### LIVESTOCK PRODUCTS - MEAT, QUEENSLAND, DECEMBER 1993

#### MAIN FEATURES

- During December 1993, 52,410 tonnes of meat were produced. This was 33 per cent less than production in November 1993 and 10 per cent less than production in December 1992. Beef production was 80 per cent of all meat produced in December 1993.
- Slaughtering figures this month have been affected by the seasonal shut-down of some abattoirs for the December-January period. Beef production for December 1993 decreased by 14 per cent compared with production for December 1992.

### **EXPLANATORY NOTES**

The statistics on slaughterings and meat production for Queensland (Tables 1 to 3) are based on a monthly collection from abattoirs and an annual collection from slaughterhouses. Final figures for slaughterhouses for 1992–93 are included in this publication. From July 1992, an estimate of livestock slaughtered on farms is no longer included. Numbers and weights from July 1992 have been revised accordingly. This change in scope means that figures from July 1992 are not directly comparable to figures prior to July 1992. Figures refer only to livestock slaughtered and passed for human consumption and do not include animals condemned or killed for boiling down.

2. The foreign trade statistics (Tables 4 and 5) have been compiled from information in export entries submitted by exporters or their agents to the Australian Customs Service as required by the Customs Act. Figures have been classified on a State of origin basis and show the export of meat produced in Queensland.
