## MARCH QTR KEY POINTS

### INCREASES IN CAPACITY AVAILABLE

- Available capacity in March quarter 1996 compared with March quarter 1995 increased slightly for caravan parks and substantially for other establishment types.


### DEMAND UP EXCEPT FOR CARAVAN PARKS

- For holiday flats, units and houses and for visitor hostels, demand increases in March quarter 1996 compared with March quarter 1995 exceeded supply increases resulting in occupancy rate rises of 1.2 and 1.4 percentage points, respectively.
- Increased accommodation demand in hotels, motels and guest houses was exceeded by the increase in available capacity, resulting in a fall of 0.7 percentage points in the room occupancy rate. Although lower than the March quarter results for the previous 2 years, the occupancy rate was still high historically.
- For caravan parks, demand decreased while capacity available increased slightly, resulting in a fall of 1.6 percentage points in the site occupancy rate.


### ACCOMMODATION TAKINGS RISE

- Average takings increased from \$93 to \$100 per room night occupied for hotels, motels and guest houses and from \$68 to \$69 per holiday unit night occupied. For visitor hostels, average takings per guest night rose from \$12 to \$13, while average takings per caravan park site night were steady at \$11.

## CHANGES IN THIS ISSUE

As applicable from 1 July 1995, Edition 2.5 of the Australian Standard Geographic Classification (ASGC) reflected a number of important changes made to Local Government Areas (LGAs) and Statistical Local Areas (SLAs) in Queensland. In particular, Albert Shire has ceased to exist and has been largely absorbed into the new Gold Coast City, while Mulgrave Shire has been completely absorbed into the new Cairns City. There have also been a number of other changes which have had a lesser impact on the geographic classification of accommodation establishments. Further information is available from the *Australian Standard Geographic Classification, Edition 2.5* (1216.0). Maps and an explanatory key showing the new Statistical Divisions (SDs) and Statistical Local Areas (SLAs) are printed on pages 37 - 43.

In conjunction with the introduction of Edition 2.5 of the ASGC in Queensland and as a result of a review of geographic coding, five hotels, motels and guest houses, seven letting entities of holiday flats and units and houses and eight caravan parks on Bribie Island in Caboolture Shire have been recoded from the Moreton Statistical Division to the Brisbane Statistical Division.

Quarterly data rather than monthly data are now plotted in the diagrams on the front cover page.

## INTRODUCTION

**1** This publication contains data for Queensland from a quarterly survey of tourist accommodation establishments.

## SCOPE

**2** Tourist accommodation establishments currently included in the survey comprise two groups:

- Establishments which provide predominantly short-term accommodation (i.e. for periods of less than 2 months) to the general public. These include:
  - *Hotels, motels and guest houses, with facilities* being hotels licensed to operate a public bar and motels, private hotels and guest houses all of which provide a bath (or shower) and toilet in most guest rooms and have breakfast available for guests. NOTE: From December quarter 1993, hotel, motel and guest house establishments with fewer than five rooms have been formally excluded from the scope of this statistical collection.
  - *Holiday flats, units and houses* (excluding establishments predominantly operated on a time share basis) which are operated by owners, managers or real estate agents who have sole letting rights to at least five flats, units or houses for short-term letting. They are mainly self-contained in terms of cooking, bath (or shower) and toilet facilities and do not have breakfast available for guests. Data for holiday flats, units and houses include short-term owner occupation as well as paying guest occupation.
  - *Visitor hostels* which provide accommodation to visitors on a bed basis (rather than by the room). This category does not include establishments providing charity type accommodation (e.g. Salvation Army hostels) nor hotels, motels and guest houses without in-room facilities which provide accommodation on a per room basis.
  - *Caravan parks* which provide either predominantly short-term (i.e. for periods of less than 2 months) or predominantly long-term (i.e. for periods of 2 months or more) accommodation to the general public and which provide powered sites for caravans and toilet, shower and laundry facilities for guests.

**3** Data collected and published for each type of establishment (other than holiday flats, units and houses) include both long-term and short-term guests at these establishments.

**4** Establishments which provide more than one type of accommodation (e.g. a motel with attached caravan park) are treated as two or more separate establishments. However, self-contained units, flats, cabins, etc. attached to hotels, motels or to caravan parks are included in the capacity for those establishments and not treated as separate holiday flat, unit or house establishments.

## AUSTRALIAN STANDARD GEOGRAPHICAL CLASSIFICATION

**5** Statistics presented in this publication have been classified according to the Australian Standard Geographic Classification (ASGC), Edition 2.5. This classification incorporates a number of hierarchic structures of geographic areas. The appropriate spatial units of the main structure of the ASGC used in this publication are defined as follows.

STATISTICAL LOCAL AREAS (SLAs) are the smallest types of spatial units in the ASGC for which tourist accommodation data are presented. They correspond either to legal Local Government Areas (LGAs) as defined under the Local Government Act 1936 or to suburbs in certain urban LGAs. Some LGAs are split into two or more parts, with each part forming a separate SLA. In all instances, LGA data can be derived by aggregating SLAs. The unincorporated area of Queensland also forms a SLA. In aggregate, SLAs cover the whole of the State without gaps or overlaps.

STATISTICAL SUBDIVISIONS (SSDs) consist of one or more SLAs and form the intermediate size spatial unit for the presentation of regional data.

