## SUMMARY OF FINDINGS

---

### INTRODUCTION

In the 12 months to June 2002, the Australian resident population increased by 249,500, reaching 19,662,800 persons in total. The growth rate over this period was 1.3%, compared to an average annual growth rate of 1.2% in the previous five years, 1996–2001. Over the 20 years to 2002, the population increased by 4,478,500 (29%).

The population of all states and territories increased in the year to June 2002. Population growth was fastest in Queensland (a growth rate of 2.2%), followed by Victoria and Western Australia (each 1.4%). Slower increases were recorded in New South Wales (1.0%), the Australian Capital Territory (0.8%) South Australia (0.6%) Tasmania (0.2%) and the Northern Territory (0.1%).


### AGEING POPULATION

The median age of the Australian population, the age at which half the population is older and half is younger, increased by 0.2 years in the year to June 2002. The median age has increased by 6.0 years in the last 20 years, from 29.9 years in June 1982 to 35.9 years in June 2002. Australia's population is ageing due to sustained low fertility (resulting in proportionally fewer children in the population), and increased life expectancy.

#### South Australia has the oldest population

As at June 2002, the population of South Australia had the highest median age of all states and territories (37.9 years). Tasmania had the second highest median age (37.7 years) followed by New South Wales (36.1 years), Victoria (36.0 years), Queensland (35.3 years), Western Australia (35.2 years), the Australian Capital Territory (33.5 years) and the Northern Territory (29.9 years). Tasmania has experienced the largest increase in median age over the last 20 years, increasing by 8.4 years from 29.2 years in 1982.

#### MEDIAN AGE OF POPULATION




### AGE STRUCTURE

Since 1982 there has been slow growth (6%) in the number of children (aged 0–14 years) in the population. In contrast, the number of persons aged 15–64 years has increased by 33%, and the number of persons aged 65 years and over has increased by 66%. This disparate growth pattern reflects a shift in the age structure of the total population, commensurate with gradual population ageing.


### AGE STRUCTURE *continued*

POPULATION CHANGE, Age group—1982 to 2002p



The proportion of children (aged 0–14 years) in the population has declined from 25% in 1982 to 20% in 2002. Conversely, the proportion of persons aged 15–64 years has increased from 65% to 67% over the same period, while the proportion of those aged 65 years and over has increased from 10% to 13%.

### CHILDREN

Nationally, the number of children aged 0–14 years decreased in the 12 months to June 2002 by 5,200 children (0.1%). An increase in the number of children aged 10–14 years of 1.0% (13,000 children) was largely offset by decreases in the number of children aged 0–4 years (−11,900 children) and 5–9 years (−6,300), reflecting Australia's declining fertility (from 1.86 babies per woman in 1991 to 1.73 in 2001).

### CHILDREN *continued*

Queensland was the only state to record growth in the number of children aged 0–14 years (0.9%), while the number of children in Victoria remained virtually unchanged (0.04%). All other states and territories experienced a decline in the number of children. Western Australia recorded the fastest decrease (−1.3%), followed by South Australia and the Australian Capital Territory (−0.7% each), then New South Wales, Tasmania, and the Northern Territory (−0.5% each).

### ADULTS

Overall, growth in the adult population (persons aged 15 years and over) far outweighed growth in Australia's child population, with an increase of 1.7% (254,700 persons) in the 12 months to June 2002. However, this growth was not evenly distributed across the adult population. The growth rate for those aged 15–44 years (1.0%) was considerably lower, and for those aged 45 years and over (2.5%) considerably higher, than the growth rate for the total population aged 15 years and over.

#### Aged 15–64 years

The number of persons aged 15–64 years grew by 1.5% during the 12 months to June 2002. For this age group, Queensland (2.4%) and Victoria (1.7%) experienced growth rates above the national average. The remaining states and territories all experienced increases below the national average: New South Wales (1.3%); the Australian Capital Territory (0.9%), South Australia (0.7%), Tasmania (0.3%) and the Northern Territory (0.1%).

#### Aged 65 years and over

In the 12 months to June 2002, the number of persons aged 65 years and over increased by 2.2%, to just under 2.5 million in total. The Northern Territory (4.9%), the Australian Capital Territory (3.3%), Queensland (3.3%) and Western Australia (3.0%) all experienced growth above the national level in this age group. However, the territories still had relatively small older populations. As at June 2002, persons aged 65 years and over comprised 3.9% and 8.8% of the populations of the Northern Territory and the Australian Capital Territory respectively, compared to the national level of 12.7%. The populations aged 65 years and over in Queensland and Western Australia comprised 11.8% and 11.2% of the respective total populations of these states.

