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INTRODUCTION

STATISTICS PRESENTED IN THIS PUBLICATION

This publication presents a range of education and labour force statistics produced from the 2001 Census of Population and Housing for South Australia (SA). For comparative purposes, it includes 1996 Census data presented on 2001 Census geography.

The tables in this publication provide selected characteristics of the population for Statistical Divisions (SDs), Statistical Subdivisions (SSDs) and Statistical Local Areas (SLAs). The purpose of these tables is to allow a broad comparison of characteristics between geographic areas.

This publication also contains the Basic Community Profile (BCP) for SA. This set of tables is provided to illustrate the wide range of data available from the Census. The BCP consists of 33 tables. This publication contains tables 22 to 33 which focus on education and labour force characteristics. The remainder of the BCP, tables 1 to 21, is published in *Census of Population and Housing: Selected Social and Housing Characteristics for Statistical Local Areas, South Australia* (cat. no. 2015.4).

The statistics in this publication are presented on the basis of where people were counted on Census Night ('as enumerated' counts).

One of the important features of the Census is that it describes the characteristics of Australia's population for small geographic areas and small population groups. While not available in this publication, data at the smallest geographic level (Collection District) are available in a range of census products. For more information on these products, please refer to the Appendix—Census Products and Services. Concepts and definitions used in this publication are explained in the Glossary and more detailed information is available in the *2001 Census Dictionary* (cat. no. 2901.0). The Explanatory Notes in this publication provide a discussion of the scope and coverage of the Census, the different measures of population, and the limitations of census data.

This publication is one of a series of publications which provide data at the SLA level for each state and territory. A similar publication is also available for the whole of Australia, providing data at SSD level. See the Appendix—Census Products and Services for more information.

SUMMARY OF FINDINGS

LABOUR FORCE

In South Australia (SA), the labour force grew from 661,066 to 687,665 persons aged 15 years and over, an increase of 4.0%, compared with 6.6% for Australia.

EMPLOYED

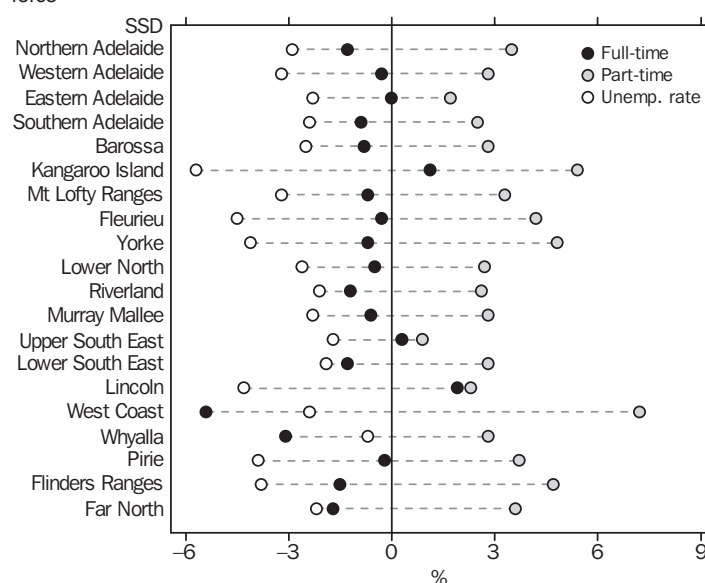
In 2001, there were 635,325 employed persons of which 397,681 were full-time workers and 221,056 were part-time. This represented an increase of 7.2% (42,818 persons) since 1996 which was the second smallest increase of all states and territories, after Tasmania (0.2%).

Full-time/Part-time

In 2001, there was a fall in the proportion of full-time workers who represented 57.8% of the labour force, down from 58.6% in 1996.

In the period 1996 to 2001, the number of persons employed part-time grew from 193,824 in 1996 to 221,056 in 2001, an increase of 14.0%, compared with 17.6% for Australia. These workers represented 32.1% of the labour force in 2001, compared with 29.3% in 1996.

Among the majority of the SA Statistical Subdivisions (SSDs), both the full-time employment rate and the unemployment rate are lower in 2001 than in 1996. The lower unemployment is associated with increased part-time employment.

The only SSDs to experience an increase in the proportion of full-time workers were Lincoln (to 59.8% in 2001 from 58.0% in 1996), Kangaroo Island (to 53.9% from 52.8%) and Upper South East (to 65.9% from 65.6%). However, the proportion of part-time workers increased in every SSD within SA.

Full-time/Part-time continued

The SSDs which recorded the largest decreases in the proportion of full-time workers since 1996 were West Coast (to 53.3% from 58.7%), Whyalla (to 54.0% from 57.0%) and Far North (to 62.2% from 63.9%). The Off-Shore Areas & Migratory SSD recorded a decrease (to 42.4% from 64.7%).

In 2001, the highest proportions of full-time workers, as a proportion of persons in the labour force, were recorded in the Statistical Local Areas (SLAs) of Roxby Downs (75.0%) and Le Hunte (71.1%), both outside Adelaide. Within Adelaide, the highest proportions were recorded in Adelaide (62.1%) and Salisbury Bal (61.9%). Unincorp. Western and Unincorp. Lincoln (both 100.0%), and Unincorp. Pirie (75.8%) recorded the highest proportions of full-time workers in SA, but these proportions are based on relatively small populations.

The highest concentrations of part-time workers, as proportions of persons in the labour force, were recorded in the SLAs of Victor Harbour (41.4%) and Alexandrina - Coastal (39.4%). The SLAs of Unincorp. West Coast (47.0%) and Off-Shore Areas & Migratory (42.4%) recorded the highest proportions of part-time workers in SA, but these proportions are based on relatively small populations.

Occupation

In 2001, the largest occupation groups were Professionals (107,132 persons or 16.9%), Intermediate Clerical, Sales and Service Workers (104,832 persons or 16.5%), Tradespersons and Related Workers (78,081 persons or 12.3%), Associate Professionals (73,110 persons or 11.5%), and Labourers and Related Workers (67,440 persons or 10.6%). These proportions are similar to 1996.

Within the Adelaide SLAs, the highest proportions of persons employed as Professionals were recorded in Unley - East (36.1%), Adelaide (36.0%), Norw. P'ham St Ptrs - West and Burnside - South-West (both 35.8%). Outside Adelaide, the highest proportions were registered in Adelaide Hills - North (17.6%) and Barossa - Tanunda (16.9%). Unincorp. Western (50.0%) and Off-Shore Areas & Migratory (17.9%) recorded high proportions, but these are based on relatively small populations.

High proportions of persons employed as Intermediate Clerical, Sales and Service Workers were recorded in the metropolitan SLAs of Tea Tree Gully - North (20.8%), Marion - North, Tea Tree Gully - Central and Onkaparinga - Woodcroft (all 20.3%) and Marion - South (20.1%). Outside Adelaide, the highest proportions were in Port Augusta (19.8%) and Mount Barker - Central (17.3%). The Off-Shore Areas & Migratory SLA recorded 25.5%.

The highest proportion of persons employed as Tradespersons and Related Workers was recorded in Roxby Downs (23.4%), an SLA outside Adelaide. The next five highest proportions were recorded within Adelaide, namely Salisbury Bal (20.4%), Onkaparinga - North Coast (17.6%), Onkaparinga - Morphett (17.5%), Onkaparinga - South Coast (17.3%) and Onkaparinga - Hackham (17.1%).

Occupation continued

High proportions of persons working as Associate Professionals were dispersed throughout the State. Within Adelaide, the highest were recorded in Holdfast Bay - North (14.9%) and Walkerville (14.3%). The SLAs of Peterborough (15.1%), Robe (14.6%), and Coober Pedy (14.3%) recorded the highest proportions of persons working as Associate Professionals outside Adelaide. The Off-Shore Areas & Migratory SLA recorded 14.8%, but again, this is based on a relatively small population.

