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# LIVESTOCK PRODUCTS - MEAT, QUEENSLAND, NOVEMBER 1993

## MAIN FEATURES

- During November 1993, 78,482 tonnes of meat were produced. This was slightly more than production in both October 1993 and November 1992. Beef production was 87 per cent of all meat produced in November 1993.
- For the 5 months, July to November 1993, the number of cattle slaughtered decreased by 1 per cent from the number for the corresponding period of the previous year. Beef production also decreased by 1 per cent over the same period.

## **EXPLANATORY NOTES**

The statistics on slaughterings and meat production for Queensland (Tables 1 to 3) are based on a monthly collection from abattoirs and an annual collection from Final figures for slaughterhouses for slaughterhouses. 1992-93 are included in this publication. From July 1992, an estimate of livestock slaughtered on farms is no longer included. Numbers and weights from July 1992 have been revised accordingly. This change in scope means that figures from July 1992 are not directly comparable to figures prior to July 1992. Figures refer only to livestock slaughtered and passed for human consumption and do not include animals condemned or killed for boiling down.

The foreign trade statistics (Tables 4 and 5) have been compiled from information in export entries submitted by exporters or their agents to the Australian Customs Service as required by the Customs Act. Figures have been classified on a State of origin basis and show the export of meat produced in Queensland.
