


2006 NORTHERN TERRITORY AT A GLANCE



The Northern Territory (NT) comprises a land area of 1,346,200 km². It is the third largest of the States and Territories after Western Australia and Queensland, yet has the smallest population and population density.

Darwin City has an estimated population of 70,055. It is the commercial and administrative centre of the Territory. Alice Springs is the largest regional population centre outside Darwin and is the base for significant tourism activities in the Central Region. Mining, tourism and defence are major contributors to the NT economy.

In February 2006, the first shipment of LNG from the new Wickham Point facility was exported to Japan. This event marks the beginning of a new phase in economic development for the Northern Territory.