High proportions of persons employed as Labourers and Related Workers were recorded in the SLAs of Loxton Waikerie - West (28.1%), Renmark Paringa - Paringa (26.2%), Renmark Paringa - Renmark (25.1%) and Wattle Range - East (24.5%), all outside Adelaide. Playford - West Central (24.1%) recorded the highest within Adelaide. Unincorp. Lincoln (33.3%), Unincorp. Riverland (33.2%) and Unincorp. West Coast (26.0%) recorded high proportions of persons employed as Labourers and Related Workers but these are based on relatively small populations.

Industry

In 2001, the four largest industries of employment in SA were Manufacturing (93,428 persons or 14.7%), Retail Trade (92,549 persons or 14.6%), Health and Community Services (72,441 persons or 11.4%) and Property and Business Services (59,374 persons or 9.3%). These industries were also the top four industries in SA in 1996.

Since 1996 there has been an increase in the proportions of persons working in Retail Trade (to 14.6% from 13.3%) and Property and Business Services (to 9.3% from 8.4%), while there was a decline in the proportion of persons working in Wholesale Trade (to 5.0% from 5.7%).

At the SLA level, high proportions of persons employed in Manufacturing were recorded throughout the State. The highest were recorded in Barossa - Tanunda (29.3%), Playford - West Central (28.0%), Barossa - Angaston (27.6%), Wattle Range - East (27.3%), Salisbury - Inner North (27.1%) and Playford - Elizabeth (26.9%). A high proportion was also recorded in Unincorp. Western (33.3%) but this is based on a relatively small population.

The highest proportions of persons employed in Retail Trade were noted in the regional SLAs of Copper Coast (20.4%), Port Pirie C, Dists - City (19.0%), Victor Harbour (18.7%), Port Augusta and Mount Gambier (both 18.6%). The highest proportions in Adelaide were recorded in Onkaparinga - Woodcroft (17.6%), Playford - East Central (17.5%), Tea Tree Gully - Central, Campbelltown - East and Charles Sturt - Inner West (all 17.4%).

Health and Community Services recorded high proportions of employed persons in the metropolitan SLAs of Wakerville (18.4%), Mitcham - North-East (17.2%), Burnside - South-West (16.5%), Unley - East (16.4%) and Burnside - North-East (16.3%). Port Augusta and Flinders Ranges recorded the highest proportions outside Adelaide (both 14.2%).

Industry continued

The highest proportions of persons employed in Property and Business Services were recorded in the metropolitan SLAs of Burnside - South-West (17.8%), Adelaide (17.7%), Unley - East (17.5%), Norw. P'ham St Ptrs - West (17.0%) and Burnside - North-East (16.8%). The highest outside Adelaide was Mount Barker - Central (9.8%). A high proportion was also recorded in Unincorp. Western (33.3%) but again, this is based on a relatively small population.

UNEMPLOYMENT

The number of unemployed persons decreased by 23.7% to 52,340 in 2001 from 68,559 in 1996. The unemployment rate fell to 7.6% in 2001 from 10.4% in 1996. The unemployment rate was 7.4% for Australia in 2001.

While the number of unemployed persons looking for full-time work fell by 30.7% (to 38,434 in 2001 from 55,497 in 1996), those unemployed persons looking for part-time work increased by 6.5% (to 13,906 in 2001 from 13,062 in 1996).

At the SSD level, the largest declines in the unemployment rates between 1996 and 2001 were recorded in Kangaroo Island (to 7.8% from 13.5%), Fleurieu (to 6.8% from 11.3%), Lincoln (to 6.8% from 11.1%) and Yorke (to 9.5% from 13.6%).

In 2001, SLAs with the highest unemployment rate in Adelaide were Playford - West Central (22.3%), Playford - Elizabeth (21.2%) and Port Adel. Enfield - Port (17.2%). Outside Adelaide, Peterborough (16.2%) and Coober Pedy (16.0%) recorded the highest unemployment rates. The SLA of Unincorp. Whyalla also recorded a high unemployment rate with 22.0%.

For those aged 15–24 years, the unemployment rate fell to 14.8% in 2001 from 18.4% in 1996. This compares with a decline to 13.8% from 15.7% for Australia.

The highest youth unemployment rates in Adelaide were recorded in the SLAs of Playford - Elizabeth (34.4%), Playford - West Central (33.4%), Port Adel. Enfield - Port (26.1%) and Onkaparinga - North Coast (23.4%). Outside Adelaide, the highest youth unemployment rates were recorded in Coober Pedy (25.8%) and Peterborough (25.0%). The SLAs of Unincorp. Riverland (50.0%) and Unincorp. Whyalla (37.5%), and Off-Shore Areas & Migratory (38.7%) held high youth unemployment rates, but these proportions are based on small populations.

NON-SCHOOL QUALIFICATION

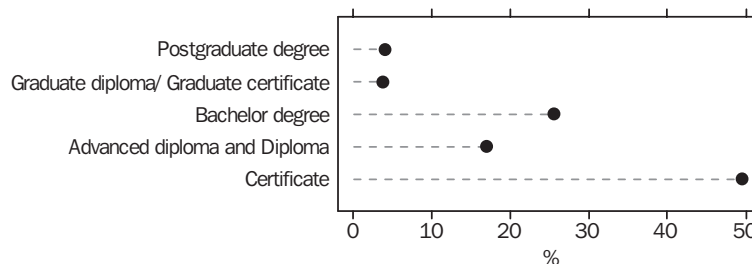
Level of Education

In 2001, there were 374,108 persons aged 15 years and over with a qualification, accounting for 31.9% of all persons aged 15 years and over in SA. Between 1996 and 2001 this proportion rose from 27.9% (an increase of 59,120 persons). In Australia, the proportion rose to 34.7% from 30.0%.

Of those with a qualification, 49.5% (185,257 persons) held a Certificate, 25.6% (95,840 persons) held a Bachelor Degree, 17.0% (63,412 persons) held an Advanced Diploma and Diploma, and 7.9% (29,599 persons) held a Postgraduate Degree or Graduate Diploma and Graduate Certificate as their highest qualification.

High proportions of persons with a Bachelor Degree or higher as their highest level of qualification were recorded in the metropolitan SLAs of Burnside - South-West (29.1%), Norw. P'ham St Ptrs - West (28.8%), Burnside - North-East (28.4%) and Unley - East (27.7%). Outside Adelaide, the highest proportions were recorded in Adelaide Hills - North and Mount Barker Bal (both 12.7%). The Off-Shore Areas & Migratory SLA recorded 13.4%.

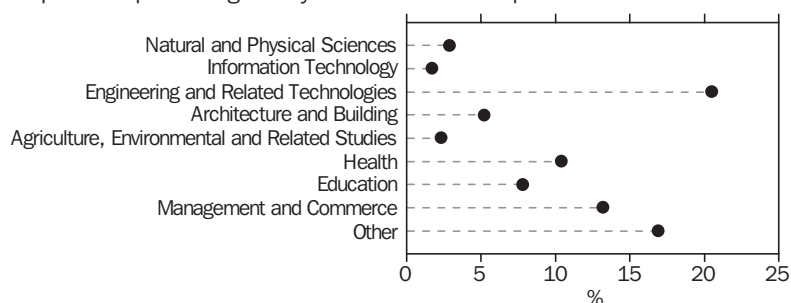
Of persons aged 15 years and over, the highest proportions with an Advanced Diploma and Diploma were recorded in the metropolitan SLAs of Adelaide Hills - Central (9.9%), Mitcham - Hills (9.5%), Burnside - South-West (9.0%), Adelaide Hills - Ranges (8.9%) and Burnside - North-East (8.8%). Outside Adelaide, Mount Barker Bal (7.4%), Adelaide Hills - North (7.3%) and Adelaide Hills - Bal (7.0%) noted the highest proportions of persons with this qualification as their highest level.

