ABOUT THIS PUBLICATION

This publication presents information on persons in custody and community-based corrections. The statistics are derived from information collected by the Australian Bureau of Statistics from administrative records held by corrective services agencies in each State and Territory. Details are provided for each State and Territory, together with numbers and imprisonment rates by type of custody (i.e. open or secure custody or periodic detention). Information is also presented on prisoner numbers by legal status (sentenced or unsentenced) and by sentence type, for all prisoners and for Indigenous prisoners, together with the number of sentenced receptions into custody and the number of Federal prisoners.

The valuable contribution of the Board of Management and the Advisory Group of the National Corrective Services Statistics Unit (NCSSU) to the production of the statistics in this publication is acknowledged.

CHANGES IN THIS ISSUE

Appearing for the first time in this issue are two tables containing data on persons in community-based corrections. These refer to the community-based management of court-ordered sanctions, post-prison administrative arrangements and fine conversions for offenders, which principally involve the provision of one or more of the following activities: supervision, programmes or community work.



NUMBER OF PRISONERS

In the September quarter 2000 the average daily number of prisoners in Australia was 20,731, a decrease of 97 (less than 1%) on the June quarter 2000. Most States and Territories reported only small variations in prisoner numbers from June 2000. Western Australia and Victoria recorded the greatest increases, rising by 94 prisoners (3%) and 35 prisoners (1%) respectively. The number of prisoners in Queensland and South Australia was down by 164 (3%) and 29 (2%) respectively.

The average daily number of prisoners in Australia increased by 72 (less than 1%) over the year from the September quarter 1999. The largest increases from the September quarter 1999 were recorded in Victoria and Western Australia, rising by 194 (7%) and 142 (5%) respectively. Queensland recorded the greatest decrease (321, or 6%).


PERSONS IN PRISON CUSTODY-Australia



RATES PER 100,000 ADULTS

Nationally, the average daily imprisonment rate was 143 prisoners per 100,000 adult population during the September quarter 2000. The Northern Territory had the highest imprisonment rate per 100,000 adult population, with a rate of 457. This is substantially greater than the next highest jurisdictions, Western Australia and Queensland, with rates of 224 and 176 prisoners per 100,000 adult population respectively.

SEX

Of the average daily number of prisoners in Australia during the September quarter 2000, 19,444 (94%) were males and 1,288 (6%) were females. The proportion of male and female prisoners remained unchanged from the June quarter 2000 to the September quarter 2000. For the September quarter 2000 these proportions varied only slightly between States and Territories.

TYPE OF CUSTODY

In the September quarter 2000 the average daily number of prisoners in secure prison custody in Australia was 14,729 (71%). The remaining 6,002 prisoners (29%) were held in open prison custody. The highest proportion of prisoners held in secure prisons was recorded in Victoria (88%), followed by South Australia (87%). The State or Territory with the lowest proportion of prisoners in secure prison custody was the Australian Capital Territory (including Australian Capital Territory prisoners held in New South Wales prisons) with 45%. All female prisoners in South Australia, Tasmania and the Northern Territory were held in secure prison custody.

LEGAL STATUS AND SENTENCE TYPE

On 1 September 2000, there were 20,680 prisoners in Australia. Of these, 17,021 (82%) were sentenced and 3,659 (18%) were unsentenced. South Australia had the highest proportion of unsentenced persons in prison custody (25%), followed by the Northern Territory (24%). Victoria and Queensland recorded the lowest proportion of unsentenced persons in prison custody with 14% and 15% respectively.

SENTENCED RECEPTIONS

There were 7,642 sentenced receptions in Australia during the September quarter 2000. Queensland reported the highest number of sentenced receptions with 2,933 prisoners, followed by 1,814 in New South Wales and 1,101 in Western Australia. Of all sentenced receptions in Australia during this quarter, 1,175 (15%) were of persons received into custody for default of fines and no other sentence (fine default only), with Queensland reporting 813 (69%) of these fine default only receptions. As a consequence of the introduction of Fine Enforcement Legislation in March 2000, the number of prisoners received into South Australia for fine default fell dramatically. It decreased from 289 in the December 1999 quarter to 99 in the March 2000 quarter and 2 in the June 2000 quarter. However, in the September 2000 quarter there was a slight increase to 19.

