From July 1998 there has been a change to the value threshold used in the statistical processing of import entries. Individual transaction lines (within an import consignment) where the value of the goods is less than $\$ 250$ are no longer processed and are therefore excluded from merchandise import statistics. For details of the impact of this change on merchandise imports statistics see the June quarter issue of this publication. Aggregate imports on a balance of payments basis are not affected by this change.

Revisions since the last issue of this publication have:

- increased total exports for the June quarter 1998 by $\$ 26$ million, and increased total exports for the year ended June 1998 by $\$ 30$ million;
- decreased total imports for the June quarter 1998 by $\$ 13$ million; and decreased total imports for the year ended June 1998 by $\$ 15$ million; and
- decreased the merchandise trade deficit for the June quarter 1998 by $\$ 38$ million; and decreased the merchandise trade deficit for the year ended June 1998 by $\$ 45$ million.

These revisions resulted from generally small changes to a large number of commodities and countries, with no significant contributor.

## QUARTERLY ANALYSISAND COMMENTS

EXCESS OF MERCHANDISE EXPORTS OR IMPORTS

In the September quarter 1998 merchandise imports exceeded merchandise exports by $\$ 2,806$ million, a $\$ 2,127$ million increase in the merchandise trade deficit recorded in the June quarter 1998.

Australia's trade with its major trading partners produced surpluses with:

- Japan, up $\$ 15$ million (2\%) to $\$ 999$ million;
- New Zealand, down $\$ 19$ million (4\%) to $\$ 472$ million;
- Republic of Korea, down $\$ 3$ million (1\%) to $\$ 467$ million;
- Taiwan, down $\$ 161$ million (36\%) to $\$ 281$ million; and
- United Kingdom, up $\$ 482$ million (102\%) to $\$ 10$ million.

Deficits were recorded with:

- USA, up $\$ 335$ million ( $11 \%$ ) to $\$ 3,363$ million;
- Germany, up $\$ 130$ million ( $12 \%$ ) to $\$ 1,186$ million; and
- China, up $\$ 538$ million $(218 \%)$ to $\$ 785$ million.

Merchandise exports for September quarter 1998 were $\$ 22,827$ million, down $\$ 49$ million or $0.2 \%$ on the previous quarter.

MERCHANDISE EXPORTS

The export commodity groups recording significant increases on the previous quarter were:

- commodities and transactions not classified elsewhere in the SITC, up $\$ 261$ million (9\%) to $\$ 3,169$ million (due mainly to increased exports of non-monetary gold);
- mineral fuels, lubricants and related materials, up $\$ 126$ million ( $3 \%$ ) to $\$ 3,929$ million (due mainly to increased exports of petroleum, petroleum products and related materials);
- food and live animals, up $\$ 82$ million ( $2 \%$ ) to $\$ 3,821$ million (due mainly to increased exports of meat and meat preparations; and vegetables and fruit); and
- miscellaneous manufactured articles, up $\$ 76$ million ( $10 \%$ ) to $\$ 862$ million (due mainly to increased exports of professional, scientific and controlling instruments and apparatus, n.e.s.; and photographic aparatus, equipment and supplies and optical goods, n.e.s.; watches and clocks);

Decreases were recorded for machinery and transport equipment, down $\$ 501$ million (17\%) to $\$ 2,528$ million (due mainly to decreased exports of transport equipment); and crude materials, inedible, except fuels, down $\$ 230$ million (5\%) to $\$ 4,458$ million (due mainly to decreased exports of textile fibres and their wastes).

In the September quarter 1998 the major export destinations for Australia's goods were:

- Japan, up $\$ 167$ million (4\%) to $\$ 4,457$ million;
- USA, down $\$ 151$ million ( $7 \%$ ) to $\$ 2,129$ million;
- Republic of Korea, down $\$ 66$ million (4\%) to $\$ 1,609$ million;
- United Kingdom, up $\$ 614$ million ( $64 \%$ ) to $\$ 1,570$ million;
- New Zealand, up $\$ 65$ million ( $5 \%$ ) to $\$ 1,475$ million;
- Taiwan, down $\$ 59$ million (5\%) to $\$ 1,073$ million;
- China, up $\$ 18$ million ( $2 \%$ ) to $\$ 940$ million; and
- Hong Kong, down $\$ 86$ million (9\%) to $\$ 840$ million.

Merchandise imports for September quarter 1998 were $\$ 25,633$ million, up $\$ 2,079$ million, or $9 \%$ on the previous quarter.