High proportions of persons with a Certificate as their highest level of qualification were recorded in both metropolitan and regional SLAs. Outside Adelaide, the highest proportions were recorded in Roxby Downs (28.7%), Whyalla (20.9%) and Adelaide Hills - North (19.9%). Within Adelaide, the highest proportions were in Onkaparinga - Woodcroft (21.1%), Marion - South (20.7%), Tea Tree Gully - Hills (20.6%) and Playford - Hills (20.5%). The SLAs of Unincorp. Western (28.6%), Unincorp. Flinders Ranges (20.3%) and Unincorp. Pirie (19.9%) also recorded high proportions, however, these are based on relatively small populations.

Of all persons aged 15 years and over with a qualification, their highest level qualifications were most commonly held in the fields of Engineering and Related Technologies (100,601 persons or 20.5%), Management and Commerce (64,770 persons or 13.2%), Health (50,934 persons or 10.4%), and Education (38,361 persons or 7.8%). Other, which includes Society and Culture, Creative Arts, Food, Hospitality and Personal Services, and Mixed Programmes (83,096 persons or 16.9%) also recorded a high proportion.

EXPLANATORY NOTES

SCOPE AND COVERAGE

1 The 2001 Census of Population and Housing was held on 7 August 2001. Australia's first national Census was held in 1911 and since 1961 a census has been taken every five years, a frequency which is specified in the *Census and Statistics Act 1905*. The objective of the Census is to count the number of people in Australia on Census Night, identifying their key characteristics and those of the dwellings in which they live.

2 The Census aims to count every person who spent Census Night in Australia. This includes Australian residents in Antarctica and people in the territories of Jervis Bay, Cocos (Keeling) Islands and Christmas Island. The other Australian External Territories, Norfolk Island and minor islands such as Heard and McDonald Islands, are outside the scope of the Australian Census. The only people in Australia on Census Night who are excluded from the Census are foreign diplomats and their families.

3 The Census includes people on vessels in or between Australian ports, on board long distance trains, buses or aircraft and on oil or gas rigs off the Australian coast. People entering Australia before midnight on Census Night are counted while people leaving an Australian port for an overseas destination before midnight on Census Night are not. Visitors to Australia are included regardless of how long they have been in the country or how long they plan to stay. However, for people who intend to be in Australia less than one year, only basic demographic data are available. The Census includes homeless people and people camping out.

4 All occupied dwellings are counted in the Census with the exception of diplomatic dwellings. Unoccupied private dwellings are also counted with the exception of unoccupied dwellings in caravan parks, marinas and manufactured home estates, and units in accommodation for the retired or aged (self-care). Unoccupied residences of owners, managers or caretakers of such establishments are counted.

5 Details about the 2001 Census content, collection operations, confidentiality and privacy protection, processing and evaluation activities are contained in *2001 Census of Population and Housing: Nature and Content* (cat. no. 2008.0).

STATISTICAL LOCAL AREA BOUNDARIES

6 The boundaries of Statistical Local Areas (SLAs) are revised from time to time to accord with changes to Local Government Area (LGA) boundaries and to meet needs for small area information. The boundaries shown in this publication are those applying at the time of the 2001 Census. Further information on geographic classifications is contained in *Statistical Geography: Volume 1—Australian Standard Geographical Classification (ASGC), 2001* (cat. no. 1216.0).

BASIC COMMUNITY PROFILE TABLES B22 TO B33

7 Tables numbered B22 to B33 contained in this publication are from the *Census of Population and Housing: Basic Community Profile* (cat. no. 2001.0). These tables are available in hardcopy or electronic format for all standard census geographic areas. For more information about the Community Profiles please refer to the Appendix.

ABS POPULATION ESTIMATES

8 This publication contains population counts based on a 'Place of enumeration' basis. 'Place of enumeration' means where the person was counted on Census Night. The Census can provide person counts based on 'Place of usual residence' for Collection Districts (CDs) and aggregations of CDs.

EXPLANATORY NOTES *continued*

ABS POPULATION ESTIMATES *continued*

9 The Estimated Resident Population (ERP) is the official Australian Bureau of Statistics (ABS) estimate of the Australian population. The ERP is based on results of the Census of Population and Housing. It is compiled as at 30 June of each census year and updated quarterly between censuses. The intercensal estimates of the resident population are revised following the next census.

10 The ERP is derived from census usual residence counts, by making the following three important adjustments:

- An adjustment for census net underenumeration (or undercount). The level of underenumeration is derived from the Post Enumeration Survey which is conducted soon after the Census, and from estimates based on demographic analysis.
- The inclusion of an estimated number of Australian residents who are temporarily overseas on Census Night and are therefore not covered by the Australian Census. The number of such people is estimated from statistics on overseas arrivals and departures.
- The third adjustment occurs because the Census does not fall on 30 June. For example, the 2001 Census was held on 7 August. Back dating of population estimates from 7 August to 30 June is accomplished using data from birth and death registrations, overseas arrivals and departures, and estimates of interstate migration, for the period 1 July to 7 August.

11 ABS population estimates are published in *Australian Demographic Statistics* (cat. no. 3101.0), produced quarterly, and in *Population by Age and Sex, Australian States and Territories* (cat. no. 3201.0) produced annually. ERPs for SLAs are published in *Regional Population Growth, Australia and New Zealand* (cat. no. 3218.0).

12 The ABS also provides projections (based on different assumptions as to future fertility, mortality and migration) of the resident population of Australia, states and territories. These projections are published every two years in *Population Projections, Australia* (cat. no. 3222.0).

DATA LIMITATIONS

13 Census data are subject to a number of inaccuracies resulting from errors by respondents or mistakes in collection or processing. Whilst many of these are corrected by careful processing procedures, some still remain. The effect of the remaining errors is generally slight, although it may be more important for small groups in the population. The main kinds of error to keep in mind are:

- *Partial non-response*: In some cases where an answer is not provided to a question an answer is imputed (often from other information on the form). In other cases a 'Not stated' code is allocated.
- *Processing error*: While such errors can occur in any processing system, quality management is used continuously to improve the quality of processed data, and to identify and correct data of unacceptable quality.
- *Random adjustment*: Table cells containing small values are randomly adjusted or suppressed to avoid releasing information about particular individuals, families, or households. The effects of these adjustments are statistically insignificant.
- *Respondent error*: Because processing procedures cannot detect or repair all errors made by people in completing the forms, some remain in final data.
- *Undercount*: Although the Census aims to count each person, there are some people who are missed and others who are counted more than once. The data in this publication are not adjusted for the net undercount.

EXPLANATORY NOTES *continued*

DATA LIMITATIONS *continued*

14 Further information on data quality is provided progressively in *Census Update* and in *2001 Census Papers*.

OVERSEAS VISITORS

15 Overseas visitors are defined differently for the 2001 Census. For the 1996 Census overseas visitors were defined as any person who stated they would be in Australia for less than 6 months. For the 2001 Census they are defined as any person who stated they would be in Australia for less than 12 months. Data for overseas visitors are restricted to age, sex and marital status.

LABOUR FORCE STATISTICS

16 The labour force statistics collected from the Census are valuable in providing data for small groups of the population. They are not to be confused with the statistics from the monthly Labour Force Survey, which are only available at state, territory and capital city level.

