DWELLING UNIT COMMENCEMENTS REPORTED BY APPROVING AUTHORITIES, SOUTH AUSTRALIA, JANUARY 1995

MAIN FEATURES

- The number of new dwelling units recorded as commenced during January 1995 was 796. There were 599 commencements recorded in the Adelaide Statistical Division (ASD) and 197 in the remainder of the State.
- The areas recording most commencements in the ASD were Tea Tree Gully (143), Salisbury (79), Burnside (64), Munno Para (43) and Enfield (38).
- Outside the ASD, Mount Gambier with 19, reported most commencements for January, followed by Mount Barker (18), Victor Harbor (13) and Port Elliot and Goolwa (12).

Note: The ability of the ABS to record dwelling commencements in the month in which they occur has been affected by changes to inspection policies by some local government authorities following implementation of the Development Act early in 1994. Attention is drawn to the number of commencements recorded for some Statistical Local Areas (SLAs) where data have been influenced by procedures adopted by the ABS of inspecting the construction site of approved jobs for those authorities who have changed their administrative methods. This process has led to the discovery of a number of dwelling unit commencements which had not and would not have been reported to the ABS in the normal course of events. Data for private houses in Tea Tree Gully and Mount Barker have been revised for the months of October, November and December and it is believed that data for January include some commencements which occurred in previous months. Where delays are most apparent in recording the commencement of approved dwellings ABS will endeavour to monitor the relevant SLAs.

EXPLANATORY NOTES

Introduction

This publication contains monthly details of the number of new dwelling units reported by approving authorities as having commenced. Data for selected statistical local areas are included. From January 1991 the data were compiled using an 'as reported' method. Previously, data were revised for up to four months as councils notified the ABS of commencements occurring before the reference month.

Scope and coverage

- 2. The statistics were compiled from monthly reports, provided by local and other government authorities, of commencements of new houses and new other residential buildings for which:
 - (a) building permits were issued by local government or other government authorities in areas subject to building control by those authorities; and
 - (b) contracts were let or day labour work was authorised by Commonwealth, State, semi-government and local government authorities.

Major dwelling unit commencements in areas not subject to the normal administrative approval processes (e.g. buildings on remote mine sites) are also included.

3. The number of dwelling units created by alterations and additions to existing buildings and through the construction of new non-residential buildings is not included.

Definitions

- 4. A dwelling unit is defined as a self-contained suite of rooms, including cooking and bathing facilities and intended for long term residential use. Units (whether self-contained or not) within buildings offering institutional care, such as hospitals, or temporary accommodation e.g. motels, hostels and holiday apartments, are not defined as dwelling units.
- 5. A residential building is defined as a building predominantly consisting of one or more dwelling units. Residential buildings can be either houses or other residential buildings as follows:
 - (a) A house is defined as a detached building predominantly used for long term residential purposes and consisting of only one dwelling unit. Thus, detached 'granny flats' and detached dwelling units (such as caretakers' residences) associated with non-residential buildings are defined as houses for the purpose of these statistics.
 - (b) An other residential building is defined as a building which is predominantly used for long term residential purposes and which contains (or has attached to it) more than one dwelling unit (e.g. includes townhouses, duplexes, apartment buildings etc.).

- Commencements. For the purposes of this statistical series, a dwelling unit is regarded as being commenced on the date when:
 - (a) the residential building is first inspected by a building inspector or surveyor, whether the work is passed or not. In general, the first inspection is undertaken at the foundations or footings stage of construction; or
 - (b) the residential building is determined as commenced by a building inspector or surveyor.
- 7. Ownership of a building is classified as either Public Sector or Private Sector according to the sector of the intended owner of the completed building as evident at the time of approval, Residential buildings being constructed by private sector builders under government housing authority schemes whereby the authority has contracted, or intends to contract, to purchase the buildings on or before completion, are classified as public sector.

Australian Standard Geographical Classification (ASGC)

8. Area statistics are now being classified to the Australian Standard Geographical Classification, Edition 2.4 (1216.0) and ASGC terminology has been adopted in the presentation of building statistics.

Comparability of statistics

9. Because of the difference in data sources, collection methodologies and timing of notification of commencements, care should be exercised in comparing quarterly data derived from monthly dwelling unit commencement statistics with the quarterly dwelling unit commencement statistics from the Building Activity Survey.

Unpublished data

10. The ABS can also make available certain dwelling unit commencement data which are not published. Where it is not practicable to provide the required information by telephone, data can be provided in the following forms: microfiche, photocopy, computer printout and clerically extracted tabulation. A charge may be made for providing unpublished information in these forms.