The import commodity groups recording significant increases on the previous quarter were:

- miscellaneous manufactured articles, up $\$ 770$ million (23\%) to $\$ 4,174$ million (due mainly to increased imports of miscellaneous manufactured articles, n.e.s.; articles of apparel and clothing accessories; and footwear);
- machinery and transport equipment, up $\$ 613$ million ( $6 \%$ ) to $\$ 11,680$ million (due mainly to increased imports of transport equipment, excluding road vehicles; and general industrial machinery and equipment, n.e.s. and machine parts, n.e.s.; which were partly offset by decreased imports of office machines and automatic data processing machines);
- manufactured goods classified chiefly by material, up $\$ 302$ million (10\%) to $\$ 3,453$ million (due mainly to increased imports of textile yarn, fabrics, made-up articles, n.e.s., and related products; paper, paperboard, and articles of paper pulp; and manufactures of metals); and
- mineral fuels, lubricants and related materials, up $\$ 185$ million (21\%) to $\$ 1,076$ million (due mainly to increased imports of petroleum, petroleum products and related materials).

In the September quarter 1998 the major sources for Australian imports were:

- USA, up $\$ 185$ million ( $3 \%$ ) to $\$ 5,492$ million;
- Japan, up $\$ 152$ million ( $5 \%$ ) to $\$ 3,458$ million;
- China, up $\$ 557$ million ( $48 \%$ ) to $\$ 1,726$ million;
- Germany, up $\$ 148$ million ( $10 \%$ ) to $\$ 1,561$ million;
- UK, up $\$ 131$ million ( $9 \%$ ) to $\$ 1,560$ million;
- Indonesia, up $\$ 289$ million ( $33 \%$ ) to $\$ 1,154$ million;
- Republic of Korea, down $\$ 63$ million ( $5 \%$ ) to $\$ 1,142$ million; and
- New Zealand, up $\$ 84$ million ( $9 \%$ ) to $\$ 1,003$ million.

EXCESS OF MERCHANDISE EXPORTS OR IMPORTS

MERCHANDISE EXPORTS

For the year ended September 1998 merchandise imports exceeded merchandise exports by $\$ 5,413$ million, a turnaround of $\$ 5,937$ million from the surplus recorded for the previous year.

Australia's trade with its major trading partners produced deficits with:

- USA, up $\$ 601$ million ( $5 \%$ ) to $\$ 12,472$ million;
- Germany, up $\$ 728$ million (21\%) to $\$ 4,208$ million;
- China, up $\$ 1,232$ million (193\%) to $\$ 1,869$ million; and
- UK, down $\$ 945$ million (34\%) to $\$ 1,842$ million.

Surpluses were recorded with:

- Japan, down $\$ 588$ million ( $11 \%$ ) to $\$ 4,641$ million;
- Republic of Korea, down $\$ 2,372$ million (54\%) to $\$ 2,010$ million;
- New Zealand, down $\$ 564$ million ( $23 \%$ ) to $\$ 1,896$ million; and
- Taiwan, up $\$ 231$ million (20\%) to $\$ 1,385$ million.

Merchandise exports for the year ended September 1998 were $\$ 89,069$ million, up $\$ 7,599$ million or $9 \%$ on the previous year

The exports commodity groups recording significant increases on the previous year were:

- commodities and transactions not classified elsewhere in the SITC, up \$4,040 million (63\%) to $\$ 10,435$ million (due mainly to increased exports of non-monetary gold);
- crude materials, inedible, except fuels, up $\$ 1,622$ million ( $10 \%$ ) to $\$ 17,918$ million (due mainly to increased exports of metalliferous ores and metal scrap);
- mineral fuels, lubricants and related materials, up $\$ 1,066$ million (7\%) to $\$ 15,472$ million (due mainly to increased exports of coal, coke and briquettes); and
- manufactured goods classified chiefly by material, up $\$ 1,194$ million (13\%) to $\$ 10,690$ million (due mainly to increased exports of non-ferrous metals; and iron and steel).

Merchandise imports for the year ended September 1998 were $\$ 94,482$ million, up $\$ 13,536$ million or $17 \%$ on the previous year.

The imports commodity groups recording significant increases on the previous year were:

- machinery and transport equipment, up \$5,939 million (16\%) to \$43,514 million (due mainly to increased imports of road vehicles, including air-cushion vehicles; general industrial machinery and equipment, n.e.s. and machine parts, n.e.s.; and office machines and automatic data processing machines);
- miscellaneous manufactured articles, up $\$ 2,463$ million (21\%) to $\$ 14,228$ million (due mainly to increased imports of miscellaneous manufactured articles, n.e.s.; articles of apparel and clothing accessories; and professional, scientific and controlling instruments and apparatus, n.e.s.); and
- commodities and transactions n.e.c. in the SITC, up $\$ 2,170$ million (296\%) to $\$ 2,903$ million (due mainly to increased imports of non-monetary gold).