17 Census figures differ from the survey figures because of differences in scope, questionnaire design and collection procedures. For more information refer to *Census Working Paper 99/2—1996 Census: Labour Force Status* and the *2001 Census Fact Sheet—Labour Force Status*.

18 Official monthly labour force statistics are published in *Labour Force, Australia* (cat. no. 6203.0), produced monthly.

CALCULATIONS OF PROPORTIONS

19 When calculating the proportion of the population with a particular characteristic, 'Not stated' responses are included in the denominator. For example in table 4 the proportion of persons aged 15 years and over with qualification for each geographic area is calculated by dividing the number of persons who stated that they had a non-school qualification by the total population of the geographic area and expressing the result as a percentage. The 'Total population' includes the category 'Not stated'.

20 For census variables which include data for overseas visitors i.e. age, sex and marital status, 'Overseas visitors' are also included in the denominator.

CALCULATION OF MEDIAN

21 A median is a measure of central tendency. It is a mid value which divides a population distribution into two, with half the observations falling below it and half above it. Unlike averages (means) medians are not usually skewed by extreme observations.

22 There are a number of issues to be aware of:

- The categories 'Not stated' and 'Not applicable' are not included in the calculation of medians.
- The category 'Overseas visitor', is excluded in the calculation of all medians in this publication.
- If a median falls into a category that has a text only label, then a value of '0' is used for that category. For this publication this is only relevant to the calculation of median income, as the income classification includes categories 'Nil income' and 'Negative income'.
- When calculating a median on a classification containing ranges, the median may fall into a range which is open-ended. In this case, the median would be set to the number in the label. For example, in the calculation of median weekly individual income, if the median was to fall in the last range *\$1,500 or more*, then \$1,500 would be allocated as the median.

EXPLANATORY NOTES *continued*

CALCULATION OF MEDIANS

continued

- 'Median monthly housing loan repayment' and 'Median weekly rent' are based on the ranged variables HLRD01 and RNTD01 respectively. This is due to difficulties associated with the large number of small cells when using individual dollar values to perform these calculations. An adjustment has been made to HLRD01, with the range *\$1,500 and over* changed to *\$1,500–\$1,999* and an additional range *\$2,000 and over* added.

SELECTED AVERAGES

- 23** Median monthly housing loan repayment is applicable to occupied private dwellings being purchased and includes dwellings being purchased under a rent/buy scheme.
- 24** Median weekly rent is applicable to occupied private dwellings being rented. It excludes dwellings being occupied rent free, Visitor only households and Non-classifiable households.
- 25** Median weekly individual income is applicable to persons aged 15 years and over.
- 26** Median weekly family income is applicable to families in occupied private dwellings. It excludes families where at least one family member aged 15 years and over did not state an income, and families where at least one family member aged 15 years and over was temporarily absent.
- 27** Median weekly household income is applicable to occupied private dwellings. It excludes households where at least one member aged 15 years and over did not state an income, and households where at least one member aged 15 years and over was temporarily absent.
- 28** Mean household size is applicable to occupied private dwellings. It is based on the number of persons usually resident in the dwelling. It includes partners, children, and co-tenants (in group households) who were temporarily absent on Census Night. A maximum of three temporary absentees can be counted in each household. It excludes Non-classifiable households.

UNADJUSTED DOLLARS

- 29** The 1996 Census dollar values for Median weekly individual income, Median monthly loan repayments and Median weekly rent have not been adjusted into 2001 dollars.

Census products fall into two broad types: reference products and data products. Most of the reference products from the 2001 Census are available free of charge from the ABS web site.

CENSUS REFERENCE PRODUCTS

2001 Census Dictionary

The *2001 Census Dictionary* (cat. no. 2901.0) is a comprehensive reference guide to the 2001 Census of Population and Housing. The Dictionary includes a complete listing of 2001 Census classifications. It describes new topics introduced for 2001 and highlights classification changes that have occurred since the 1996 Census. The Dictionary also explains the concepts relevant to census collection, processing and output of data.

How Australia Takes a Census

How Australia Takes a Census (cat. no. 2903.0) provides information about the history of the census, the planning process and the way in which the census is conducted.

Geographic Classifications and Codes

Statistical Geography: Volume 1—Australian Standard Geographical Classification (ASGC) 2001 Census Edition (cat. no. 1216.0) provides information about the names and codes of the standard geographic areas used in the 2001 Census. *Statistical Geography: Volume 2—Census Geographic Areas Australia 2001 Census Edition* (cat. no. 2905.0) and *Statistical Geography: Volume 3—Australian Standard Geographical Classification (ASGC) Urban Centres/Localities: 2001 Census Edition* (cat. no. 2909.0) provide information on additional geographic areas.

2001 Census Statistical Local Area Maps

These reference maps show the Statistical Local Areas (SLAs) from the 2001 Census. Each map shows the boundary of an SLA and the Collection District boundaries contained within.

Digital Boundaries

Census boundaries are made available electronically as *Digital Boundaries*. They include all of the Australian Standard Geographical Classification (ASGC), Urban Centres and Localities, and Census-specific areas.

CENSUS DATA PRODUCTS

Census Snapshots

Census Snapshots are a new product designed to provide a summary overview for selected geographic areas and are available from the ABS web site, free of charge. *Census Snapshots* contain subsets of Community Profile data, including person counts, age and birthplace, presented in a narrative form for easy access by a wide audience. A *2001 Census Snapshot* for Australia is also available to celebrate the Centenary of Federation.

Estimated Resident Population

The Estimated Resident Population (ERP) is the official ABS population estimate. It is based on census usual residence counts, and is updated quarterly using births, deaths and migration data.

- *Basic Community Profile* (cat. no. 2001.0) contains 33 tables of detailed data covering dwelling, household and family topics. This profile is available for all standard census geographic areas, Commonwealth and State Electoral Divisions, Postal Areas, and Suburbs, for the states/territories and Australia.
- *Indigenous Profile* (cat. no. 2002.0) contains 29 tables of key Census characteristics for Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander people, for all ASGC areas from Statistical Local Area (SLA) level to whole of Australia, as well as Indigenous Areas and Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander Commission (ATSIC) regions.
- *Time Series Community Profile* (cat. no. 2003.0) contains 22 tables comparing data from the 1991, 1996 and 2001 Censuses where the classifications are comparable. Data are presented on 2001 geographic boundaries.
- *Usual Residents Profile* (cat. no. 2004.0) contains 28 tables of data for persons usually resident in the selected area. This is the only community profile based on place of usual residence.
- *Expanded Community Profile* (cat. no. 2005.0) contains 49 tables available for SLAs and larger areas, comprising more detailed versions of some of the Basic Community Profile tables, plus additional tables.
- *Working Population Profile* (cat. no. 2006.0) contains 19 tables of labour force and related data on the characteristics of employed people.

Classification Counts

Classification Counts (cat. nos 2022.0–8) provide frequency counts for 2001 Census variables in complete classificatory detail, for every state/territory and Capital City Statistical Division, cross-classified by sex where applicable.

CLIB2001

CLIB2001 is an electronic product provided free of charge to public libraries through the ABS Library Extension Program. The product contains a large volume of tabulated data and software that allows access, display and printing of the data. For 2001 this product will be available as both a CD-ROM and (limited access) Internet-based product. *CLIB2001* comprises the complete 2001 Census Community Profile Series and Classification Counts.

CDATA 2001

CDATA 2001 is a CD-ROM product which contains a large volume of tabulated census data, digital boundaries and base map data, with software to produce tables, maps and graphs of the data. The product is available at the Australia and state/territory levels.

There are two *CDATA 2001* products available, offering different levels of functionality:

CDATA 2001—Full Geographic Information System (GIS): This version is aimed at the expert GIS user who requires detailed spatial data analysis using Structured Query Language, geocoding and importation of 'client own' data.