New South Wales, Victoria and Tasmania each recorded growth rates of 1.9% in the older population (aged 65 years and over), while South Australia recorded an increase of 1.5% in this age group. Despite relatively low growth rates over the preceding 12 months, as at June 2002 all but one of these regions had an older population which was proportionally larger than that for Australia as a whole. Persons aged 65 years and over comprised 13.2% of the total population in New South Wales, 13.1% in Victoria, 14.0% in Tasmania and 14.8% in South Australia.

## SUMMARY OF FINDINGS *continued*

### Aged 85 years and over

Proportionally, the greatest population increase in the year to June 2002 occurred among persons aged 85 years and over. During this period, the number of people in this age group increased from 265,200 to 280,400, a growth rate of 5.7%. This continues the rapid increase in the elderly population, which has grown by 164% over the last twenty years, compared to a total population growth of 29% over the same period. Increased life expectancy for both men and women has contributed to this rise. Reflecting the higher life expectancy of women, there were more than twice as many females (192,600) as males (87,800) in this age group.

In the 12 months to June 2002, the fastest increases in the number of persons aged 85 years and over occurred in the Australian Capital Territory (9.4%), Queensland (6.8%), Tasmania (6.3%) and New South Wales (6.2%). These states and territories experienced faster growth in the number of elderly people than did Australia as a whole. The Northern Territory shared the national growth rate for this age group (5.7%). Victoria (4.6%) had the smallest percentage increase in this age group of all the states and territories, followed by Western Australia (4.7%) and South Australia (5.5%).

### INTERNATIONAL COMPARISON *continued*

The trend toward population ageing is established in many countries worldwide. In countries such as Italy, Japan and Greece, the number of persons aged 65 years and over already exceeds the number of children aged 0–14. Population ageing in these countries is a result of sustained low fertility rates, coupled with relatively high life expectancy. In Australia, the number of people aged 65 years and over is not projected to exceed the number of children aged 0–14 years until around 2020<sup>1</sup>.

According to United Nations projections, all countries selected for analysis are expected to experience a decrease in the proportion of children in their populations between 2000 and 2005. In the majority of these countries, the decrease of persons aged 0–14 years is expected to be accompanied by increases in the proportions of persons aged 15–64 years and/or of persons aged 65 years and over. According to ABS projections, the proportion of children in the Australian population is expected to decline by more than one percentage point over the same period (from 20.7% in 2000 to 19.3% in 2005), while the proportions aged 15–64 years and 65 years and over are expected to rise, by one percentage point (from 66.9% to 67.9%) and by half a percentage point (from 12.4% to 12.9%) respectively. Countries such as Italy, Japan and Greece are expected to suffer proportional declines in their populations aged 15–64 years as well as their populations aged 0–14 years. These countries are therefore expected to experience large proportional increases in their populations aged 65 years and over.

In 2000, the age structure of Australia's population was closest to those of Canada and the United States of America. Generally, the European countries and Japan had smaller proportions of children and higher proportions of older people than did Australia. In contrast, countries from the Asian region tended to have proportionally more children and far fewer older people, generally reflecting considerably higher fertility rates and lower life expectancies than those experienced in Australia.

## EXPLANATORY NOTES

---

### INTRODUCTION

**1** This publication contains final estimates of the resident populations by age and sex, of Australian states and territories, as at 30 June 1997 to 2001 and preliminary estimates as at 30 June 2002. Mean ages, median ages and sex ratios for the states, territories and Australia are also included.

**2** Following the 1992 amendment to the *Acts Interpretation Act* to include the Indian Ocean Territories of Christmas Island and the Cocos (Keeling) Islands as part of geographic Australia, population estimates commencing September quarter 1993 include estimates for these two territories. To reflect this change, another category of the state/territory level has been created, known as Other Territories. Other Territories include Jervis Bay Territory, previously included with the Australian Capital Territory, as well as Christmas Island and the Cocos (Keeling) Islands, previously excluded from population estimates for Australia. Data for Other Territories, while not detailed separately, are included in tables where specifically noted.

### RESIDENT POPULATION ESTIMATES SERIES

**3** Australia's population statistics for the period from 1971 are compiled according to the place of usual residence of the population. An explanation of the place of usual residence conceptual basis for population estimates is given in *Demographic Estimates and Projections: Concepts, Sources and Methods, Statistical Concepts Library*, ABS web site: <[www.abs.gov.au](http://www.abs.gov.au)>.

### METHOD OF ESTIMATION

**4** The estimates by age of the population of Australia and the states and territories at the date of the Census are derived from the Census Counts by Place of Usual Residence, by adjusting for under-enumeration and adding the number of Australian residents estimated to have been temporarily overseas at the time of the Census.

**5** Post-censal population estimates are obtained by advancing the previous year's estimates to the next year by subtracting deaths and adding births and net estimated interstate and overseas migration. After each census, estimates for the preceding intercensal period are revised by incorporating an additional adjustment (intercensal discrepancy) to ensure that the total intercensal increase at each age agrees with the difference between the estimated resident populations at the two respective census dates.

