Revisions since the last issue of this publication have

- decreased total exports for the December quarter 1999 by $\$ 25$ million, and decreased total exports for the year ended December 1999 by $\$ 32$ million;
- increased total imports for the December quarter 1999 by $\$ 1$ million, and decreased total imports for the year ended December 1999 by $\$ 4$ million; and
- increased the merchandise trade deficit for the December quarter 1999 by $\$ 27$ million, and increased the merchandise trade deficit for the year ended December 1999 by $\$ 29$ million.

These revisions resulted from generally small changes to a large number of commodities and countries, with no significant contributor.

## QUARTERLY ANALYSISAND COMMENTS

EXCESS OF MERCHANDISE EXPORTS OR IMPORTS

In the March quarter 2000 merchandise imports exceeded merchandise exports by $\$ 2,547$ million, a $\$ 1,406$ million decrease from the merchandise trade deficit recorded in the December quarter 1999. In the March quarter 2000 merchandise exports fell by $\$ 996$ million and merchandise imports fell by $\$ 2,400$ million.

Australia's trade with its major trading partners produced surpluses with:

- Japan, up $\$ 175$ million ( $15 \%$ ) to $\$ 1,365$ million;
- Republic of Korea, up $\$ 478$ million (81\%) to $\$ 1,066$ million;
- Taiwan, up $\$ 141$ million ( $47 \%$ ) to $\$ 443$ million; and
- New Zealand, down $\$ 637$ million (60\%) to $\$ 424$ million.

Deficits were recorded with:

- USA, down $\$ 112$ million (3\%) to $\$ 3,513$ million;
- Germany, down $\$ 68$ million ( $6 \%$ ) to $\$ 1,116$ million;
- United Kingdom, a reversal of $\$ 909$ million from a surplus to a deficit of $\$ 799$ million; and
- China, down $\$ 264$ million (34\%) to $\$ 505$ million.

Merchandise exports for March quarter 2000 were $\$ 23,835$ million, down $\$ 996$ million or $4 \%$ on the previous quarter.

MERCHANDISE EXPORTS

The export commodity groups recording significant decreases on the previous quarter were:

- machinery and transport equipment, down $\$ 904$ million (27\%) to $\$ 2,529$ million (due mainly to decreased exports of Transport equipment (excluding road vehicles), and Road vehicles (including air-cushion vehicles));
- commodities and transactions n.e.c. in the SITC, down $\$ 367$ million (13\%) to $\$ 2,512$ million (due mainly to decreased exports of Special transactions and commodities not classified according to kind);
- crude materials, inedible, except fuel, down $\$ 220$ million (5\%) to $\$ 4,345$ million (due mainly to decreased exports of Textile fibres and their wastes (not manufactured into yarn or fabric), and Metalliferous ores and metal scrap);
- miscellaneous manufactured articles, down $\$ 93$ million (9\%) to $\$ 913$ million (due mainly to decreased exports of Professional, scientific and controlling instruments and apparatus, n.e.s., and Miscellaneous manufactured articles, n.e.s.); and
- chemical and related products, n.e.s., down $\$ 79$ million (7\%) to $\$ 990$ million (due mainly to decreased exports of Organic chemicals, and Essential oils and resinoids and perfume materials: toilet, polishing and cleansing preparations).
The most significant increase was recorded for mineral fuels, lubricants and related materials, up $\$ 669$ million ( $16 \%$ ) to $\$ 4,803$ million (due mainly to increased exports of Petroleum, petroleum products and related materials (see the feature article on Australia's trade in crude petroleum on page 10)). Increases were also recorded for manufactured goods classified chiefly by material, up $\$ 90$ million (3\%) to \$3,094 million.