STATISTICAL DIVISIONS (SDs) which consist of one or more SSDs are designed to be relatively homogeneous regions characterised by identifiable social and economic units within the region, under the unifying influence of one or more major towns or cities. The Brisbane Statistical Division comprises the Cities of Brisbane, Logan and Redcliffe and parts of the cities of Gold Coast and Ipswich, the Shires of Pine Rivers and Redland and parts of the Shires of Beaudesert and Caboolture.

STATISTICAL DISTRICTS have been defined around selected urban areas to provide comparable statistics over a period of time. These districts, which are intended to contain the anticipated urban spread for at least 20 years, are generally defined as having a population of 25,000 or more and experiencing urban growth beyond the LGA boundaries.

NOTE: As applicable from 1 July 1995, Edition 2.5 of the Australian Standard Geographic Classification (ASGC) reflected a number of important changes made to Local Government Areas (LGAs) and Statistical Local Areas (SLAs) in Queensland. In particular, Albert Shire has ceased to exist and has been largely absorbed into the new Gold Coast City, while Mulgrave Shire has been completely absorbed into the new Cairns City. There have also been a number of other changes which have had a lesser impact on the geographic classification of accommodation establishments. Further information is available from the *Australian Standard Geographic Classification, Edition 2.5* (1216.0). Maps and an explanatory key showing the new Statistical Divisions (SDs) and Statistical Local Areas (SLAs) are printed on pages 37 - 42.

# GLOSSARY

**Average length of stay** Average length of stay is expressed in numbers of days and calculated:

- for hotels, motels and guest houses, by dividing *Guest nights* by *Guest arrivals* and
- for holiday flats, units and houses, by dividing *Unit nights occupied* by *Unit lettings*.

**Bed spaces** Three-quarter beds are counted as one bed space; double beds as two bed spaces. Cots are excluded.

**Capacity** Capacity in terms of *Guest rooms*, *Bed spaces*, *Holiday units* or *Caravan park sites*, etc. is the maximum number available to accommodate paying guests during the survey period. Capacity closed temporarily for seasonal reasons is included.

**Caravan park capacity** The total number of *On-site vans*, *Other powered sites*, *Unpowered sites* and *Cabins*, etc.

**Employment** The number of persons working at accommodation establishments at the end of the survey period (including working proprietors and those working on other than accommodation activities).

**Establishments** For hotels, motels and guest houses, caravan parks and visitor hostels, the number of establishments within the scope of the survey which operated for any part of the survey period, or which closed temporarily for the quarter for seasonal reasons.

**Guest arrivals** The total number of paying guests counted only on the first night they stayed at the accommodation establishment.

**Letting entitles** For holiday flats, units and houses, the number of owners, managers or real estate agents within the scope of the survey who operated for any part of the survey period.

**Occupancy** Occupancy in terms of *Room nights*, *Unit nights* or *Site nights occupied* refers to the total number of nights each guest room, holiday unit or caravan park site, etc. was occupied during the survey period. NOTE: From September quarter 1992, caravan park sites, etc. permanently reserved for 2 months or more at the end of the survey period but only casually occupied by their tenants have been recorded continuously as *Site nights occupied* irrespective of whether the tenants of individual sites were in residence on any particular night.

Occupancy in terms of *Guest nights* refers to the total number of nights each paying guest stayed during the survey period.

**Occupancy rates** *Occupancy rates* represent occupancy expressed as a percentage of total capacity available during the survey period, e.g.

$$\text{Room occupancy rate (\%)} \text{ for the period} = \frac{\text{Room nights occupied}}{(\text{Guest rooms}) \times (\text{No. of days in the period})} \times 100$$

providing that, for establishments closing (other than for seasonal reasons) or opening during the survey period, the denominator of the above expression includes only operating periods.

## GLOSSARY

\*\*\*\*\*

- Other sites permanently reserved** The total number of powered and unpowered sites, on-site vans and cabins, etc. continuously let for 2 months or more by the end of the survey period to tenants who occupy the sites only on a casual or sporadic basis. Separate data for this item are available only from September quarter 1992.
- Room nights available** The number of guest rooms available multiplied by the number of days for which they were available during the survey period. Including operating periods only for establishments closing (other than for seasonal reasons) or opening during the survey period.
- Sites occupied by long-term guests** The total number of sites, etc. occupied at the end of the survey period by guests who have stayed continuously for 2 months or more.
- Star grading** The grading of hotels and motels with facilities based on the classification system used by members of the Australian Automobile Association (AAA). The gradings are allocated according to a points system based on the amenities and facilities available to guests. Details of the grading scheme are contained in the RACV-RAASA members' publication *Accommodation Australia*, or the individual tour guides produced by members of the AAA. For the purpose of classifying establishments to a star grading in this publication, 'half' star gradings are ignored (e.g. a two and a half star grading has been shown as two star).
- Takings from accommodation** Revenue received from the provision of accommodation. Takings from meals are excluded. Takings from accommodation for each month generally represent the takings received during that month. Where payments are received in advance of, or after, the provision of accommodation to guests, the monthly figure for takings from accommodation may not necessarily bear a direct relationship to the number of guests accommodated during the month. Rental and storage fees paid to caravan parks for the keeping of private vans in parks are included in the takings of the month they are received.
- Unit lettings** The total number of times a holiday flat, unit or house was occupied by a new tenant, counted only on the first night it was occupied by the new tenant.