During the September quarter 2000, the sentenced reception rate for Australia was 53 per 100,000 adult population. The highest sentenced reception rates were recorded in the Northern Territory and Queensland (194 and 109 persons per 100,000 adult population respectively). It should be noted that persons imprisoned for fine default usually serve a relatively short time in custody. Fine default prisoners comprise only 1% of the total prisoner population.

SUMMARY OF FINDINGS continued

INDIGENOUS PRISONERS

On 1 September 2000, there were 3,934 Indigenous prisoners in Australia (19% of the Australian prisoner population). The highest number of Indigenous prisoners was recorded in New South Wales (1,134). The Northern Territory recorded the highest proportion of Indigenous prisoners, where 62% of all prisoners were Indigenous.

The national rate of imprisonment for Indigenous persons was 1,701 per 100,000 adult Indigenous population. The corresponding rate for the total adult population of Australia was 143 per 100,000 persons. The highest rate of imprisonment for Indigenous persons was recorded in Western Australia (2,905 Indigenous persons per 100,000 adult Indigenous population) followed by New South Wales and Queensland (1,781 and 1,650 Indigenous persons per 100,000 adult Indigenous population respectively).

Nationally, the Indigenous rate of imprisonment was 15 times the non-Indigenous rate. The highest ratios of Indigenous to non-Indigenous rates of imprisonment were recorded in Western Australia and South Australia which had Indigenous rates of imprisonment 18 and 16 times the non-Indigenous rates respectively.

Further information on the interpretation of statistics on Indigenous persons in prison custody is provided in an Appendix on page 37 of this publication.

PERIODIC DETENTION

Periodic Detention is a form of custody only used in New South Wales and the Australian Capital Territory. There was an average daily number of 1,218 persons in New South Wales and 77 persons in the Australian Capital Territory held in periodic detention during the September quarter 2000.

FEDERAL PRISONERS

On 1 September 2000, there were 756 Federal sentenced prisoners in Australia. Of these, 327 (43%) were sentenced in New South Wales, followed by Western Australia with 157 (21%) and Queensland with 102 (14%) respectively.

PERSONS IN COMMUNITY-BASED CORRECTIONS

In the June quarter 2000 the number of persons in community-based corrections in Australia was 59,190. The highest proportion of these was recorded in Queensland (34%), followed by New South Wales (33%). The State or Territory with the lowest proportion of persons in community-based corrections was the Northern Territory with only 1%.

Over 80% (47,858) of persons in community-based corrections in the June quarter 2000 were males. The proportion of males to females varied only slightly between States and Territories.

SUMMARY OF FINDINGS continued

RATES PER 100,000 ADULTS

Nationally, the rate for persons in community-based corrections during the June quarter 2000, was 408 persons per 100,000 adult population. Queensland recorded the highest rate per 100,000 adult population, with a rate of 750. This is substantially greater than the next highest jurisdictions, South Australia and the Australian Capital Territory, with rates of 524 and 448 persons per 100,000 adult population respectively. Victoria reported the lowest rate for persons in community-based corrections, with a rate of 178 persons per 100,000 adult population.

TYPE OF ORDER

In the June quarter 2000 the 59,190 persons in community-based corrections in Australia were serving a total of 65,987 orders. The most common orders served were sentenced probation (43%) followed by fine options (22%). Sentenced probation was the most common order served in each of the jurisdictions, except for Queensland where 50% of the orders were fine options. Only 370 orders (less than 1%) were for bail and 754 (1%) were for restricted movement.

INTRODUCTION

- **1** This publication presents statistical series on persons held in either adult corrective services custody or who are serving community-based orders in Australia. It contains data on the number of persons by their sex, type of custody, legal status and sentence type; the number of sentenced persons received into corrective services custody each month; the number of Indigenous persons in corrective services custody by their sex, legal status and sentence type, and the number of Federal prisoners each month.
- **2** Statistics presented in this publication are compiled in three ways:
- Average daily prisoner population: Counts taken on each day of the month are summed and divided by the number of days in that month to determine the average daily prisoner population for that month. The average daily periodic detainee population is a count of persons on periodic detention on each day a centre is open, divided by the number of days a centre is open.
- Sentenced prisoner reception figures: Counts are taken of the number of receptions where a prisoner is received as a sentenced prisoner plus the number of changes of legal status from unsentenced to sentenced.
- First day of the month prisoner population: Counts of prisoner populations, taken on or near the first day of the month (see Explanatory Notes, paragraph 4).
- **3** Although national standards and classifications are used in the compilation of these statistics, some discrepancies remain between the States and Territories. These are due to legislative and procedural differences between jurisdictions and the way that these differences are reflected in agencies' administrative data systems. As part of its development strategy, the ABS is working with corrective services agencies to minimise the effect of these differences.