In the March quarter 2000 the major export destinations for Australia's goods were:

- Japan, small increase to $\$ 4,685$ million;
- USA, down $\$ 178$ million ( $8 \%$ ) to $\$ 2,191$ million;
- Republic of Korea, up $\$ 257$ million ( $14 \%$ ) to $\$ 2,046$ million;
- New Zealand, down $\$ 774$ million ( $35 \%$ ) to $\$ 1,426$ million;
- China, up $\$ 158$ million (14\%) to $\$ 1,290$ million;
- Taiwan, up $\$ 101$ million ( $9 \%$ ) to $\$ 1,224$ million;
- Singapore, up $\$ 172$ million (17\%) to $\$ 1,191$ million; and
- Hong Kong (SAR of China), up $\$ 71$ million (9\%) to $\$ 887$ million.

Merchandise imports for March quarter 2000 were $\$ 26,383$ million, down $\$ 2,400$ million, or $8 \%$ on the previous quarter.

The import commodity groups recording significant decreases on the previous quarter were:

- machinery and transport equipment, down $\$ 1,437$ million (11\%) to $\$ 12,114$ million (due mainly to decreased imports of Transport equipment (excluding road vehicles), and Road vehicles (including air-cushion vehicles));
- commodities and transactions n.e.c in the SITC, down $\$ 386$ million ( $40 \%$ ) to $\$ 583$ million (due mainly to decreased imports of Gold, non-monetary (excluding gold ores and concentrates));
- mineral fuels, lubricants and related materials, down $\$ 317$ million (16\%) to $\$ 1,624$ million (due mainly to the decreased imports of Petroleum, petroleum products and related materials);
- miscellaneous manufactured articles, down $\$ 215$ million (5\%) to $\$ 3,753$ million (due mainly to decreased imports of Miscellaneous manufactured articles, n.e.s., and Photographic apparatus, equipment and supplies and optical goods, n.e.s.; watches and clocks);
- manufactured goods classified chiefly by material, down $\$ 86$ million ( $3 \%$ ) to $\$ 3,361$ million (due mainly to decreased imports of Paper, paperboard, and articles of paper pulp, of paper or of paperboard, and Teztile yarn, fabrics, made-up articles, n.e.s., and related products);
- food and live animals, down $\$ 61$ million ( $6 \%$ ) to $\$ 1,005$ million (due mainly to increased imports of Fish (not marine mammals), crustaceans, molluscs and aquatic invertebrates, and preparations thereof, Vegetables and fruit, and Cereals and cereal preparations); and
- beverages and tobacco, down $\$ 46$ million ( $23 \%$ ) to $\$ 157$ million (due mainly to decreased exports of Beverages).

The most significant increase was recorded for chemical and related products, n.e.s., up $\$ 146$ million (5\%) to $\$ 3,265$ million (due mainly to increased imports of Organic chemicals, and Fertilisers (excluding crude)). Increases were also recorded for crude materials, inedible, except fuel, up $\$ 5$ million (1\%) to $\$ 454$ million.

In the March quarter 2000 the major sources for Australian imports were:

- USA, down $\$ 290$ million (5\%) to $\$ 5,704$ million;
- Japan, down $\$ 168$ million ( $5 \%$ ) to $\$ 3,320$ million;
- China, down $\$ 107$ million (6\%) to $\$ 1,795$ million;
- United Kingdom, up $\$ 270$ million ( $19 \%$ ) to $\$ 1,672$ million;
- Germany, down $\$ 88$ million ( $6 \%$ ) to $\$ 1,412$ million;
- New Zealand, down $\$ 136$ million ( $12 \%$ ) to $\$ 1,003$ million;
- Republic of Korea, down $\$ 222$ million ( $18 \%$ ) to $\$ 979$ million; and
- Malaysia, down $\$ 77$ million ( $8 \%$ ) to $\$ 894$ million.