CDATA 2001—Quickbuild: This version has been designed for GIS users with more basic spatial analysis requirements. It allows users to produce data reports, graphs and/or maps. The product is aimed at inexperienced or intermediate GIS users. *CDATA 2001—Quickbuild* users will also have the option to upgrade to *CDATA 2001—Full GIS* if so desired.

Social Atlas Series

The *Social Atlas* (cat. nos 2030.0–8) publications feature colour maps of the key social, demographic and economic characteristics of each capital city. These will be released from November 2002.

General descriptions of terms and concepts used in this publication are provided below. Tables are also footnoted where applicable for additional clarity. Detailed definitions of classifications and concepts are available in the *2001 Census Dictionary* (cat. no. 2901.0).

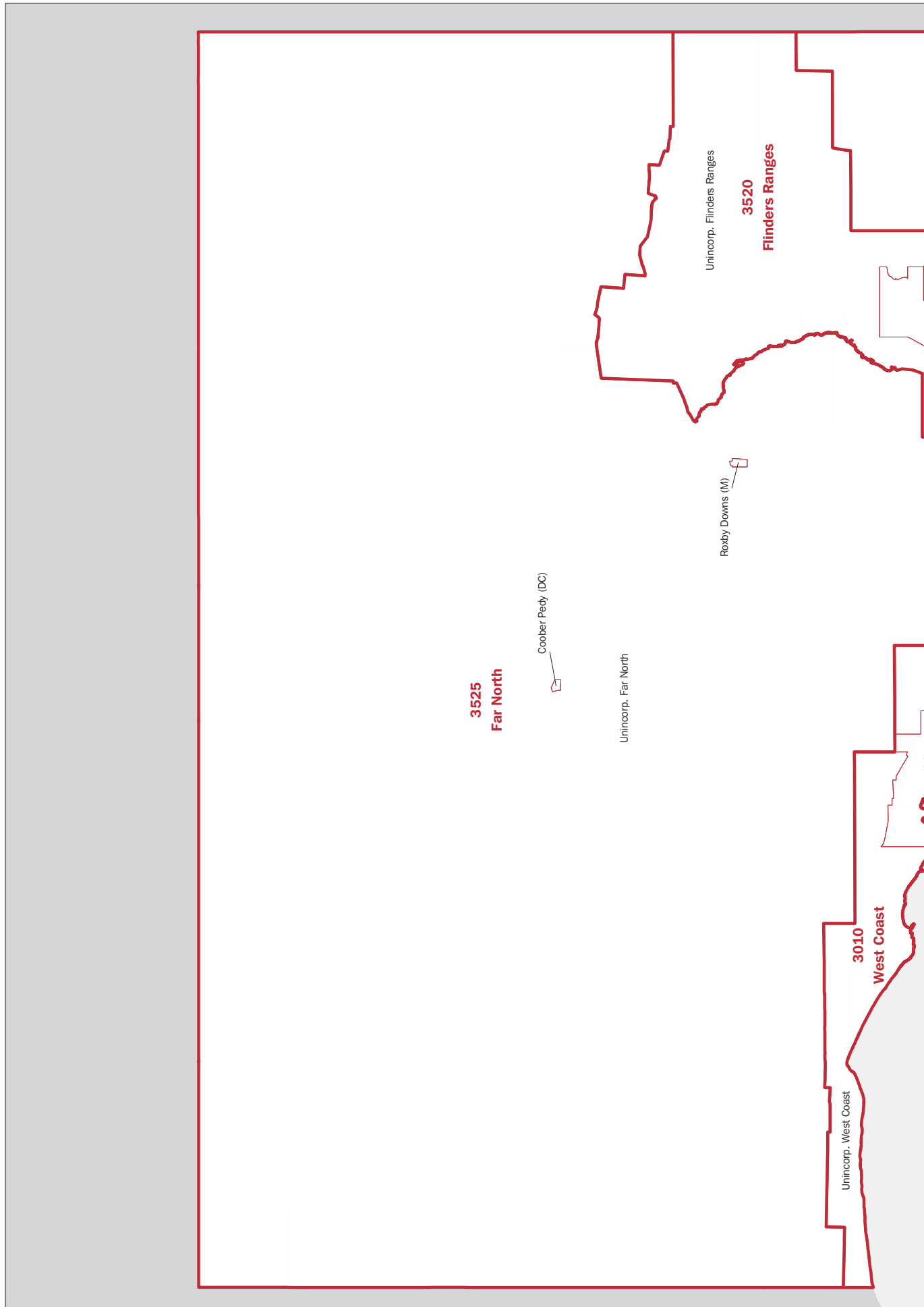
Couple family	This is a family based on two persons who are in a registered or de facto marriage and who are usually resident in the same household. The family may include any number of dependents, non-dependents and/or other related individuals. As it is not necessary for a parent-child relationship to be formed, a couple family can consist of a couple without children.
Family	A family is defined by the ABS as two or more persons, one of whom is at least 15 years of age, who are related by blood, marriage (registered or de facto), adoption, step or fostering, and who are usually resident in the same household. The basis of a family is formed by identifying either a couple, parent-child or other blood relationship. Information on persons temporarily absent on Census Night is considered in family coding.
Full-time/Part-time employment	<p>This variable is based on the number of hours worked in all jobs held by employed people during the week before Census Night. It excludes any time off but includes any overtime or extra time worked:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ■ Part-time workers: employed people who worked up to 34 hours ■ Full-time workers: employed people who worked 35 hours or more.
Geographic areas	<p>The tables in this publication are at the levels of Statistical Local Area, Statistical Subdivision and Statistical Division, as defined by the 2001 Census edition of the Australian Standard Geographical Classification (ASGC).</p> <p><i>Statistical Local Area (SLA)</i>: These areas consist of one or more Collection Districts and cover, in aggregate, the whole of Australia without gaps or overlaps.</p> <p><i>Statistical Subdivision (SSD)</i>: These areas consist of one or more SLAs and cover, in aggregate, the whole of Australia without gaps or overlaps.</p> <p><i>Statistical Division (SD)</i>: These areas consist of one or more SSDs and cover, in aggregate, the whole of Australia without gaps or overlaps. They do not cross state or territory boundaries. However, the Other Territories, Jervis Bay Territory and the Territories of Christmas Island and Cocos (Keeling) Islands together form one SD. Capital city SDs are predominantly urban in character and the boundaries are delineated to contain the anticipated urban development of the capital cities (and associated urban centres) for a period of at least 20 years.</p> <p>SDs outside the capital city are designed to be relatively homogeneous regions characterised by identifiable social and economic links between the inhabitants and the economic units in the region, under the unifying influence of one or more major towns or cities.</p> <p><i>State/territory (STE)</i>: States and territories consist of one or more SDs and are the largest type of spatial unit in the ASGC. The six Australian states and five territories which are part of geographic Australia and included in the 2001 ASGC are New South Wales, Victoria, Queensland, South Australia, Western Australia, Tasmania, Northern Territory, Australian Capital Territory, Jervis Bay Territory and the external Territories of Christmas Island and Cocos (Keeling) Islands. In the ASGC, Jervis Bay Territory, the Territory of Christmas Island and the Territory of Cocos (Keeling) Islands are combined to form Other Territories (OT).</p> <p>For this series of publications, data for Other Territories are published down to SSD level in 2017.0 (Australia), and down to SLA in 2017.1 (New South Wales) for Jervis Bay Territory and 2017.5 (Western Australia) for Christmas Island and Cocos (Keeling) Islands.</p>

