ABOUT THIS PUBLICATION

This publication contains estimates of the resident populations of Statistical Local Areas (SLAs) and Local Government Areas (LGAs) of Tasmania by age and sex as at 30 June 1997. Also included are estimated resident populations for the census year of 1996.

Information on the methodology used to estimate resident population in Tasmania (and in the LGAs and SLAs) is contained in the Explanatory Notes at the back of this publication.

SUMMARY OF FINDINGS

TOTAL POPULATION

The estimated resident population of Tasmania as at 30 June 1997 was 473,501, a decrease of 942 since June 1996. The growth rate for 1996-97 was -0.20%, compared with a growth rate of 0.16% for 1995-96.

Only the Southern subdivision increased its population for 1996-97, by 176 persons (0.5%). In order, by total population, the decreases were Greater Hobart (250 or 0.1%), Greater Launceston (144 or 0.1%), Burnie-Devonport (233 or 0.3%), North Western Rural (74 or 0.3%), Central North (136 or 0.6%), North Eastern (57 or 0.4%) and Lyell (224 or 3.5%).

MEDIAN AGE

The median age of the estimated resident population of Tasmania as at 30 June 1997 was 35.1, an increase of 0.5 years on the 34.6 for 30 June 1996. This was 0.8 years higher than the Australian median age of 34.3 years. The median age for Tasmanian males increased from 33.8 at 30 June 1996 to 34.3 at 30 June 1997. The equivalent figures for Tasmanian females were 35.3 in 1996 and 35.8 in 1997.

The highest median age among the subdivisions was in North Eastern (37.7 years), followed by Southern (36.1 years) and Central North (35.9 years). The lowest median age was recorded by Lyell (30.7 years) followed by North Western Rural (33.4 years).

The local government areas with the highest median ages were Glamorgan/Spring Bay (40.5 years), Break O'Day (39.6 years), Flinders (39.2 years) and Tasman (38.9 years). Local government areas with the lowest median ages included Brighton (27.3 years), West Coast (30.7 years) and Circular Head (32.4 years).

AGE STRUCTURE

Population Aged 0-14 Years

The population aged 0-14 years was estimated to be 104,445 persons, or 22.1% of the population of Tasmania at 30 June 1997, compared with 106,460 persons (23.7%) in 1987.

The subdivision with the highest proportion of its population in the 0-14 age group was Lyell (26.3%), followed by North Western Rural (25.5%) and Southern (23.8%). Greater Launceston (21.3%) and Greater Hobart (21.3%) had the lowest proportions.

The local government areas with the highest proportion of children aged 0-14 years were Brighton (31.1%), West Coast (26.3%), Sorell (26.0%), Huon Valley (25.3%) and Circular Head (25.3%). The local government areas of Hobart (16.2%), Glamorgan/Spring Bay (19.8%), Launceston (20.0%) and Glenorchy (20.4%) were estimated to have had the lowest proportions of children aged 0-14 years.

SUMMARY OF FINDINGS *continued*

Population Aged 15-64 Years

The population aged 15-64 years was estimated to be 307,818 persons, or 65.0% of the population of Tasmania at 30 June 1997, compared with 292,798 persons (65.2%) in 1987.

The subdivision of Lyell had the highest proportion of its population in the 15-64 age group (67.2%), followed by Greater Hobart (65.6%), North Western Rural (65.4%) and Central North (65.3%). North Eastern had the lowest proportion (61.9%).

The local government areas with the highest proportion aged 15-64 years were Hobart (69.5%), West Coast (67.2%), Central Highlands (66.1%) and Derwent Valley (65.8%). The local government areas of Dorset (61.1%), Break O'Day (62.5%), Waratah/Wynyard (63.3%), Central Coast (63.7%), Sorell (63.7%) and Devonport (63.7%) were estimated to have the lowest proportions of their populations aged 15-64 years.

Population Aged 65 Years and Over

The 65 years and over age group was estimated to be 61,238 persons, or 12.9% of the population of Tasmania at 30 June 1997, compared with 49,968 persons (11.1%) in 1987.

Between 1996 and 1997, the number of persons aged 65 and over grew in all subdivisions except for Lyell.

The subdivision with the highest proportion of its population in the 65 and over age group was North Eastern (14.9%), followed by Burnie-Devonport (14.1%) and Greater Launceston (13.8%). Lyell had the lowest proportion (6.4%).

Glamorgan/Spring Bay had the highest proportion of its population aged 65 years and over (16.1%) followed by Glenorchy (15.6%), Break O'Day (15.4%), Launceston (14.6%) and Dorset (14.6%). Lowest proportions were recorded by Brighton (4.9%), West Coast (6.4%), Kentish (10.0%) and Circular Head (10.1%).

Population Aged 85 Years and Over

The population aged 85 years and over in Tasmania was estimated to be 5,800 persons, or 1.2% of the population at 30 June 1997, compared with 3,737 persons (0.8%) in 1987.

The subdivisions with the highest proportion of their population in the 85 and over age group were Greater Hobart (1.3%) and Burnie-Devonport (1.3%). Lowest proportions were recorded by Lyell (0.6%) and North Western Rural (0.7%).

Hobart had the highest proportion of its population aged 85 years and over (1.8%), followed by Launceston (1.7%), Flinders (1.4%), Central Coast (1.4%) and Glenorchy (1.4%). Lowest proportions were recorded by West Coast (0.6%), Southern Midlands (0.6%), Brighton (0.6%) and Sorell (0.7%).

