EXPLANATORY NOTES

Scope and coverage

These statistics have been derived from the results of the Agricultural Census conducted at 31 March each year from occupiers of establishments with agricultural activity.

2. An establishment with agricultural activity is a single physical location which is used for the production of crops (including fruit and vegetables) and/or for the raising of livestock and the production of livestock products.

3. Establishments which make only a small contribution to overall agricultural production are excluded from the scope of the census. From the 1991-92 Agricultural Census establishments with an estimated value of agricultural operations (EVAO) less than \$22,500 were excluded. In the period 1986-87 to 1990-91, establishments with an EVAO less than \$20,000 were excluded (previously those establishments with an EVAO less than \$2,500 were excluded).

Statistical areas of New South Wales

4. This bulletin contains small area data presented in accordance with the Australian Standard Geographical Classification (ASGC).

(a) *Statistical Local Areas (SLAs)*. These geographic areas are in most cases either identical with, or have been aggregated to, the previously published whole or part legal Local Government Areas (LGAs) as defined under the *(State) Local Government Act 1919* and comprise cities (C), municipalities (M) and shires (S). In other cases, they are identical to each previously published unincorporated area. In aggregate, SLAs cover the whole of the State without gaps or overlaps.

(b) *Statistical Subdivisions (SSDs)*. These consist of one or more SLAs and form the intermediate size spatial unit for the presentation of regional data.

(c) *Statistical Divisions (SDs)*. These consist of one or more Statistical Subdivisions (SSDs). Where SSDs are not shown for statistical purposes, statistical local areas are shown ordered alphabetically within statistical divisions. The divisions are designed to be relatively homogeneous regions characterised by identifiable social and economic units within the region, under the unifying influence of one or more major towns or cities.