Decreases were recorded for mineral fuels, lubricants and related materials, down $\$ 1,041$ million (19\%) to $\$ 4,302$ (due mainly to decreased imports of petroleum, petroleum products and related materials); and animal and vegetable oils, fats and waxes, down $\$ 17$ million (6\%) to $\$ 255$ million.

- USA, up $\$ 2,773$ million ( $16 \%$ ) to $\$ 20,655$ million;

## BILATERAL MERCHANDISE TRADE STATISTICS RECONCILIATION: AUSTRALIA AND THE EUROPEAN UNION, 1992 TO 1997

INTRODUCTION

DATA SOURCE

COMPARISON BEFORE RECONCILIATION

The Australian Bureau of Statistics (ABS) and the Statistical Office of the European Communities (Eurostat) have recently undertaken a bilateral reconciliation study covering merchandise trade flows between Australia and the European Union (EU). The reconciliation exercise was initiated by Eurostat and was carried out for the period 1992 to 1997. The ABS acknowledges Eurostat's significant contribution to this study.

If viewed as a single market, the EU is Australia's largest trading partner for imports and the second largest for exports. In the year ended December 1997 Australia's recorded imports from the EU were valued at $\$ 20.3$ billion, which represented $24 \%$ of Australia's total imports. The EU country which was the major source of Australia's imports for 1997 was Germany (\$4.7 billion). In the same period, Australia's recorded exports to the EU amounted to $\$ 8.7$ billion, accounting for $10 \%$ of Australia's total exports. The EU countries which were the main destinations for Australian exports were the United Kingdom and Italy ( $\$ 2.4$ billion and $\$ 1.6$ billion respectively).
From the EU perspective, Australia is much less significant as a trading partner. In 1997, trade with Australia accounted for $2 \%$ of total EU exports and $1 \%$ of EU imports.

The purpose of this reconciliation was to identify and explain, to the extent possible, any discrepancies existing in the recording of trade flows between Australia and the EU.

Detailed merchandise trade data, based on Customs documentation, were provided to Eurostat by the ABS for all calendar years from 1992 to 1997. These data were compared with data from Comext, the EU trade database.

Data exchanged were at the most detailed commodity level. Both the EU and Australia base their commodity classifications on the international Harmonised System, so at the 6 digit level the data could be expected to be comparable. However, Australia's method of concealing confidential data, which involves removing it from the relevant code and regrouping it in chapter 99 , limits comparability at the commodity level.
The EU export data were valued on a 'free on board' (FOB) basis and their import data on a 'cost, insurance and freight' (CIF) basis while Australian data for both exports and imports were valued using an FOB based valuation method.

The currency used in the reconciliation study was United States dollars. Both Australia and the EU converted exports and import values to US dollars on the basis of an average annual exchange rate. The rates used to convert Australian data were $\$$ US1 $=$ \$A1.3616 for 1992, \$US1 = \$A1.4789 for 1993, \$US1 = \$A1.3736 for 1994, \$US1 = $\$$ A1.3554 for $1995, \$$ US1 = \$A1.2830 for 1996 and $\$$ US1 = \$A1.3479 for 1997. For the purposes of this article, all figures have been reconverted to Australian dollars.

## Northbound trade

Table A shows the value of Australian exports to the EU and EU imports from Australia. The value of EU recorded imports exceeded that of Australian recorded exports by at least $10 \%$ in all years from 1992 to 1997 except 1993 and 1996. In 1993 the value of Australian recorded exports was 4\% higher than the EU recorded imports in 1993, while in 1996 the EU recorded imports were $2 \%$ higher than Australian recorded exports.
EU import figures are expected to be significantly higher than Australian export figures since the cost of overseas freight and insurance is included in EU import values but excluded from Australian export values. Data for all years except 1993 and 1996 were broadly in line with this expectation.

## Southbound trade

Table B shows the value of Australian imports from the EU and EU exports to Australia. For southbound trade both the EU and Australia use similar valuation methods. The percentage difference between EU exports and Australian imports ranged from close to nil in 1992 to $4 \%$ in 1995 and 1996. The stability and small magnitude of this difference suggests that for southbound trade the data are likely to be relatively reliable.

## Balance of trade

The balance of trade is shown in Table C. Both the Australian and the EU figures indicate the same trend, a steady increase in the surplus for the EU and the deficit for Australia until 1996, followed by a slight decrease for 1997. The maximum discrepancy amounts to about \$A1.6 billion in 1995.