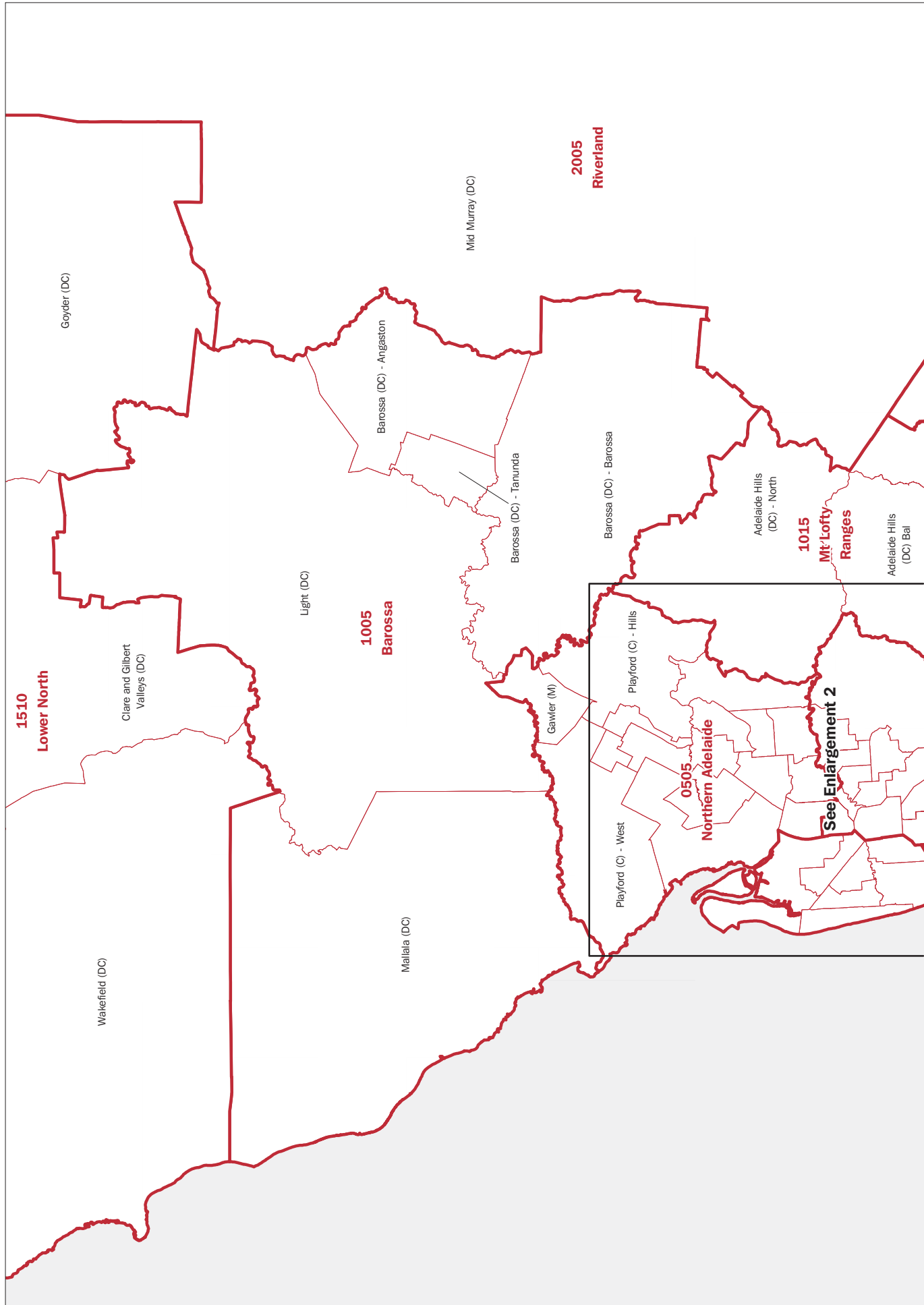
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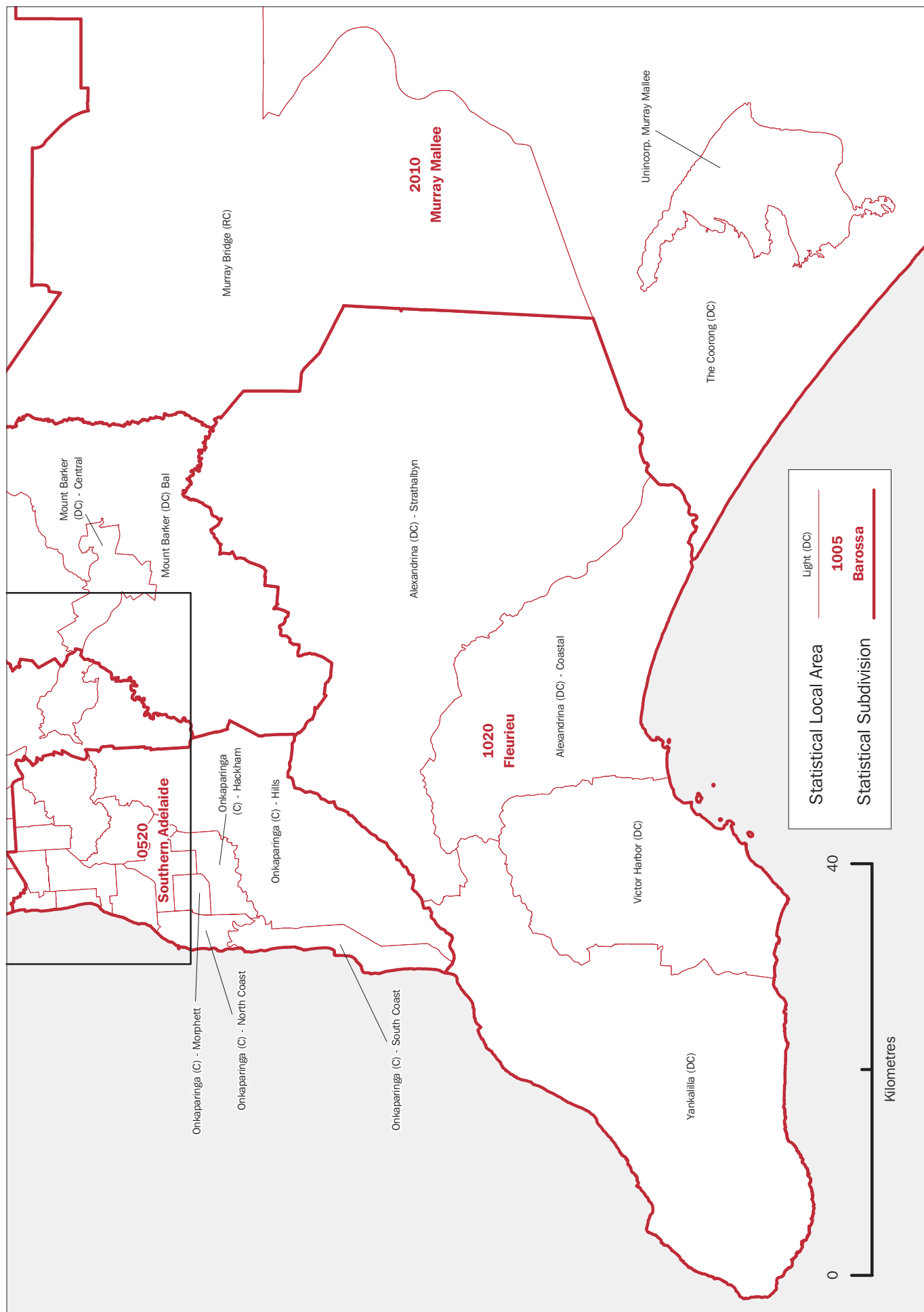
Geographic areas <i>continued</i>	More information about definitions, and lists of codes and names of the geographic areas can be found in <i>Statistical Geography Volume 1—Australian Standard Geographical Classification (ASGC) 2001</i> (cat. no. 1216.0).
Household	<p>A household is defined as a group of two or more related or unrelated people who usually reside in the same dwelling, who regard themselves as a household, and who make common provision for food or other essentials for living; or a person living in a dwelling who makes provision for his/her own food and other essentials for living, without combining with any other person.</p> <p>Under this definition, in a group house where occupants share the dwelling, each occupant who usually supplies his/her own food should be counted as a separate household and issued with a separate Household Form. In practice, however, most such households usually only complete one form.</p>
Household income	<p>Household income is the sum of the individual incomes of each resident present in the household on Census Night. If any resident aged 15 years or over is temporarily absent, or does not state their income, then household income is not derived for that household.</p> <p>Although visitors' incomes are excluded in the calculation of household income, household income is still calculated for households that comprise only visitors, in order to collect data on household incomes in holiday resorts.</p>
Income	<p>People aged 15 years and over are asked to indicate their usual gross weekly income by selecting an income range on the census form. There are 16 options ranging from 'Negative income', 'Nil income' through to '\$1,500 or more per week'. For example, a person with a gross weekly income of \$650 per week would tick the range '\$600–\$699 per week'. Gross weekly income is the income before tax, superannuation, health insurance, or other deductions are made. Gross income includes: family allowance, parenting payment, pensions, unemployment benefits, student allowances, maintenance (child support), superannuation, wages, salary, overtime, dividends, rents received, interest received, business or farm income (less operation expenses) and worker's compensation received.</p>
Industry (of employment)	This variable describes the industries in which employed people (aged 15 years and over) work, and is coded to the <i>Australian and New Zealand Standard Industrial Classification (ANZSIC), 1993</i> (cat. no. 1292.0).
Labour force	The labour force is made up of employed and unemployed people aged 15 years and over.
Labour force status	<p>Labour force status identifies whether a person aged 15 years or over is employed, unemployed or not in the labour force.</p> <p><i>Employed</i> — includes those people who, during the week prior to Census Night, work for payment or profit; have a job from which they are on leave or otherwise temporarily absent; are on strike or stood down temporarily; or work as unpaid helpers in a family business.</p> <p><i>Unemployed</i> — includes people who, during the week prior to Census Night, do not have a job but are actively looking for work (either full-time or part-time) and are available to start work.</p> <p><i>Not in the labour force</i> — includes people aged 15 years and over who are not employed or unemployed as defined above. This includes people who are retired, pensioners and people engaged solely in home duties.</p>
Non-School Qualification: Field of Study	This variable describes the field of study of the highest completed non-school qualification.