#### Net overseas migration

**6** Estimates of overseas migration are based on net permanent and long-term overseas movements with state and territory not stated allocated pro rata. The final estimates from July 1976 onwards include an adjustment for the net effect of category jumping. This adjustment is necessary because net permanent and long-term migration figures can be affected by changes in travel intentions from short-term to permanent/long-term or vice versa. For example, an Australian resident departing for a short-term visit overseas (stating that he/she intends to stay abroad for less than 12 months) in fact stays more than 12 months, thereby changing his/her travel category from short-term to long-term. For estimates from June 1997 onwards, category jumping has been set to zero pending a review of the estimation technique. ### Net interstate migration

**7** Estimates of interstate migration since June 1986 have been derived from latest census data on interstate movement in the preceding one year and five years, and unidentified information on interstate changes of addresses advised to the Health Insurance Commission in the process of administering Medicare.

### AVERAGE ANNUAL RATE OF GROWTH

**8** The average annual rate of population growth,  $r$ , is calculated as a percentage using the formula below, where  $P_0$  is the population at the start of the period,  $P_n$  is the population at the end of the period and  $n$  is the length of the period between  $P_n$  and  $P_0$  in years.

$$\left[ \left( \frac{P_n}{P_0} \right)^{\frac{1}{n}} - 1 \right] \times 100$$

### ACCURACY/RELIABILITY

**9** It should be noted that while the Australian Bureau of Statistics (ABS) seeks to produce the most accurate estimates of the population possible, the accuracy of the estimates depends on the quality of the source data used. The major source of potential error is considered to be the estimates of interstate migration based on Medicare transfer data.

**10** Single year age estimates are not shown for persons aged 85 years or older. The reliability of age estimates decreases as older ages are reached. However, estimates for each age up to 99 have been calculated and are available on request.

**11** In recognition of the inherent accuracy involved in population estimation, population figures over 1,000 in the text are rounded to the nearest hundred, and figures less than 1,000 are rounded to the nearest ten. While unrounded figures are provided in tables, accuracy to the last digit is not claimed and should not be assumed.

**12** ABS publications draw extensively on information provided freely by individuals, businesses, governments and other organisations. ## GLOSSARY .....

<b>Ageing of the population</b>	Ageing of the population is the consideration of the proportion of the population aged 65 years and over, and the way this proportion is continuing to increase, mostly due to persistent low fertility rates and declining mortality rates.
<b>Census count</b>	The Census of Population and Housing enumerates persons on the basis of where they were located on census night. Characteristics of households are only available according to place of enumeration. The Census also compiles information on people according to their place of usual residence. This information is coded to Statistical Local Areas. This means that census counts of people can be produced according to their location on census night as well as their place of usual residence.
<b>Estimated resident population</b>	<p>Estimated resident population (ERP) are estimates of the Australian population obtained by adding to the estimated population at the beginning of each period the components of natural increase (on a usual residence basis) and net overseas migration. For the states and territories, account is also taken of estimated interstate movements involving a change of usual residence.</p> <p>Estimates of the resident population are based on adjusted (for underenumeration) census counts by place of usual residence, to which are added the number of Australian residents estimated to have been temporarily overseas at the time of the Census. Overseas visitors in Australia are excluded from this calculation.</p> <p>After each census, estimates for the preceding intercensal period are revised by incorporating an additional adjustment (intercensal discrepancy) to ensure that the total intercensal increase agrees with the difference between the ERPs at the two respective census dates.</p> <p>The concept of ERP links people to a place of usual residence within Australia. Usual residence is that place where each person has lived or intends to live for six months or more from the reference date for data collection.</p>
<b>Intercensal discrepancy</b>	Intercensal discrepancy is the difference between two estimates of a census year population, the first based on the latest census and the second arrived at by updating the previous census date estimate with intercensal components of population change which take account of information available from the latest census. It is caused by errors in the start and/or finish population estimates and/or in estimates of births, deaths or migration in the intervening period which cannot be attributed to a particular source.
<b>Net interstate migration</b>	The difference between the number of persons who have changed their place of usual residence by moving into a given state or territory and the number who have changed their place of usual residence by moving out of that state or territory during a specified time period. This difference can be either positive or negative.
<b>Net overseas migration</b>	Net overseas migration is net permanent and long-term overseas migration plus an adjustment for the effect of category jumping.
<b>Mean age</b>	The average age of the population.

**Median age** For any distribution the median value is that which divides the relevant population into two equal parts, half falling below the value, and half exceeding it. Thus, the median age is the age at which half the population is older and half is younger.

**Sex ratio** The sex ratio relates to the number of males per 100 females. The sex ratio is defined for total population, at birth, at death and among age groups by appropriately selecting the numerator and denominator of the ratio.

**Usual residence** Usual residence within Australia refers to that address at which the person has lived or intends to live for a total of six months or more in a given reference year.