## Summary

In summary, the initial comparison of EU and Australian data indicated that the data line up fairly well, with the exception of 1993 and 1996 northbound data. It was decided therefore to limit the reconciliation work to northbound trade, with the main aim being to understand the underlying reasons for the distortions in the 1993 and 1996 data.

The reconciliation for northbound trade was carried out by quantifying and adjusting for conceptual and methodological differences in recording and then investigating any major coverage or quality deficiencies in the statistics produced by each agency. Australia's main trading partners within the EU were also consulted by Eurostat to identify potential sources of discrepancies and to investigate particular discrepancies.

This section outlines possible sources of discrepancies and provides a description of the associated adjustments made. It was not possible to adjust for all the sources of discrepancies listed below. This was partly because of the short time available to complete the exercise, and partly because some data were either not available or could only be collated at high cost.

CONCEPTUAL AND METHODOLOGICAL DIFFERENCES continued

For more detailed information on the possible causes of differences between the exports of one country and the imports of the other, see the article Bilateral Merchandise Trade Statistics Reconciliation: Australia and the United States of America, 1991 to 1994 which was published in the September Quarter 1996 issue of this publication.

TRADE SYSTEMS The EU trade data are recorded on a 'special trade' basis, while Australian data are on a 'general trade' basis. The main difference between the two systems relates to the treatment of warehouse trade. When Australia declares an export to a warehouse located in the EU, no import is declared by the EU until the imported goods are released for free circulation or consumption. Discrepancies may therefore occur due to the time lag between warehouse inflows and outflows. In addition, if Australian goods exported to an EU warehouse were re-exported to a non-EU country the related import would never be declared by the EU. No information was available on these transactions, so no adjustment was made. However, the discrepancies arising from the use of differing trade systems are not likely to be significant.

COVERAGE International trade statistics measure, in principle, all goods that add to (imports) or subtract from (exports) a nation's stock of material resources. In practice both Australia and the EU rely on data collected by national Customs agencies as the primary source of their statistics, and some goods that fall within the scope of merchandise trade are omitted as customs entries are not required.

After comparing the goods excluded from each country's statistics, the following were identified as possible causes of discrepancy in the data on northbound trade.

## Low value trade

In Australia, individual transaction lines within an export consignment where the value of the goods is less than $\$$ A500 are excluded. In addition, exported parcel post items valued under \$A2,000 are excluded. In the EU, the Member States apply a transaction threshold of 800 ECU (approximately $\$ \mathrm{~A} 1,400$ ) for both exports and imports. However, not all EU traders apply these thresholds; traders who declare their trade electronically often find it simpler to declare all transactions regardless of their value. No adjustments have been made for the differing thresholds as they are likely to have little influence on the overall discrepancies.

## Military material

Most military goods are included in Australia's trade statistics, although certain materials under inter-governmental agreements for defence and similar projects are excluded. The EU Member States of France, Greece and Portugal excluded military goods from their trade statistics in the period covered by the reconciliation exercise. Military goods trade is included and supplied to Eurostat by the other 12 EU Member States, however this data cannot be released due to confidentiality restrictions. Trade in military goods was therefore unable to be reconciled, but is not likely to be significant.

## Repairs

Australian merchandise trade figures exclude repair trade while the EU includes repair trade. Although nine of the EU Member States can separately identify data on repairs, this information was not available to Eurostat by partner country, so no adjustment was able to be made.

VALUATION In accordance with international recommendations, Australia values its exports on a 'free on board' (FOB) transactions value basis, while the EU values its imports on a 'cost, insurance and freight' (CIF) basis. As discussed briefly above, the difference between the two valuation methods is significant. The EU does not collect separate information on the freight and insurance component, so this was estimated for the purposes of the reconciliation using annual conversion rates calculated by the German Central Bank. As expected, the resulting valuation adjustments accounted for a large component of the northbound discrepancy. The following table shows the conversion rates used and the adjustments made.

COUNTRY CLASSIFICATION Australia classifies its exports by country of final destination and the EU classifies its imports by country of origin. Classification of exports by country of final destination can be a difficult task as the exporter is sometimes not in a position to know whether the goods are to be further manufactured or otherwise consumed in the country to which they are consigned, or whether they will be traded with yet another country. When the country of final destination is not known at the time of exportation, the exporter declares the country of last shipment (country of consignment) in place of the country of final destination.

Exports and imports statistics can be expected to be symmetrical between trading partners only when exports are shipped directly from the country of origin to the country of final destination. Discrepancies occur when third countries are involved, as with re-exports of merchandise and goods traded through intermediate countries.

In the case of northbound trade, the following adjustments were applied to adjust for differences in country attribution principles.

