In 1989 this figure was again 28 per cent. Females showed an increase from 29 per cent in 1984 to 31 per cent in 1989 while the male figure decreased from 27 per cent to 26 per cent over the same period.

Those without post-school qualifications constituted 68 per cent of the total unemployed in 1984 and had dropped to 65 per cent by 1989 .

Of the total unemployed, the estimated number of persons still at school had risen from 4 per cent in 1984 to 6 per cent in 1989.

The unemployment rate for persons with post-school qualifications was 6.9 per cent in February 1984 and 4.5 per cent in February 1989. For persons without post-school qualifications the 1989 unemployment rate was 9.1 per cent, a substantial decrease from the 12.6 per cent recorded in 1984.

## Participation in the Labour Force

While persons with post-school qualifications reported a participation rate of around 76 per cent for both 1984 and 1989, the female participation rate rose from 61 per cent to 66 per cent. For males the rate dropped from 87 per cent to 84 per cent.

Similar movements occurred for persons without post-school qualifications. The moderate increase for persons (from $56 \%$ to $59 \%$ ) was entirely due to the rise in the female participation rate ( $40 \%$ to $46 \%$ ). Males recorded a decrease in their participation rate from 76 per cent in 1984 to 75 per cent in 1989.

## Employment

Some 73 per cent of persons with a post-school qualification were employed in February 1989 compared with 53 per cent of persons without post-school qualifications. Amongst those without post-school qualifications the highest employment level was 67 per cent for persons who had attended the highest level of schooling available. Of those persons who had left school early aged 16 or over, 65 per cent were employed while only 43 per cent of those who left aged 15 or under were employed. These latter figures are affected by persons aged 65 and over who had a tendency to leave school at an earlier age.

The chances of persons with a degree qualification being employed were greater if their main field of study was Medicine ( $86 \%$ ), Administration ( $85 \%$ ), Law and Architecture ( $84 \%$ ) or Engineering ( $83 \%$ ). The lowest proportion of those employed was reported in the field of Social Science studies which was still a relatively high 75 per cent.

Persons with trade or apprenticeship qualifications in the Automotive and Mechanical field reported an employment level of 83 per cent. Similarly, high employment levels were recorded in the other trades fields with the exception of Service with the estimate of 58 per cent and Footwear, Clothing and Textiles with 36 per cent.

Employment for persons with a certificate or diploma was on average lower than for persons with a degree or a trade qualification. Those fields of study with high ratios of employed were Science with 82 per cent and Secretarial with 59 per cent.

## Unemployment

Persons without post-school qualifications were twice as likely to be unemployed as were persons with a post-school qualification. Their unemployment rates in February 1989 were 9.1 per cent and 4.5 per cent respectively.

Despite having one of the lowest unemployment rates at 3.6 per cent, unemployed tradespersons spent the longest period looking for work, an estimated 64.3 weeks. Another group which spent on average more than a year looking for work were persons who had not attended the highest level of secondary schooling available ( 59.1 weeks).

Persons with a degree and those without post-school qualifications but who had attended the highest level of secondary school available averaged less than six months unemployed (at 23.4 weeks and 22.5 weeks respectively).

While males generally had a lower unemployment rate ( $6.7 \%$ ) than females ( $8.1 \%$ ) the difference in rates was particularly evident among persons with post-school qualifications where the unemployment rate was 3.5 per cent for males and 6.1 per cent for females. Amongst those without post-school qualifications males recorded an unemployment rate of 9.2 per cent and females 9.1 per cent.

## Persons not in the labour force

In February 1989 there were $4,514,300$ persons not in the labour force. Of this group, 1,149,500 (25\%) had postschool qualifications while the remaining $2,978,600$ did not.

Of the $3,058,100$ females not in the labour force, 23 per cent $(700,700)$ had post-school qualifications, 71 per cent $(2,175,500)$ were without post-school qualifications and 6 per cent $(182,000)$ were still at school. Of the $1,456,100$ males in this group 31 per cent $(448,800)$ reported having a post-school qualification, 55 per cent $(803,100)$ were without post-school qualifications and 14 per cent were still at school. Some 67 per cent $(1,469,600)$ of females not in the labour force and without post-school qualifications reported leaving school at age 15 or under.

