### NOTES

This publication presents the estimated resident population (ERP) and area of each Statistical Local Area (SLA) of NSW at 30 June 1996 and 1997, on boundaries existing at 30 June 1997. The 1997 estimates are preliminary, being based on incomplete indicators of population change and a preliminary estimate of the resident population for the State as a whole.

An additional table, located on page 10, shows aggregate estimates for legal Local Government Areas which are split into two or more Statistical Local Areas in the main table. Explanatory notes and definitions are provided on page 11.


Etel Hammond-Roldan Acting Regional Director New South Wales The estimated resident population of NSW at 30 June 1997 was 6,274,400, an increase of 69,600 (or 1.1%) during 1996–97. This compares with an average annual growth of 1.0% during the 1991–96 period. The NSW population growth experienced during 1996–97 comprised a natural increase of 42,300, a net overseas migration gain of 40,900 and a net interstate migration loss of 13,600.

The Sydney Statistical Division increased by 53,600 between 1996 and 1997. The local government areas (LGAs) in the Sydney Division which experienced the highest percentage growth were Sydney (14.6%), Camden (6.6%), Liverpool (5.0%), South Sydney (3.2%), and Wyong (2.5%).

Across the remainder of NSW, the coastal Statistical Divisions of Richmond–Tweed (1.6%), Hunter (1.2%), Illawarra (1.1%) and Mid-North Coast (1.1%) experienced the highest percentage growth.

Outside of Sydney Statistical Division, the LGAs with the most significant percentage growth were Tweed (3.1% and a ranking of 5 in the state), Maclean (3.0% and 6), Great Lakes (2.9% and 7), Byron (2.6% and 8) and Port Stephens (2.3% and 10).

### **EXPLANATORY NOTES**


- **1** The *Estimated Resident Population (ERP)* of an area is the estimate of the number of persons who usually reside in that area.
- **2** Intercensal estimates of resident population are based on the ERP at the date of the previous census (in this case, at the 1996 Census) and available measures of change in resident population since that date. As no direct measure of population movement at the statistical local area level is available, the indicators used may give an incomplete picture of such movement. It should therefore be noted that all intercensal estimates will be subject to revision when final figures are available from the processing of the 2001 Census.
- **3** Detailed explanation of the concept of estimated resident population, as adopted by the Australian Bureau of Statistics (ABS) for official population estimates, is contained in the ABS Information Paper *Population Estimates: Concepts, Sources and Methods* (Cat. no. 3228.0).
- **4** This publication contains data presented according to the Australian Standard Geographical Classification (ASGC). Within this classification, statistical areas are defined as follows:
- Statistical Local Areas (SLAs). These geographical areas are, in almost all cases, identical with, or have been formed from a division of, whole legal Local Government Areas (LGAs) as defined under the (State) Local Government Act 1993 and comprising cities (C) and areas (A). In other cases, they represent areas which are unincorporated under the Act. In aggregate, SLAs cover the whole of the State without gaps or overlaps. In some cases legal LGAs overlap statistical subdivision boundaries and therefore comprise two SLAs (Part A and Part B) or three SLAs in the case of Cabonne (A) (Part A, Part B and Part C). Separate estimates for these Legal LGAs are shown on page 10 of this publication.
- Statistical Subdivisions (SSDs). These consist of one or more SLAs and form
  the intermediate size spatial unit for the presentation of regional data.
- Statistical Divisions (SDs). These consist of one or more Statistical Subdivisions (SSDs). Where SSDs are not shown, Statistical Local Areas are ordered alphabetically within Statistical Divisions. The divisions are designed to be relatively homogeneous regions characterised by identifiable social and economic units within the region, under the unifying influence of one or more major towns or cities.
- **5** Further information concerning statistical areas is contained in the publication *Regional Statistics, New South Wales* (Cat. no. 1304.1) and in the publication *Australian Standard Geographical Classification* (Cat. no. 1216.0).
- **6** The estimates of resident population contained in this publication are shown to the nearest unit without rounding; accuracy to this level is not claimed and should not be assumed. This procedure is applied because rounding of small cells could result in substantial year to year fluctuations owing to the rounding process rather than an actual population change.
- **7** Population estimates in previous publications have been rounded as follows:
- All areas in Sydney Statistical Division have been rounded to the nearest 50 persons:
- For the remainder of New South Wales, the SLA and Subdivision totals have been rounded to the nearest 10 persons;
- Statistical Division totals have been rounded to the nearest 50 persons.
- The State total has been rounded to the nearest 100 persons.