Goods which are imported by Australia and are subsequently re-exported to the EU should be recorded in Australia's exports to the EU but not in the EU's imports from Australia. Consequently, for data reconciliation purposes, the value of Australia's re-exports to the EU needs to be subtracted from Australia's export statistics. These adjustments are shown in the table below. If some of these transactions have been recorded in the EU's import statistics as originating in Australia, this adjustment may be overstated. It is also possible that some re-export transactions have not been recorded as such in Australia's export statistics. In this case the adjustment shown may understate the actual value of adjustment needed.

## EU indirect imports

When the EU imports goods of Australian origin from a country other than Australia, they will be included in the EU's imports from Australia, but will generally not be included in Australia's exports to the EU. This assumes that the Australian exporter is unaware of the subsequent movement. However, in some instances the Australian exporter will be aware of the ultimate destination of the goods and these transactions will be included in Australia's exports to the EU. It is impossible to distinguish between these two circumstances.

In the reconciliation the EU indirect import adjustment which is shown in the table below has been calculated based on data provided by France, the Netherlands, Germany, Italy and the United Kingdom. These trading partners together account for approximately $80 \%$ of total EU imports from Australia. While the indirect imports of the remaining EU member states are excluded, this understatement of the adjustment is offset, at least to some degree, by the fact that some of the EU indirect imports would undoubtedly be already included in Australian exports to the EU.

The large increase in indirect imports in 1996 was mainly due to indirect imports declared by Italy. Most of the increase relates to non-monetary gold imported from Australia by Italy via Switzerland. In Australian statistics, this gold was shown as having been exported to Switzerland.

## EU re-imports

Re-imports are goods originally exported which are imported to the originating country in either the same condition in which they were exported or after undergoing repair or minor operations which leave them essentially unchanged.

Goods of EU origin that have been re-imported into the EU from Australia are included in EU imports from Australia. In Australian statistics these goods would be recorded as re-exports to the EU, and would have been removed from the reconciliation as part of the re-export adjustment. A further adjustment is therefore necessary to ensure treatment of these transactions is comparable. The EU re-imports adjustments, which are presented below, were calculated using data from France, the Netherlands, Germany, Italy and the United Kingdom.

## Rotterdam effect

EU imports from third countries are attributed to the EU Member State where the goods are released for free circulation or consumption.

When Australia exports goods to the EU, the declared country of final destination may in some cases not coincide with the country where these goods are released for free circulation. Such cases result in discrepancies between Australia and the specific EU Member States involved. Eurostat noted that in the Australian statistics, exports to the EU are often attributed to the Member State where the port of discharge is located, rather than the Member State of final destination. This particular mismatch is referred to 'the Rotterdam effect' because of the importance of Rotterdam as a transit port. Such flows have a significant impact on the mirror results between Australia and the individual EU Member States but not between Australia and the EU as a whole.

TIMING The issue of timing can impact on the comparability of trade statistics. Given the geographic distance between Australia and the European Union, there is a time lag between when a shipment departs from Australia and when it arrives in an EU Member State. This time lag for sea cargo is approximately 31 days, which means that a shipment departing by sea from Australia in December would be recorded in different calendar years by Australia and the EU. In addition, the time necessary to establish the Customs declaration could increase this delay and in some cases the time lag could be about two months. In the reconciliation, the timing adjustment has been calculated by reassigning the portion of monthly EU trade shipped by sea from Australia to the previous calendar month (goods transported by sea account for $65 \%$ to $80 \%$ of total annual trade over the period from 1992 to 1997).

EXCHANGE RATE The conversion of reported data to a common currency by using an annual exchange rate can contribute to data discrepancies. Use of monthly rates should provide more accurate results. Adjustments for this were calculated by converting total monthly EU imports and Australian exports to US dollars using monthly rates and comparing the resulting annual totals with the reconciliation data which had been converted using annual rates. The adjustments applied were minor.

DOMESTIC TERRITORY DEFINITION In carrying out a reconciliation study it is important to compare the definition of each partner territory.

Both Australia and the EU use the same definition for the Australian domestic territory in their trade statistics. However, differences exist in the definition of EU territory by Australia and the EU. Australia attributes trade with Andorra to France, with Greenland and Faeroe Islands to Denmark, and with San Marino and Vatican City to Italy. These territories are not, however, included in the EU statistical territory. In addition, the Canary Islands are considered by Australia to be part of Spain, whereas the EU has only included these islands since 1997. The EU has also included the French Overseas Departments (Reunion, Guadeloupe, Martinique and French Guyana) as part of the EU territory since 1997, but these are not included by Australia as part of France. The differences caused by the minor variations in definition of the EU are assumed to be negligible.

