MAIN FEATURES

The trend estimate for red meat production rose for the fourth consecutive month. In seasonally adjusted terms production of red meat fell 2.5 per cent compared with January 1994. Red meat production in original terms rose 15.5 per cent in February 1994 compared with January 1994.


The number of live sheep exported in December 1993 rose by 29.9 per cent compared with November 1993 and 2.5 per cent compared with December 1992. The unit value rose 13.4 per cent compared with November 1993, while gross value increased by 45.5 per cent over the same period.

The trend estimate for chicken meat production for February 1994 declined marginally, the second conseceutive monthly fall following a period of continuous increases which commenced in April 1992. In original terms, chicken meat production in February 1994 fell 3.1 per cent compared with January 1994.


The trend estimate for whole milk intake by factories continued the upward trend which commenced in October 1993. In seasonally adjusted terms whole milk intake rose 5.4 per cent in January 1994 compared with December 1993. In original terms, there was a 7.3 per cent decrease in whole milk intake by factories in January 1994 compared with December 1993.

The trend estimate for receivals of taxable wool by brokers and dealers rose in February continuing the upward trend which commenced in October 1993. In seasonally adjusted terms, receivals of taxable wool rose 9.4 per cent in February 1994 compared with January 1994. In original terms, receivals of taxable wool by brokers and dealers for February rose by 29.7 per cent. For the eight months ended February 1994 receivals have fallen 7.5 per cent compared with the corresponding period of 1993.





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

EXPLANATORY NOTES

Introduction

This publication contains information (preliminary where indicated) on livestock slaughterings, meat production, exports of live, fresh, frozen and processed meat and stocks of frozen meat, whole milk intake by factories, market milk sales by factories and receivals of taxable wool by wool brokers and dealers.

2. Commencing with the June 1992 issue of this publication, the timing basis for compilation of merchandise exports statistics has changed. The change involves compiling export statistics on the basis of goods shipped in any month rather than on the basis of the documentation of goods shipped in that or earlier months, From the June 1992 issue the data from July 1990 has been revised to the new basis.

Livestock slaughterings and meat production

- 3. The statistics on slaughterings and meat production are based on a monthly collection from abattoirs and other major slaughtering establishments and include estimates of animals slaughtered on farms and by country butchers and other small slaughtering establishments.
- 4. Care should be taken when using this information as the figures only relate to slaughterings for human-consumption and do not include animals condemned or those killed for boiling down. Also, definition of livestock categories may differ between States and within States, particularly with regard to calves.
- 5. Poultry slaughterings statistics have been compiled from returns supplied by commercial poultry slaughtering establishments. Producers in the Northern Territory and the Australian Capital Territory and the many very small producers are excluded from the collection; however, the statistics represent a high level of coverage. The Queensland statistics are based on data collected by the Queensland Department of Primary Industries.

Live sheep exports

6. This table contains statistics of the number of live sheep exported, the gross weight, gross value and unit value. It does not include sheep exported for breeding.

Milk

7. Tables 8 and 9 contain statistics collected by the Australian Dairy Corporation (ADC) on whole milk intake and market milk sales by factories.

Wool receivals

- 8. The statistics in Table 10 show the amount of taxable wool received by brokers and dealers from wool producers. It excludes wool received by brokers on which tax has already been paid by other dealers (private buyers) or brokers.
- 9. The information shown is on the basis of the State in which wool has actually been received and does not necessarily reflect the production of wool in that State.

Seasonal adjustment

10. Details of seasonally adjusted figures for meat, milk and wool are shown in Tables 2, 8 and 10 respectively. Information on the methods used in seasonally adjusting these series is available on request.

Trend Estimates

11. A trend estimate is obtained by reducing the irregular component from the seasonally adjusted series. It is calculated for estimates in this publication by applying a 13 term Henderson moving average to the seasonally adjusted series. More detailed information is available in the ABS Information Papers A Guide to Smoothing Time Series — Estimates of Trend (1316.0), and Time Series Decomposition —) An Overview (1317.0). This technique enables trend estimates to be produced for the latest month. Trend estimates for the most recent months are revised as data for subsequent months become available.