## Age

It is difficult to make comparisons between all age groups in regard to the level of post-school qualifications since large numbers of persons in the 15-19 and 20-24 age groups are in the process of obtaining their post-school qualification or are still at school. However, there is a trend towards more post-school education evident, with approximately 50 per cent of persons in the 25-34 and 35-44 age groups ataining post-school qualifications compared to 45 per cent of 45-54 year olds and 31 per cent of persons aged 55 or more. This trend is more evident amongst females with only 22 per cent of women over the age of 55 reporting a post-school qualification in comparison to 35 per cent of 45-54 year olds, 42 per cent of $35-44$ year olds and 46 per cent of $25-34$ year olds.

## Family Status

Of the estimated $7,521,900$ married persons at February 1989, 4,181,200 (56\%) did not have a post-school qualification. Some $2,043,300(27 \%)$ had left school early at age 14 or 15 years and a further $999,300(13 \%)$ left at age 16 or more having not attended the highest level of school available.

There were $3,895,600$ married persons who were responsible for dependents and $1,918,900$ ( $49 \%$ ) of these had post-school qualifications. There were $3,626,300$ married persons with no dependents of whom $1,421,700$ ( $39 \%$ ) had post-school qualifications.

Not married heads of families numbered 583,200 persons, 32 per cent of whom had post-school qualifications. Some 64 per cent of those qualifications were certificates or diplomas.

## Industry

In February 1989, there were 774,100 employed persons with a degree qualification. The Community Services industry employed some 43 per cent of these persons followed by Finance, Property and Business Services with 18 per cent.

The Manufacturing industry employed 25 per cent of the $1,250,300$ persons with trade qualifications, followed by the Construction and Wholesale and Retail Trade industries each with 20 per cent of the total.

Some 33 per cent of all employed persons with a certificate or diploma ( $1,496,500$ ) were employed in the Community Services industry.

Overall, the Community Services industry ( $1,291,800$ persons) had the highest ratio of employees with a post-school qualification at 70 per cent, and the lowest was Agriculture, Forestry, Fishing and Hunting ( 422,600 persons) with 29 per cent.

## Occupation

Of the 774,100 persons with a degree, 66 per cent were classified as Professionals. Of the $1,250,300$ persons with a trade qualification, 53 per cent were classified as Tradespersons. Of persons with a certificate or diploma, there was a spread across all occupations from the 26 per cent who were Clerks to the 4 per cent Plant and Machine Operators and Drivers.

The occupation group with the highest ratio of persons with a post-school qualification was Professionals where 89 per cent of the total $(907,100)$ had attained a post-school qualification; of those, 513,800 had degrees.

## APPENDIX A

## GLOSSARY

Average duration of unemployment: obtained by dividing the aggregate number of weeks a group has been unemployed by the number of persons in that group.

Certificate or diploma: completion of an approved certificate or diploma in secretarial or business studies, administration, teaching, nursing, etc.

Degree: a bachelor degree (including honours), a graduate or post-graduate diploma, masters degree or a doctorate.

Educational attainment: measures the highest qualification obtained by the respondent. Qualifications may include those obtained at other than educational institutions (e.g. nursing qualifications obtained at a hospital).

Highest level of secondary school available: the highest level of secondary schooling (or equivalent) offered by the education system at the time the respondent left school.

Main field of study: respondents with a degree; trade qualification or apprenticeship; or a certificate or diploma (as defined) indicated the main field of study for their highest qualification.

Median duration of unemployment: The duration which divides unemployed persons into two equal groups, one comprising persons whose duration of unemployment is above the median and the other, persons whose duration is below it.

Other post-school qualifications: completion of other types of education, e.g. adult education, preparatory/bridging course or hobby course.

Post-school qualifications: qualifications held by those persons who had left school and answered 'Yes' to the question: 'Since leaving school have you obtained a trade qualification, certificate, diploma, degree or any other qualification?'. Respondents indicated which of the following groups best described their highest qualification: Degree; Trade qualification or apprenticeship; Certificate or diploma; Other post-school qualification.

Still at school: current school attendance was recorded only for persons aged fifteen to twenty years.