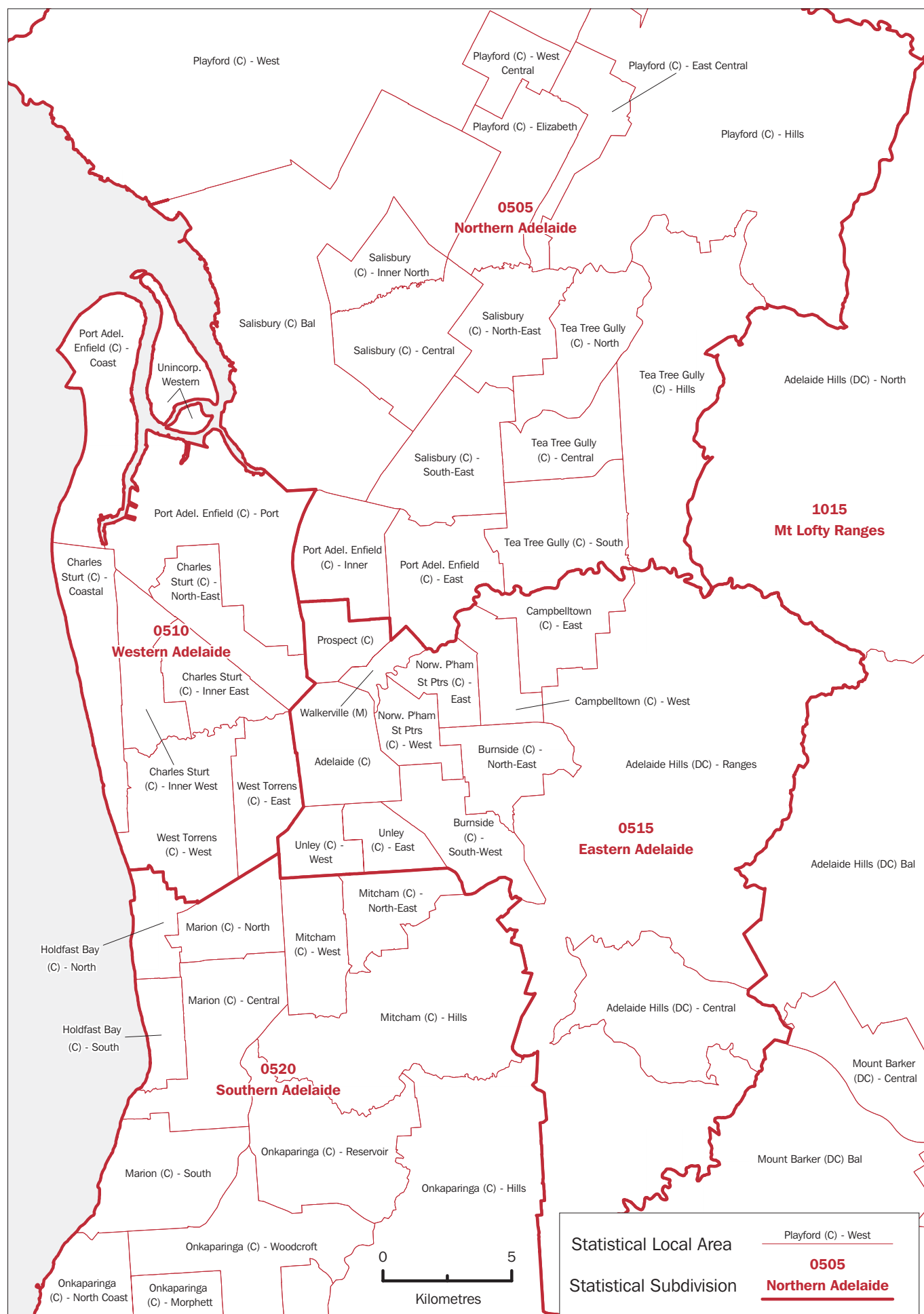
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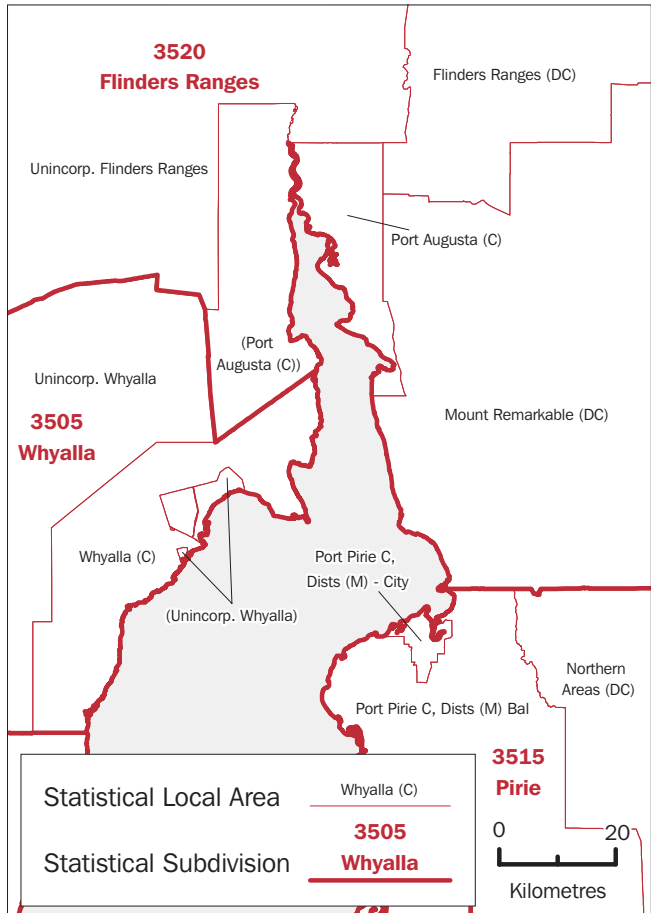
Non-School Qualification: Field of Study <i>continued</i>	The full classification for levels of education and fields of education, together with an explanation of the conceptual basis of the classification, can be found in the publication <i>Australian Standard Classification of Education (ASCED)</i> (cat. no. 1272.0).
Non-School Qualification: Level of Education	<p>This variable describes the level of education of the highest completed non-school qualification (e.g. bachelor degree, diploma).</p> <p>The full classification for levels of education and fields of education, together with an explanation of the conceptual basis of the classification, can be found in the publication <i>Australian Standard Classification of Education (ASCED)</i> (cat. no. 1272.0).</p>
Occupation	This variable describes the main job held by employed people (aged 15 years and over) during the week prior to Census Night, and is coded using the ASCO — <i>Australian Standard Classification of Occupations, Second Edition, 1996</i> (cat. no. 1220.0).
One parent family	A one parent family consists of a lone parent with at least one child (regardless of age) who is usually resident in the household. The family may also include any number of other related individuals.
Unemployment rate	The unemployment rate is the number of unemployed people expressed as a percentage of the labour force.