REFERENCE PERIOD/DATE

- **4** For the average daily prisoner population and the sentenced prisoner receptions counts, the reference period is the complete reference month. For all other information in the publication, the reference date is the first day of the month. However, not all States and Territories report strictly according to this 'first day of the month' rule:
- The Western Australian and Victorian prison population and Australian Capital Territory prisoners in New South Wales prisons are counted as at midnight on the last day of the month. In these cases the figures provided are taken to represent the prison population at the beginning of the following month to align with practices in other States and Territories.
- The New South Wales prison population is counted on the first Sunday of the month
- In January 1999 ACT Corrections commenced sending surplus unsentenced prisoners to New South Wales prisons. These unsentenced ACT in NSW prisoners are shown on a daily average basis in Table 3.
- **5** Calculation of figures for the entire quarter and entire year varies depending on the counting unit and method of counting prisoners, these figures may be subject to rounding:
- Average daily figures: Figures are calculated by weighting the average according to the number of days in each month or year.
- First day of the month: Figures are simple averages. Quarterly figures for each month are added and the total is divided by three; for yearly figures, the figures for each month are added and the total divided by twelve.
- Sentenced receptions: Figures are totals of each month.

SCOPE

- **6** The scope of the statistics in this publication includes all persons remanded or sentenced to adult custodial corrective services agencies in each State and Territory in Australia.
- **7** In all States and Territories except Victoria, Queensland and Tasmania, persons remanded or sentenced to adult custody are aged 18 years and over. Persons under 18 years are treated as juveniles in most Australian courts and are not remanded or sentenced to custody in adult prisons, other than in exceptional circumstances. However, in Victoria, Queensland and Tasmania 'adult' refers to persons aged 17 years and over.
- **8** The statistics include persons in Work Outreach Camps and Community Custody Centres in Queensland. In table 1 these persons have been counted on a first day of the month basis for the year 1997. However, the figures in the rest of the table, and the rest of persons in corrective services custody in Queensland, were counted on an average daily basis.

DATA SOURCE

- **9** Statistics in this publication are derived from information collected by the ABS from administrative records held by corrective services agencies within each State and Territory. Statistics on Federal prisoners are derived from records kept by the Criminal Law Division of the Commonwealth Attorney-General's Department.
- **10** Statistics marked 'n.a.' in tables 3, 5 and 6 are not available for inclusion in this publication. New South Wales Department of Corrective Services modified their computer system to enable provision of counts of Indigenous persons in custody from July 1999. Australian Capital Territory Corrective Services have advised that the numbers of Indigenous prisoners sentenced in Australian Capital Territory courts and held in New South Wales prisons had been under reported. This under reporting was resolved from April 2000. The Victorian computer system was modified to produce counts of Indigenous persons from the first day of March 1998.

INDIGENOUS IDENTIFICATION

- **11** In all States and Territories persons are asked whether they identify as Aboriginal or Torres Strait Islander during entry into custody. It is uncommon for corrective services agencies to collect Indigenous status information from sources other than the person's own identification.
- **12** Some persons in custody are recorded as of unknown Indigenous status on corrective services agencies' information systems, but unknown Indigenous status has not been provided for this collection. It is intended that unknown Indigenous status will be collected from these systems in future.
- **13** Table 5 shows the ratio of Indigenous to non-Indigenous rates of imprisonment. To derive these figures the rates per 100,000 adult non-Indigenous population were calculated as if all those persons not identified as Indigenous are non-Indigenous.