EXPLANATORY NOTES

METHODOLOGY

- 1 Australia's population statistics (since 1971) have been compiled according to the place of usual residence of the population. An explanation of the conceptual basis is given in the ABS Information Paper *Population Estimates: Concepts, Sources and Methods* (3228.0) issued on 23 June 1995.
- 2 The estimated resident population of any area at a Census date is derived by adjusting the Census Count Place of Enumeration data to exclude visitors who normally reside outside the area, to include residents who were temporarily absent in other areas or overseas, and to apply a factor for census under-enumeration.
- 3 Due to the 1996 Census being held on 6 August, further adjustments were made for births, deaths and net migration for the period 30 June to 6 August 1996 to arrive at an estimated resident population at 30 June 1996.
- 4 Post-censal estimates at the National and State and Territory levels are made quarterly and are obtained by adding components of natural increase (on a usual residence basis) and net migration gain to the population at the beginning of each period.
- 5 At the National level, estimates of overseas migration are based on net permanent and long-term overseas movements as recorded on passenger cards completed by incoming and outgoing travellers for the Department of Immigration and Ethnic Affairs.
- 6 At the State and Territory level, information about internal migration is available from population censuses and from a sample survey of internal movements (conducted at more or less annual intervals to 1987 and resumed in 1991). These sources, however, do not provide the up-to-date quarterly estimates of interstate migration required for regular population estimates. The only suitable sources for this purpose are administrative records. Since June 1986, quarterly estimates of internal migration have been derived from changes of addresses advised to the Health Insurance Commission in the process of administering Medicare.
- 7 Post-censal Statistical Local Area (SLA) estimates are made annually and are produced with the assistance of local government authorities and other bodies who provide information on significant local factors which may have caused population changes in the relevant period.
- 8 Estimates for Tasmania and component areas, based on 1996 Census results, were published in *Regional Population Growth, Australia, 1996 Census Edition, 1991-96* (Catalogue No. 3218.0). This publication was released on 15 July 1997.

DATA QUALITY

- 9 The quality of estimates in this publication depends on the quality of population census results (including under-enumeration adjustments) and on the various components and indicators of population change.

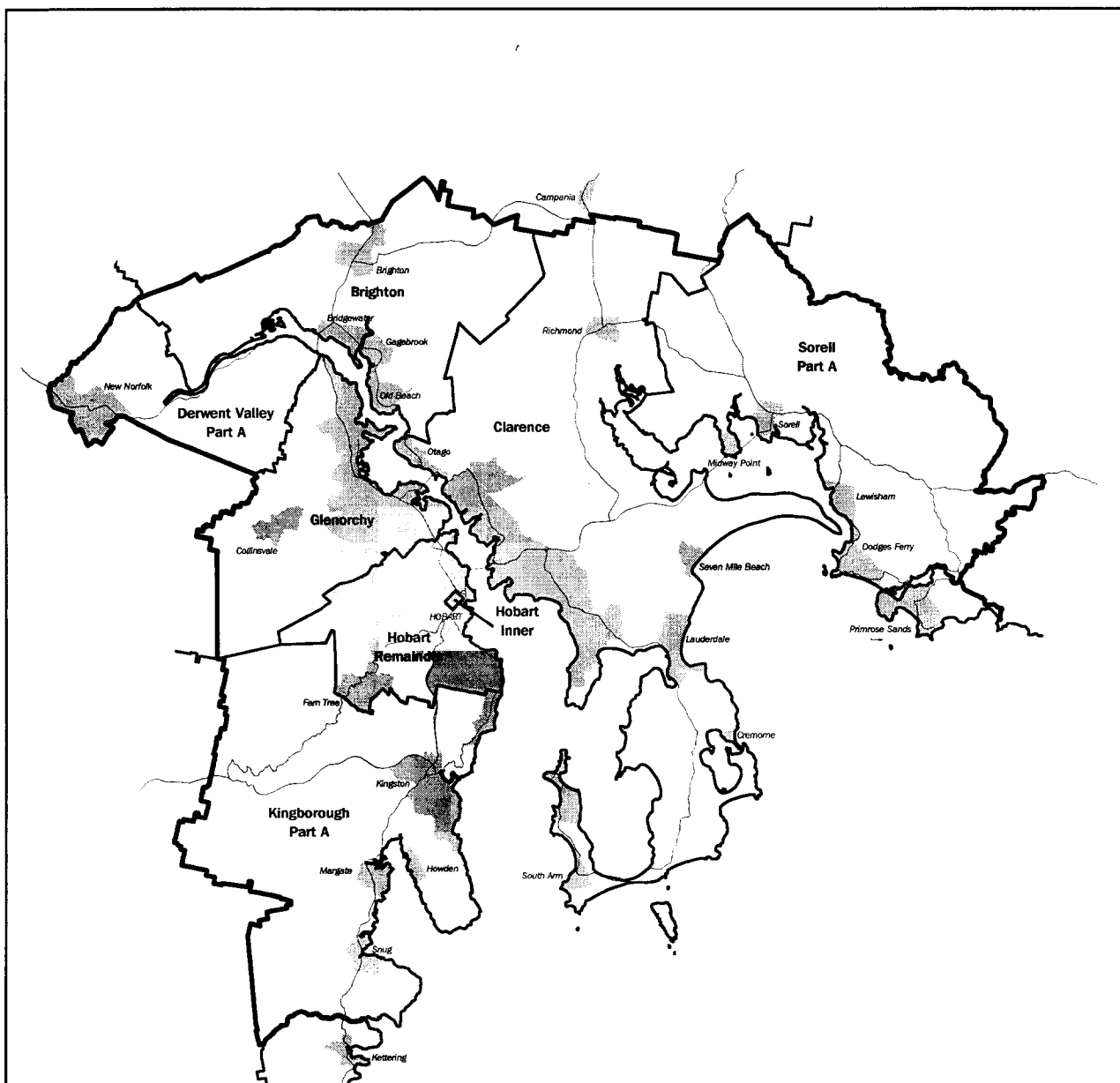
