## ABOUT THE PUBLICATION

This Special Data Series publication presents details on Private Acute and Psychiatric Hospitals from the 2003–2004 national census of private hospitals.

The 2003–2004 national census of private hospitals used two forms to collect data: PHE1 for private acute and psychiatric hospitals and PHE2 for free-standing day hospital facilities. A copy of the relevant collection form can be provided on request. The form contains definitions which may help you with the interpretation of the data in the tables.

Please note that in each table title, a reference to the relevant question number on the collection form is shown in brackets.

State level data has been provided, where possible, for New South Wales, Victoria, Queensland, South Australia, and Western Australia separately. Tasmania, Northern Territory and Australian Capital Territory data has been aggregated to maintain confidentiality of respondents data.

In most tables, data has been rounded. This rounding can cause totals to be different to the combined values in selected tables.

Not all tables sum to the total number of hospitals due to confidentiality of respondents data.