AUSTRALIAN CAPITAL TERRITORY PRISONERS

14 The Australian Capital Territory has a detention centre for unsentenced prisoners and a periodic detention centre, but does not have a facility to hold persons sentenced to full-time custody. Persons sentenced to full-time custody in Australian Capital Territory criminal courts are held in New South Wales prisons. To provide greater understanding of the number of prisoners attributed to the Australian Capital Territory while presenting an accurate picture of the New South Wales prisoner population, statistics relating to Australian Capital Territory prisoners in New South Wales prisons are presented as a subset of the New South Wales figures.

RATES AND RATIOS

- **15** Imprisonment rates enable comparison of prisoner numbers across States and Territories. Prisoner rates are expressed per 100,000 adult population.
- **16** For the purpose of this publication the population figures used in the calculation of rates are for persons aged 18 years and over for all States and Territories except Victoria, Queensland and Tasmania where the population used is persons aged 17 and over (see Explanatory Notes, paragraph 7).
- **17** Rates for the Indigenous adult population in this publication are based on revised projections for 30 June 2000 (refer *Experimental Projections of the Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander Population 30 June 1996 to 30 June 2006* (Cat. no. 3231.0)). These projections are in turn based on the results of the 1996 Census of Population and Housing.
- **18** Two series of these projections have been published. The so-called 'higher series' takes into account a possible change in propensity for people to identify themselves as Indigenous since the last Population Census and estimates this from the last inter-censal period. The lower series assumes no such change has taken place since 1996. The lower of the two series was used in calculating rates for the Indigenous adult population in this publication. This is because, after discussions with representatives of Corrective Services agencies, it was felt that the propensity to identify as Indigenous has not increased to the same extent in the prison environment as might have occurred in the wider community.
- **19** Rates for the total adult prisoner population are calculated using the Estimated Resident Population (ERP) for each of the States and Territories (refer *Population by Age and Sex, Australian States and Territories* (Cat. no. 3201.0)). As the population changes over time the denominator used for the calculation of rates will vary, depending on the reference period. Rates for the March and June quarters in 1997 used ERP for their respective quarters. From the September quarter 1997 to the March quarter 1998 ERP for the September quarter 1997 was used. All subsequent rates were calculated using ERP for two quarters prior to their respective quarters. Thus for the September quarter 2000, ERP for the March quarter 2000 was used in the calculation of rates. This approach uses the latest ERP available at the time of publication.
- **20** The ratio of imprisonment rates of Indigenous persons to non-Indigenous persons is calculated by dividing the Indigenous imprisonment rate for each period and State or Territory by the corresponding non-Indigenous imprisonment rate.

RATES AND RATIOS continued

- **21** The ratio indicates the extent to which the imprisonment rates of Indigenous persons exceed the imprisonment rates of non-Indigenous persons. A ratio of 20.0 indicates that, for the given State or Territory, the imprisonment rate of Indigenous persons per 100,000 adult population is 20 times that of the imprisonment rate of non-Indigenous persons.
- **22** In some instances Indigenous rates and ratios have not been published. Where this occurs, the cell concerned contains the symbol 'n.p.' This happens where, firstly, the number of persons in custody is less than 10, and secondly, where the population on which the rate is calculated is less than 5,000. This has been done because such rates and ratios vary widely from month to month with small variations in numbers of persons, and therefore may give an inaccurate reflection of the relative involvement of Indigenous persons in custody.

APPENDIX Interpretation of Indigenous Statistics

INTRODUCTION

Tables 5 and 6 in this publication provide nationally comparable statistics on imprisonment of Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander (Indigenous) people. There are a number of issues that bear on the statistical measures of Indigenous imprisonment. This technical appendix provides advice on how these statistics should be interpreted.

NUMBERS

The first and most basic measure of Indigenous imprisonment is the *number of persons imprisoned*. Imprisoned persons are classified as Indigenous if they identify themselves as Aboriginal or Torres Strait Islander at the time they are received into prison custody. These statistics in *Corrective Services Australia* are derived from administrative records held by corrective services agencies in each jurisdiction. The accuracy of the Indigenous component of the statistics is dependent upon the quality of the information collected by these agencies.

PROPORTIONS

The second measure is the Indigenous *proportion of the prisoner population*. This relates the number of Indigenous persons in custody to the total number of persons in custody, and provides a basis for comparing the composition of the prison population across jurisdictions.

