Scope of publication

This bulletin contains average prices for selected items which are included in the Consumer Price Index. The CPI covers a wide range of goods and services arranged in eight groups, which are in turn divided into sub-groups. The selected items for which average prices are shown in this bulletin fall within the Food Group and the following sub-groups : Household supplies and services; Alcoholic beverages; and Personal care products.

2. Previous issues of this bulletin contained average prices for selected food items. The range of items has now been extended to cover additional food items (that is, some fresh fruit and vegetables and confectionery items) and items within the three sub-groups mentioned above.

3. The items and varieties shown in this bulletin do not comprise *all* of the items and varieties which are incorporated in the Food Group or the specified sub-groups.

Average prices

4. Prices shown in this bulletin are the averages of prices for specified grades, qualities, brands, etc. charged by a number of selected retailers in each city. The specified grades, etc. and the retailers have been selected as representative to measure price change over time. Thus the prices do not purport to be the actual averages

of all retail sales of these items. They should be regarded as approximate indicators of price levels and price changes.

5. Prices for food items are collected as at the middle of each month except in the case of some fresh items (fruit, vegetables and fish) where prices are collected more frequently and averaged to obtain monthly prices. The average prices shown in this bulletin for food items are quarterly averages of the monthly average prices. Prices for non-food items shown in this bulletin are collected as at the middle of the mid-month of each quarter.

6. The prices shown in this bulletin reflect some changes in basis since the last issue of the bulletin.