OTHER DIFFERENCES Comparison of data at the commodity level identified discrepancies in ships and in non-monetary gold.

Ships and ferries
The reconciliation exercise highlighted several discrepancies in the recording of trade in ships and ferries. In 1992 the United Kingdom declared imports of ships from Australia valued at $\$$ A105 million, while Australian exports under this code only amounted to $\$ \mathrm{~A} 25$ million. According to the information provided by the United Kingdom, these vessels have been declared by UK Customs. It may be the case that some of these did not cross the Australian frontier and as such were not all recorded in Australian exports.

There are also a number of cases of Australian exports of ferries which were not registered in the EU statistics. In 1996 Australia recorded exports of four ferries to the United Kingdom and one to Germany which were not recorded in EU imports. The EU records an import of a ship only if it is purchased by a resident from a non-resident. It is quite possible that although these vessels are operating within the EU they are owned by foreign companies. Adjustments have been made to account for these ferries.

## Non-monetary gold

In accordance with UN recommendations, both Australia and the EU include trade in non-monetary gold in their statistics. However, Australian exports of non-monetary gold in unwrought and semi-manufactured forms to the United Kingdom were significantly higher than the United Kingdom's imports from Australia over the studied period. Based on an investigation conducted by Eurostat, this trade appears to be non-monetary gold. Consequently, an adjustment has been made to EU imports for the difference between Australian exports and the United Kingdom's imports of this gold.

The results of the reconciliation study are shown in the tables below. All the adjustments to northbound trade discussed above have been applied to either the Australian export values (Table M) or the EU import values (Table N). It should be noted however that the adjustments do not represent revisions to previously published statistics. In most cases they merely reflect the conceptual and methodological differences underlying the compilation of the data.

For each of the years studied, the CIF/FOB adjustment on EU imports was the most significant adjustment, accounting for approximately $8 \%$ of the total value of EU imports.
The residual discrepancy for northbound trade is shown in Table O-this is the discrepancy that remains between the two sets of figures after all the conceptual and other adjustments have been made. For the years 1992, 1994, 1995 and 1997 the residual discrepancies are significantly lower than the initial discrepancies shown in Table A. For 1993 there is no change in the residual discrepancy and for 1996 the residual discrepancy is $-3 \%$, compared with an initial discrepancy of $+2 \%$.

NORTHBOUND TRADE, After Reconciliation



Table P shows the balance of trade after making the adjustments to the northbound data. The effect of the reconciliation on the trade balances was relatively small. After reconciliation, the maximum discrepancy is $\$$ A1.0 billion, in 1995 . Readers should note that there has been no investigation into discrepancies in recorded southbound trade, because they were relatively minor. However, such investigations may have resulted in smaller balance of trade discrepancies.

The reconciliation study has demonstrated that a significant part of the 'asymmetry' in the EU-Australia bilateral merchandise trade data results from the conceptual factors underlying the compilation of the data. As previously indicated, the adjustments presented in the reconciliation do not represent revisions to the official published statistics of either trading partner, nor do they imply in general, errors in either partner's published statistics.

For southbound trade, the initial discrepancies were stable and small in magnitude. Reconciliation work therefore concentrated on northbound trade where the initial discrepancy ranged from -4 to $+13 \%$ of Australian exports. After adjustments the residual discrepancy ranged from -4 to $+3 \%$ of Australia's exports. The greatest contributor to the narrowing of the gap was the adjustment relating to insurance and freight, which are included in published EU imports statistics, but not in Australian exports. The other major contributing factor for calendar years 1993 and 1996 were several adjustments made to account for transactions which had not been included in the EU statistics.

The small magnitude of the residual discrepancy encourages a reasonable level of confidence in the accuracy of Australian and EU data, at least at the aggregate level. At detailed levels it is more difficult to make comparisons. This is partly because of Australia's treatment of confidential data which can affect comparability at all levels of the commodity classification; and partly because of the Rotterdam effect which makes it difficult to compare Australian and EU data by EU Member State.

Further reconciliation studies with the EU are not planned at this stage. However, more targeted reconciliation studies may be considered based on specific user requests.

INTRODUCTION
RELATIONSHIP TO BALANCE OF
PAYMENTS STATISTICS

1 This publication contains quarterly statistics of Australia's merchandise trade with its major trading partners and selected country groups.

2 The merchandise export and import statistics in this publication are compiled in broad agreement with the United Nations' recommendations for the compilation of international trade statistics. The paragraphs below briefly describe the concepts and methods used in their compilation.