RATES

The third measure of Indigenous imprisonment provided in *Corrective Services Australia* is the *rate of imprisonment*, that is; the number of Indigenous prisoners per 100,000 adults in the Indigenous population. The number of persons imprisoned in any jurisdiction is partly a function of the size of the population in that jurisdiction. All other things being equal, a jurisdiction such as the Northern Territory with a large Indigenous population will have a larger number of Indigenous prisoners than a jurisdiction such as Tasmania with a small Indigenous population. The rate of imprisonment provides a basis for comparing the relative likelihood that any Indigenous adult in a State or Territory will be imprisoned.

RATIOS

The fourth measure of Indigenous imprisonment is the *ratio of Indigenous to non-Indigenous imprisonment*. Australian States and Territories have widely varying rates of imprisonment and the likelihood that any Indigenous adult will be imprisoned is partly a function of the overall likelihood of imprisonment. This ratio provides a measure of how much more likely it is that an Indigenous adult in a particular jurisdiction will be imprisoned compared with his or her non-Indigenous counterparts.

Corrective services custody	Confinement in a place intended primarily for the purpose of confining prisoners, such as a prison, prison farm, Periodic Detention Centre or Community Custody Centre.			
Community-based corrections	This refers to the community-based management of court-ordered sanctions, post-prison administrative arrangements and fine conversions for offenders, which principally involve the provision of one or more of the following activities: supervision, programmes or community work.			
Federal sentenced prisoner	Persons charged and sentenced under a Commonwealth statute. For the purposes of this publication Federal sentenced prisoners are those persons who are recognised by the Criminal Law Division of the Commonwealth Attorney-General's Department as having been charged and sentenced under a Commonwealth statute. Federal sentenced prisoners are counted by the State or Territory in which they were sentenced, not where they were held in custody.			
Fine default only	A sentence type indicating that, at the time, the prisoner is serving a sentence for default of a fine and nothing else.			
Full-time custody	A type of custody where a prisoner is required to be held in custody on a full-time basis.			
Indigenous prisoner	A prisoner who identifies as either Aboriginal or Torres Strait Islander.			
Legal status	The legal status of an offender reflects the warrant(s) or court order(s) which provide the legal basis for the detention in custody of the offender.			
Open custody	A custodial regime for managing prisoners which does not require them to be confined by a secure perimeter physical barrier, irrespective of whether a physical barrier exists.			
Other sentenced	A sentence type indicating that, at the time, a person is serving a sentence other than, or in addition to, a fine default sentence.			
Periodic detention	A type of custody or order where a sentenced prisoner is required to be held in custody for two consecutive days in a one-week period.			
Prisoner	A person held in custody. For the purposes of this collection, prisoners are those whose confinement is the responsibility of a corrective services agency.			
Reparation	Reparation refers to all offenders with a community service order or fine option that requires them to undertake unpaid work.			
Restricted movement	This refers to offenders who are subject to a system of restricted movement including supervision and/or electronic monitoring.			
Secure custody	A custodial regime for managing prisoners that requires them to be confined by a secure physical barrier.			
Sentenced	A legal status indicating that a person has received a custodial order from a court in response to a conviction for a criminal offence.			

Sentenced prisoner reception

Includes persons who enter corrective services custody from the community, having received a sentence of imprisonment as an outcome of a court proceeding. It also includes persons who are sentenced to custody while in custody on remand (i.e. change status from a remand to a sentenced prisoner). Sentenced prisoners in custody who receive a further sentence of imprisonment are not counted as sentenced receptions.

Two types of sentenced prisoner reception are distinguished:

- A fine default only reception is a sentenced reception where a person enters custody as a result of defaulting on the payment of a fine.
- An other sentenced reception is a sentenced reception (including changes of status from unsentenced to sentenced) for anything other than a fine default only reception.

Note that Victorian reception figures do not include prisoners who change status from unsentenced to sentenced in the period.

Supervision (compliance)

This includes community-based orders other than those categorised as restricted movement or reparation (e.g. parole, bail and sentenced probation).

Unsentenced

A legal status indicating that a person is confined to custody while awaiting the outcome of their trial. Some sentenced prisoners are also remanded in custody, i.e. are unsentenced, in relation to other offences pending a court hearing. In such cases, these prisoners are counted as sentenced.