Trade qualification or apprenticeship: completion of an approved trade/technical apprenticeship in fitting and turning, hairdressing, plumbing, carpentry, etc.

Unemployment/population ratio: the number of unemployed persons, for any group, expressed as a percentage of all persons in the same group.

Note: Definitions of labour force and demographic classifications appearing in this publication are given in The Labour Force, Australia (6203.0).

## APPENDIX B

## EXPLANATORY NOTES

## Introduction

The monthly population survey (which is described in The Labour Force, Australia (6203.0)) comprises the monthly labour force survey and supplementary topics. This publication contains some results of a supplementary survey run in association with the February 1989 labour force survey conducted throughout Australia.
2. Of the respondents to the labour force survey, those who fell within the scope of the supplementary survey were asked additional questions. They were asked about their highest educational qualifications. For persons with post-school qualifications, the information sought included field of study, and for those without post-school qualifications, it included whether they completed the highest level of secondary schooling available, and if not, at what age they left school.

## Scope

3. The scope of this supplementary survey includes all persons aged 15 and over except:
(a) members of the permanent defence forces;
(b) certain diplomatic personnel of overseas governments, customarily excluded from census and estimated populations;
(c) overseas residents in Australia;
(d) members of non-Australian defence forces (and their dependents) stationed in Australia;
(e) visitors to private dwellings;
(f) some patients in hospitals and sanitoriums; and
(g) inmates of reformatories, gaols etc.
4. In the tables, "All Persons" refers to all persons within the scope of the survey.

## Coverage

5. In the population survey, coverage rules are applied which aim to ensure that each person is associated with only one dwelling, and hence has only one chance of selection. See The Labour Force, Australia (6203.0) for more details.

## Definitions

6. Definitions of labour force and demographic classifications appearing in this publication are given in The Labour Force, Australia (6203.0).
7. Unless otherwise stated, all characteristics referenced in this publication relate to the week before the interview.

## Results of the survey

8. Due to differences in the scope and method of estimation used in this supplementary survey and that used in the labour force survey, there are some small variations between estimates in this publication and those in the corresponding issue of The Labour Force, Australia (6203.0).
9. The estimates in this publication refer to information collected in the survey month and, due to seasonal factors, may not be representative of other months of the year.
10. A publication Labour Force Status and Educational Attainment, Australia, February 1989, Summary (6240.0) containing a summary of the results of the survey was released on 24 July 1989
11. Results of similar surveys, conducted annually since February 1979, have been given in previous issues of this publication
12. It is proposed that this survey will be conducted next in February 1990

## Unpublished tables

13. In some cases, the ABS can also make available information which is not published. ## Discontinuities in the series

14. Since February 1987 an expanded classification of post-school qualifications has been used. As a result a small number of persons previosly categorised as "Degree" or "Other" may now be included in the categories "Trade qualifications or apprenticeship" or "Certificate or diploma".
15. Estimates for the years 1986 to 1988 have been revised in line with a change in the method of weighting. Visitors to private dwellings and institutionalised persons have been excluded from the base population benchmarks.

## Survey sample redesign

16. The Labour Force Survey (LFS) sample has been redesigned and reselected using information collected in the 1986 Population Census. As a result, the standard errors used in this supplementary survey differ from those used in surveys of the same topic run prior to September 1987. For details, see Information Paper- Labour Force Survey-Sample Design (6269.0).

## Sample size

17. In previous years this supplementary survey has been conducted on 75 per cent of the dwellings selected in the Labour Force Survey. From February 1939 this has been expanded to the full sample size. As a result the standard errors for this survey differ from those applicable to previous surveys.

## Estimation procedure

18. The estimates are derived from the population survey by use of a ratio estimation procedure which ensures that the estimates conform to an independently estimated distribution of the population for each capital city and remainder of state by age, gender and labour force status, rather than to the corresponding distribution within the sample itself.

## Reliability of the estimates

19. Estimates in this publication are subject to sampling and non-sampling error. For more information refer to the Technical Note, Appendix C.