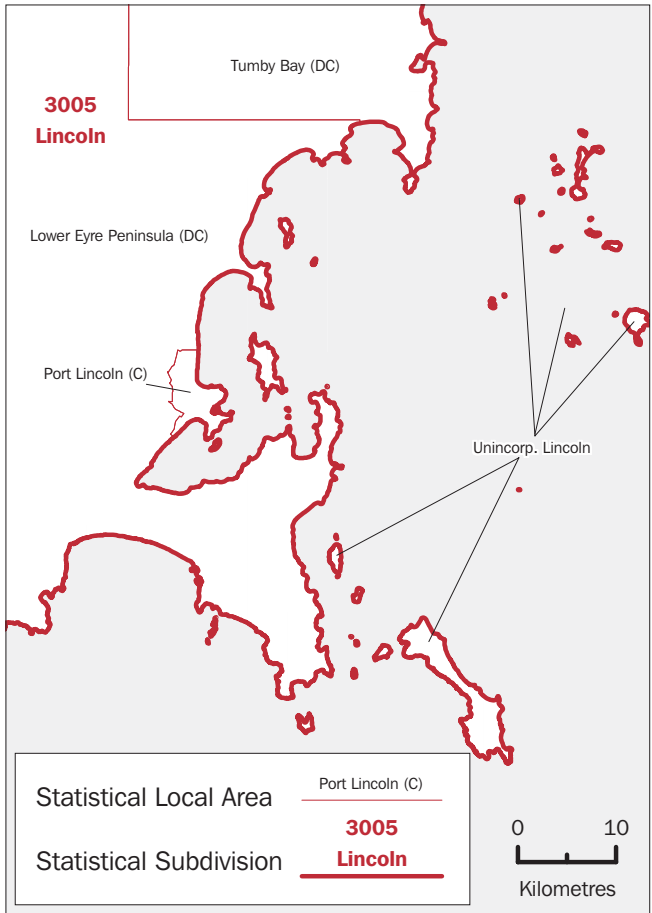






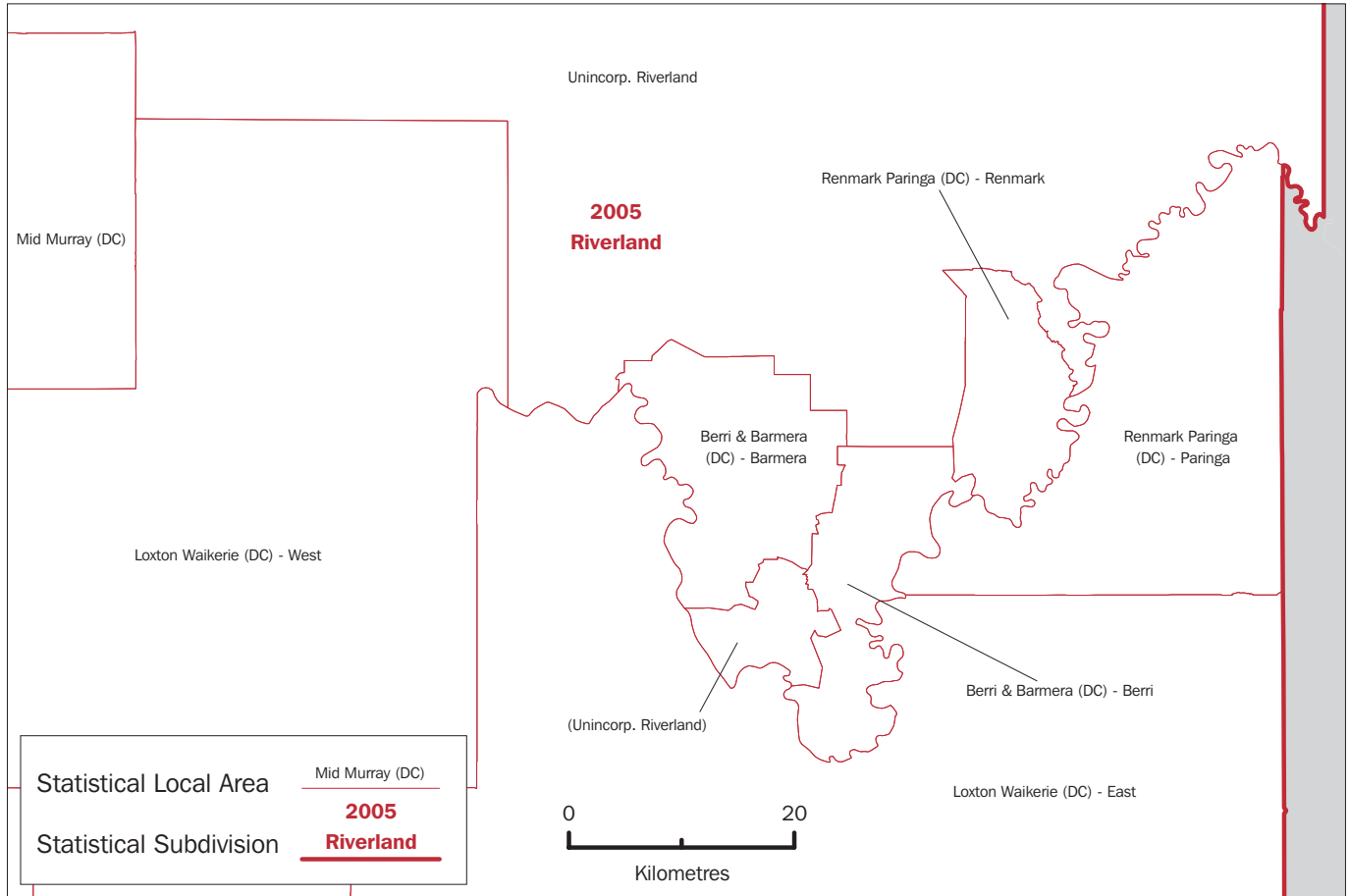
