#### DATA NOTES

ABS statistical series are being impacted to varying degrees as a result of The New Tax System (TNTS), introduced in Australia from 1 July 2000. TNTS included the removal of Wholesale Sales Tax and the introduction of a Goods and Services Tax (GST), and as a result, a wide range of ABS data series will reflect significant immediate and subsequent impacts. #### **GENERAL**

This publication provides information on a wide range of economic indicators which are the latest available at the time of publication. In a number of cases, figures appearing in this summary are preliminary and are subject to revision in subsequent issues.

#### SEASONAL ADJUSTMENT AND TREND ESTIMATION

Seasonal adjustment is a means of removing the estimated effects of normal seasonal variation from a series so that the effects of other variations on that series can be more clearly recognised. This means that movements of seasonally adjusted estimates may not be reliable indicators of trend behaviour. Smoothing seasonally adjusted series produces a measure of the underlying trend by reducing the impact of the irregular component of the series. For an explanation of seasonal adjustment derivation, refer to the publication Seasonally Adjusted Indicators (Cat. no. 1308.0).

#### **NSW OVERVIEW**

**FMPLOYMENT** Employment in NSW in April 2001 was a seasonally adjusted figure of

3,070,100 people. National employment in April 2001 was 9,155,600.

UNEMPLOYMENT Unemployment in NSW was a seasonally adjusted figure of 187,300 in

April 2001. The unemployment rate in NSW was 5.7% while the national

unemployment rate was 6.8%.

INDUSTRIAL DISPUTES In NSW in February 2001 there were 8,600 working days lost due to

> industrial disputes, an increase of 48.3% on the working days lost in the previous month but a decrease of 57.2% from February 2000. Nationally, there were 23,300 working days lost due to industrial disputes in

February 2001.

AVERAGE WEEKLY

**EARNINGS** 

The seasonally adjusted full-time adult ordinary time earnings for NSW in

February 2001 was \$840.90. Nationally, the figure was \$808.70.

**PRODUCTION** Coal production for March 2001 in NSW was 13,317,000 tonnes, an

> increase of 31.3% from the previous month and an increase of 15.0% from the same period last year. Nationally, there were 28,137,000 tonnes of coal

produced.

**BUILDING APPROVALS** The seasonally adjusted number of new dwelling units approved for NSW

> in March 2001 increased from the previous month to 2,745 dwelling units. This was a decrease of 36.3% on the corresponding month of the previous

year. Nationally, there were 9,546 new dwelling units approved.

**RETAIL** In seasonally adjusted terms, total retail sales for NSW in March 2001 were

\$4,591.1 million. Nationally, total retail sales were \$13,307.6 million.

NEW MOTOR VEHICLE

**REGISTRATIONS** 

In April 2001 there were 21,246 new motor vehicle registrations for NSW (seasonally adjusted). Nationally, there were 65,471 new motor vehicle

registrations.

**FINANCE** The seasonally adjusted value of housing finance commitments for owner

> occupation in NSW in March 2001 was \$2,802 million, an increase of 13.7% on the previous month and an increase of 12.4% on March 2000.

**GOVERNMENT FINANCE** 

STATISTICS (GFS)

The underlying General Government operating surplus for NSW for the nine months ended 31 March 2001 was \$926 million. The General

Government Net Lending result for the nine months ended 31 March 2001

was \$1,133 million.

IMPORTS AND EXPORTS The customs value of imports into NSW during April 2001 was

> \$4,116 million, an increase of 16.5% on April 2000. The value of exports (FOB) from NSW in April 2000 was \$1,972 million, an increase of 22.4%

over the same period.

#### MAIN FEATURES

LABOUR FORCE

The April 2001 Labour Force Survey was conducted using a redesigned questionnaire containing additional data items and some minor definitional changes. Although the impact on core labour force series has been minor, revisions have been made to estimates previously published in this publication to ensure continuity. The revised series was released on 3 May 2001. The Information Paper: Implementing the Redesigned Labour Force Survey Questionnaire (Cat. no. 6295.0) contains further information about the questionnaire changes and the revised series. For details on the content of the redesigned questionnaire, see Information Paper: Questionnaires Used in the Labour Force Survey (Cat. no. 6232.0).

In seasonally adjusted terms, the total employment in NSW in April 2001 was an estimated 3,070,100 people. The estimated number of unemployed people in NSW was 187,300. Nationally, the estimated number of employed people was 9,155,600 while the number of unemployed people was 670,800.

The unemployment rate in NSW was 5.7% which was 1.1 percentage points below the national rate of 6.8%. The participation rate for NSW was 62.8% which was 1.1 percentage points lower than the national rate of 63.9%.

IMPORTS AND EXPORTS

In April 2001, the customs value of imports into NSW was \$4,116 million and the value of exports (FOB) from NSW was \$1,972 million. In terms of annual movements, imports into NSW increased by 16.5% compared to April 2000, and exports increased by 22.4% over the same period. At the national level, imports at \$9,581 million increased 19.7% on the corresponding period last year while exports at \$9,740 million increased 23.5% from April 2000.

Commodities exported from NSW in April 2001 included Meat and meat preparations (\$127 million), Cereal and cereal preparations (\$125 million), Wool and other animal hair (\$82 million), Coal, coke and briquettes (\$404 million), Iron and steel (\$14 million), Aluminium (\$136 million) and Office machines and automatic data processing machines (\$31 million). Significant changes from the previous month occurred for Wool and animal hair (down 33.2%), Iron and steel (up 23.9%), Coal, coke and briquettes (up 23.5%), Aluminium (down 18.7%) and Office machines and automatic data processing machines (down 11.5%). Changes from April 2000 were significant for all commodities including Iron and steel (down 85.5%), Meat and meat preparations (up 45.4%), Coal, coke and briquettes (up 41.5%), Wool and other animal hair (up 38.8%) and Cereals and cereal preparations (up 32.9%). Nationally, significant annual movements occurred for Iron and steel (down 55.9%), Coal, coke and briquettes (up 38.9%), Meat and meat preparations (up 34.6%), Aluminium (up 27.5%) and Wool and other animal hair (up 24.4%).