## APPENDIX C

## TECHNICAL NOTE

## Estimation procedure

Since the estimates in this publication are based on information obtained from occupants of a sample of dwellings, they are subject to sampling variability, that is, they may differ from those that would have been produced if all dwellings had been included in the survey. One measure of the likely differnece is given by the standard error, which indicates the extent to which an estimate might have varied by chance because only a sample of dwellings was included. There are about two changes in three that a sample estimate will differ by less than one standard error from the number that would have been obtained if all dwellings had been included, and about nineteen chances in twenty that the difference will be less than two standard errors. Another measure of the likely difference is the relative standard error, which is obtained by expressing the standard error as a percentage of the estimates.
2. Space does not allow for the separate indication of the standard errors of all estimates in this publication. A table of standard errors for general application is given on the following page. Since they are averages based on calculations for a limited number of past surveys over a wide range of labour force characteristics these numbers will not give a precise measure of the standard error of a particular estimate but they will provide an indication of its magnitude.
3. An example of the calculation and the use of standard errors in relation to estimates of persons is as follows. Table 5 shows the estimated number of persons with a Degree qualification in February 1989 is 957,600 . Since this estimate is between 500,000 and $1,000,000$ in the standard error table, the standard error for Australia will be between 8,400 and 11,100 and can be approximated by interpolation as 10,900 (rounded to the nearest 100 ). Therefore, there are about two chances in three that the value that would have been produced if all dwellings had been included in the survey will fall in the range 946,700 to 968,500 and about nineteen changes in twenty that the value will fall within the range 935,800 to 979,400 . This example is illustrated in the following diagram.
4. As can be seen from the standard error table, the smaller the estimate the higher is the relative standard error. Very small estimates are thus subject to such high standard error (relative to the size of the estimate) as to detract seriously from their value for most reasonable uses. In the tables in this publication only estimates with relative standard errors of 25 per cent or less and percentages based on such estimates are considered sufficiently reliable for most purposes. However, estimates and percentages with larger relative standard errors have been included and are preceded by an asterisk (e.g. *3.4) to indicate they are subject to high standard errors and should be used with caution.

5. Proportions and percentages formed from the ratio of two estimates are also subject to sampling errors. The size of the error depends on the accuracy of both the numerator and the denominator. A formula to approximate the relative standard error (RSE) of a proportion is given below:

$$
\operatorname{RSE}(\mathrm{x} / \mathrm{y})=\sqrt{[\operatorname{RSE}(\mathrm{x})] 2-[\operatorname{RSE}(\mathrm{y})] 2}
$$

6. Considering the example from paragraph 3 above, of the 957,600 persons with a Degree qualification in February 1989, 806,400 or 84.2 per cent participated in the labour force. The standard error of 806,400 is approximately 10,100 so the relative standard error is 1.3 per cent. The relative standard error for 957,600 is 1.1 per cent. Applying the above formula, the relative standard error of the proportion is $\sqrt{(1.3)^{2}-(1.1)^{2}}$ or 0.7 per cent, giving a standard error for the proportion ( 84.2 per cent) of 0.6 percentage points. Therefore, there are about two chances in three that the participation rate of persons with a Degree qualification in February 1989 is between 83.6 per cent and 84.8 per cent and nineteen chances in twenty the proportion is within the range 83.0 per cent to 85.4 per cent.
7. Published estimates may also be used to calculate the difference between two survey estimates (of numbers or percentages). Such an estimate is subject to sampling error. The sampling error of the difference between two estimates depends on their standard errors and the relationship (correlation) between them. An approximate standard error (SE) of the difference between two estimates ( $x-y$ ) may be calculated by the following formula:

$$
S E(x-y)=\sqrt{[S E(x)] 2+[S E(y)] 2}
$$

8. While this formula will only be exact for differences between separate and uncorrelated characteristics of sub-
populations it is expected to provide a good approximation for all differences likly to be of interest in this publication.
9. The imprecision due to sampling variability, which is measured by the standard error, should not be confused with inaccuracies that may occur because of imperfections in reporting by interviewers and respondents, and errors
made in coding and processing data. Inaccuracies of this kind are referred to as the non-sampling error, and they may occur in any enumeration, whether it be a full count or a sample. Every effort is made to reduce the non-sampling error to a minimum by careful design of questionnaires, intensive training and supervision of interviewers and efficient operating procedures.