3 The basic source of balance of payments data on goods exports and imports is 'international merchandise trade statistics'. However, because of conceptual differences, various coverage, timing and (imports only) valuation adjustments are necessary before international trade statistics can be put on a balance of payments basis. For more information on the relationship between international merchandise trade statistics and balance of payments statistics on merchandise trade see Chapter 6 of Balance of Payments, Australia: Summary of Concepts, Sources and Methods (5351.0).

4 International merchandise trade statistics are compiled by the Australian Bureau of Statistics from information submitted by exporters and importers or their agents to the Australian Customs Service (ACS).

5 Merchandise trade covers all movable goods which add to (imports) or subtract from (exports) the stock of material resources in Australia.

## Excluded are:

- direct transit trade, i.e. goods being trans-shipped or moved through Australia for purposes of transport only;
- ships and aircraft moving through Australia while engaged in the transport of passengers or goods between Australia and other countries; and
- non-merchandise goods, consisting primarily of goods moving on a temporary basis (e.g. mobile equipment; goods under repair; goods for exhibition; and passengers' effects).

6 The United Nations' recommendations for the compilation of merchandise trade statistics recognise that the basic source used by most compiling countries-the customs record-will not be able to capture certain transactions. In Australia the following types of goods which fall within the scope of merchandise trade, are excluded because customs entries are not required:

- migrants' and passengers' effects exported or imported; and
- parcel post exports for values not exceeding $\$ 2000$ and parcel post imports for values not exceeding $\$ 1000$.


## For exports only:

- sales of aircraft (and parts or components) which were imported into Australia prior to 1 July 1987 for use on overseas routes;
- fish and other sea products landed abroad directly from the high seas by Australian ships; and
- from 1 July 1986 individual transaction lines (within an export consignment) where the value of the goods is less than $\$ 500$. Prior to that date, the value level was $\$ 250$.

For imports only:

- bunkers, aviation fuel and stores supplied abroad to Australian ships and aircraft;
- prior to 1 July 1987 the delivery of certain ships and aircraft (and parts and components) intended for use on overseas routes; and
- consignments screened free or entered on informal clearance documents (ICDs) for values not exceeding $\$ 250$ are excluded. From July 1998 individual transactions lines (within a formally entered import consignment) where the value of goods is less than $\$ 250$ are not processed by ABS and are excluded from import statistics.
In addition, although merchandise trade statistics should include illegal transactions, such as smuggled goods, these transactions are omitted as there is no practical way to collect this information.

7 The merchandise trade statistics in this publication are recorded on a general trade basis, i.e. exports include both Australian produce and re-exports, and imports comprise goods entered directly for home consumption together with goods imported into bonded warehouses.

8 Australian produce is defined as goods, materials or articles which have been produced or manufactured in Australia. Processing and assembly operations that leave imported components and products essentially unchanged are not considered as production or manufacture.
9 Re-exports are defined as goods, materials or articles originally imported into Australia which are exported in the same condition or after undergoing minor operations (e.g. blending, packaging, bottling, cleaning, husking and shelling) which leave them essentially unchanged. Information on re-exports is shown in Table 25.

10 From January 1988, exports are recorded in the calendar month in which the goods departed from Australia. Prior to January 1988, exports are recorded in the month in which the entries were processed by the ACS. For further details on the impact of the changed compilation basis on the merchandise export series refer to the article 'Changed timing basis for compilation of merchandise exports statistics' in the June 1992 issue of this publication.
11 Imports are generally recorded statistically in the calendar month in which the import entries are finalised by the ACS. Import entries may be lodged early and finalised prior to arrival, or their finalisation may be delayed because of the various validation checks carried out by ACS. Currently, approximately $85 \%$ of total import trade by value shown for a particular month reflects shipments which arrived in that month, while approximately $10 \%$ reflects shipments which arrived during the previous month with the remaining $5 \%$ by value arriving in earlier or later months. For individual commodities these percentages may vary considerably.

12 Occasionally significant delays occur in the lodgement, rather than processing, of import entries. When the affected entries are for significant values, they are recorded statistically in the month that they should have been lodged and finalised.

13 The value of exports is the free on board (f.o.b.) transactions value of the goods expressed in Australian dollars. Goods shipped on consignment are initially valued at the f.o.b. Australian port of shipment equivalent of the current price offering for similar goods of Australian origin in the principal markets of the country to which the goods are despatched for sale. Exporters who do not know the value of the goods at shipment and enter an approximate value must subsequently submit an entry either confirming or revising the estimated return.

14 The value of imports is the Australian Customs Value. Goods are valued at the point of containerisation (in most cases) or the port of shipment, or at the customs frontier of the exporting country, whichever comes first.

