#### MAIN PRICE CHANGES BETWEEN SEPTEMBER QUARTER 1977 AND DECEMBER QUARTER 1977

#### Food:

- Main increases were for fresh fruit; milk; meals out, take-away food; soft drinks, ice cream and confectionery.
- During the quarter milk prices increased in Sydney and Perth and bread prices increased in Brisbane, Perth. Hobart and Canberra.

#### Clothing:

Main increases were for summer seasonal clothing items.

#### Housing:

- Local government rates and charges increased in all
- Government dwelling rents increased in several cities. Private dwelling rents increased in all cities.
- House prices increased in all cities except Canberra.

#### Household Equipment and Operation:

- Electricity charges increased in Adelaide, Perth and
- Fuel oil prices increased in all cities.
- Furniture prices increased in all cities.

#### Transportation:

- Increased petrol prices, in all cities, were responsible for more than half the increase in this group.
- Motor vehicle servicing costs and motor vehicle prices increased in all cities.
- Motor vehicle registration and driver's licence charges increased in Perth and Canberra.

#### Tobacco and Alcohol:

Beer prices increased in all cities.

#### Recreation:

Higher prices for books, newspapers and magazines and higher charges for holiday accommodation were responsible for most of the increase in this group.

#### **EXPLANATORY NOTES**

#### Brief description of the CPI

The Consumer Price Index (CPI) measures quarterly changes in the price of a 'basket' of goods and services which account for a high proportion of expenditures by metropolitan wage and salary earner households. This 'basket' covers a wide range of goods and services, arranged in the following groups: Food; Clothing; Housing; Household equipment and operation; Transportation; Tobacco and alcohol; Health and personal care; and Recreation. Each group is in turn divided into sub-groups. Index numbers at the group and All Groups levels are published for each State capital city and Canberra, for the weighted average of six State capital cities and for the weighted average of seven capital cities. This bulletin also contains sub-group index numbers for the weighted average of six State capital cities.

- 2. It is important to note that the capital city indexes measure price movements over time in each city individually. They do not measure differences in retail price levels between cities.
- 3. Further information about the current series of the CPI is contained in the Appendix to the December quarter 1976 issue of this bulletin. In addition, a document entitled List of Expenditure Classes and their Percentage Contributions to the Index Aggregate (Ninth Series) is available from the ABS on request. An up-to-date detailed description of the CPI will be published shortly. Labour Report No. 58, 1973 (Ref. No. 6.7) contains information about earlier series of the CPI.

#### **Prices**

- 4. Prices of non-food items are collected quarterly, usually as at the middle of the mid-month of the quarter. However, to facilitate field collection arrangements, some items (furniture, appliances, television sets, radios, sound equipment, motor vehicle operation, clothing and footwear services and hairdressing) are priced during the first month of each quarter. Items such as local government rates and seasonal clothing are priced annually.
- 5. The quarterly prices for food items used in the index are the averages of prices collected as at the middle of each of the three months of the quarter. In the case of some fresh food items (fruit, vegetables and fish) prices are collected more frequently and averaged to obtain monthly prices.

#### Weighting pattern

6. There are 105 expenditure classes (that is groupings of like items) within the current CPI and each expenditure class has its own weight, or measure of relative importance. In calculating the index, price changes for the various expenditure classes are combined using these weights.

7. Changes in the weighting pattern have been made at approximately five-yearly intervals to take account of changes in household spending patterns. The CPI in fact comprises nine series of price indexes which have been linked to form a continuous series. The ninth series (that is, the current series) was introduced as from September quarter 1976 and its weighting pattern is based on estimated expenditures in 1974-75, obtained from the first household expenditure survey conducted by the ABS.

#### Index points and percentage changes

8. Movements in indexes from one period to another can be expressed either as percentage changes, or as changes in 'index points'. The difference between these two methods of describing movements in indexes is shown by the following example:

All Groups CPI: Weighted average of six State capital cities

December quarter 1977: 239.6 less September quarter 1977: 234.1 Change in index points: 5.5

Percentage change = 
$$\frac{5.5}{234.1}$$
 x 100 = 2.3%

The index number of 239.6 for December quarter 1977 indicates an increase of 139.6% since the reference base year (1966-67).

9. Most of the tables in this bulletin show index numbers or percentage changes calculated from index numbers. Table 3, on the other hand, shows the main changes between September quarter 1977 and December quarter 1977, in terms of 'All Groups' index points, for each capital city.

#### Special tables

- 10. Table 7 provides a detailed analysis, for the weighted average of six State capital cities, of movements in the CPI since the previous quarter, including information on movements for sub-groups and for some special groupings. It also shows the contribution which each group and sub-group makes to the total index. For instance, the dairy produce sub-group contributed 5.07 index points to the total All Groups index number of 239.6 for December quarter 1977. The final column shows contributions to the change in All Groups index points by each group and sub-group.
- 11. The All Groups index includes the effects of unusual changes in prices for hospital and medical services, for September and December quarters of 1975 (following the introduction of Medibank) and for December quarter 1976 (following changes to Medibank). To facilitate analysis of trends in retail prices

without the effects of these unusual changes Table 5 shows percentage changes for a special grouping "All Groups excluding hospital and medical services", and compares these with changes in the All Groups index.

#### Monthly Food Group Index

12. The ABS publication Consumer Price Index, Monthly Food Group Index (6402.0) contains monthly index numbers, percentage changes and other data relating to the Food Group of the CPI.