15 Changes in Customs valuation introduced from 1 July 1989 with the Customs and Excise Legislation Amendment Act 1989 are likely to have marginally raised Customs valuations. Data for periods from 1 July 1989 are therefore not fully comparable with data for previous periods. However, investigations of imports valuations, for years before and after the change have shown no measurable effect on the valuation of imports that can be attributed to the change in legislation. For details of the changes in legislation see the note 'Change in the Valuation of Imports' at the beginning of the Explanatory Notes of the 1989-90 issue of Foreign Trade, Australia: Comparative and Summary Tables (5410.0).

16 For the purposes of international merchandise trade statistics, a country is defined as a geographical entity which trades, or has the potential to trade, with Australia in accordance with ACS provisions. External territories under Australian administration are treated as separate countries while self-governing territories and dependent territories under the administration of other countries may be treated as individual countries in Australian international merchandise trade statistics.

17 For exports, 'country' refers to the country to which the goods were consigned at the time of export. Where the country of consignment is not known at the time of export, and where it is impossible to determine the destination, goods are recorded as 'Destination Unknown'. Tables 7 and 33 which show exports by country also include the item "Ship and aircraft stores". "Ship and aircraft stores" comprise fuel, food and other goods loaded onto foreign owned vessels and aircraft to be consumed during international journeys.

18 For imports, 'country' refers to the country of origin of the goods, which is defined as the country of production for Customs purposes. Where the country of origin is not known at the time of import and where it is impossible to determine the origin, goods are recorded as 'Origin Unknown'. Goods reported with country of origin 'Australia' (i.e. goods of Australian origin exported and subsequently re-imported) are shown as country 'Australia (Re-imports)' and are included in the Asia Pacific Economic Co-operation country group.

19 Wherever possible, statistics for countries and country groups for all time periods included in this publication reflect the composition of those countries and country groups on the last day of the reference period of this publication. Thus, after the German Democratic Republic and the German Federal Republic were reunited, statistics for all periods both before and after re-unification refer to the combined entity (called Germany in country classified statistics).

20 However, in the case of a country that breaks into a number of component entities, it is not possible to provide data for earlier periods for the new entities. For example, from October 1991, Estonia, Latvia and Lithuania are each separately identified in the statistics, but for earlier periods trade data for these three republics are included indistinguishably in data for the USSR.

21 The country groups shown in this publication are selected economic groups with which Australia trades, namely:

- Asia Pacific Economic Co-operation (APEC);
- Association of South-East Asian Nations (ASEAN);
- Developing Countries (DCs);
- European Union (EU).

22 A list of the countries included in each of the above groups is shown in the Appendix. Country groups may not be mutually exclusive e.g. Indonesia is included in APEC, ASEAN and as a Developing Country. The countries that belong to more than one group are identified with a footnote in the Appendix.

23 More details on the composition of countries identified in these statistics are available from the Classification Manager on Canberra (02) 62525409.

24 Commodity export and import statistics in Tables 9 to 24 of this publication are presented according to the codes and descriptions of the third revision of the United Nations' Standard International Trade Classification (SITC Rev3) with the addition of dummy codes to take account of Australia's treatment of gold coin, whether or not legal tender, and other legal tender coin and confidential items.

25 Tables 31 and 32 of this publication are presented according to the second revision of SITC for 1985-86 to December 1987 and according to SITC Rev3 from January 1988. See Appendix B of the 1988-89 issue of Foreign Trade Australia: Comparative and Summary Tables (5410.0) for details of Divisions significantly affected by this change.

26 State information for exports presented in Table 25 refers to the State in which the final stage of production or manufacture occurs.

27 State information for imports presented in Table 26 refers to the State where imported goods were released from Customs control, also called the State of final destination. The State of final destination is not necessarily the State in which the port of discharge of the goods is located. Goods can be forwarded interstate after discharge either under ACS control or not, but are recorded as being imported into the State where they are released by the ACS.

28 Exports and imports statistics classified by subdivisions of the Australian and New Zealand Standard Industrial Classification (ANZSIC) are shown in Tables 27 and 28. The statistics are compiled by allocating statistical items of the Australian Harmonized Export Commodity Classification (AHECC) and the Harmonized Customs Tariff to the ANZSIC industry of origin based upon the main economic activities of those industries with which the commodities are primarily associated. A full description of ANZSIC classes is contained in the publication Australian and New Zealand Standard Industrial Classification, 1993 Edition (1292.0).

29 Merchandise trade in Tables 29 and 30 are classified according to the categories of the United Nations' Classification By Broad Economic Categories (BEC). The BEC classifies international merchandise trade statistics for the purposes of general economic analysis according to the main end use of the commodities traded. The statistics are compiled by allocating the statistical items of the AHECC and the Harmonized Customs Tariff to the appropriate BEC.