## ANNUAL ANALYSISAND COMMENTS

EXCESS OF MERCHANDISE EXPORTS OR IMPORTS

MERCHANDISE EXPORTS

For the year ended March 2000 merchandise imports exceeded merchandise exports by $\$ 13,944$ million, an increase of $\$ 4,954$ million from the deficit recorded for the previous year. For the year ended March 2000 merchandise exports increased by $\$ 2,287$ million and merchandise imports increased by $\$ 7,241$ million.

Australia's trade with its major trading partners produced deficits with:

- USA, up $\$ 385$ million (3\%) to $\$ 13,344$ million;
- Germany, down $\$ 133$ million (3\%) to $\$ 4,490$ million;
- China, up $\$ 514$ million (26\%) to $\$ 2,528$ million; and
- United Kingdom, up $\$ 847$ million ( $85 \%$ ) to $\$ 1,845$ million.

Surpluses were recorded with:

- Japan, up $\$ 322$ million ( $9 \%$ ) to $\$ 3,832$ million;
- Republic of Korea, up $\$ 568$ million (25\%) to $\$ 2,824$ million;
- New Zealand, up $\$ 659$ million ( $35 \%$ ) to $\$ 2,531$ million; and
- Taiwan, down $\$ 55$ million (4\%) to $\$ 1,302$ million.

AUSTRALIA'S ANNUAL TRADE WITH MAJOR COUNTRIES, Excess of exports (+) or imports (-)


Merchandise exports for the year ended March 2000 were $\$ 90,858$ million, up $\$ 2,287$ million or 3\% on the previous year.

The export commodity groups recording significant increases on the previous year were:

- mineral fuels, lubricants and related materials, up $\$ 1,181$ million ( $8 \%$ ) to $\$ 15,917$ million (due mainly to increased exports of Petroleum, petroleum products and related materials);
- manufactured goods classified chiefly by material, up $\$ 1,117$ million (11\%) to $\$ 11,409$ million (due mainly to increased exports of Non-ferrous metal and Non-metallic mineral manufactures, n.e.s.);
- food and live animals, up $\$ 789$ million (5\%) to $\$ 16,224$ million (due mainly to increased exports of Meat and meat preparations, and Fish (not marine mammals), crustaceans, molluscs and aquatic invertebratess, and preparations thereof);
- machinery and transport equipment, up $\$ 523$ million ( $5 \%$ ) to $\$ 11,234$ million (due mainly to increased exports of Road vehicles (including air-cushion vehicles)); and
- chemical and related products, n.e.s., up $\$ 517$ million ( $15 \%$ ) to $\$ 3,991$ million (due mainly to increased exports of Medicinal and pharmaceutical products).

MERCHANDISE EXPORTS continued

The most significant decreases were recorded for commodities and transactions n.e.c. in the SITC, down $\$ 1,560$ million ( $14 \%$ ) to $\$ 9,530$ million (due mainly to decreased exports of Gold, non-monetary (excluding gold ores and concentrates)); crude materials, inedible, except fuel, down $\$ 764$ million (4\%) to $\$ 17,057$ million (due mainly to decreased exports of Metalliferous ores and metal scrap); and animal and vegetable oils, fats and waxes, down $\$ 76$ million (20\%) to $\$ 303$ million (due mainly to decreased exports of Animal oils and fats).

Australia's major export destinations for the year ended March 2000 were:

- Japan, up $\$ 454$ million (3\%) to $\$ 17,510$ million;
- USA, up $\$ 593$ million ( $7 \%$ ) to $\$ 8,834$ million;
- Republic of Korea, up $\$ 346$ million (5\%) to $\$ 6,794$ million;
- New Zealand, up $\$ 981$ million (17\%) to $\$ 6,732$ million;
- Singapore, up $\$ 1,193$ million (36\%) to $\$ 4,482$ million;
- China, up $\$ 460$ million ( $12 \%$ ) to $\$ 4,398$ million;
- Taiwan, up $\$ 66$ million ( $2 \%$ ) to $\$ 4,381$ million; and
- United Kingdom, down $\$ 789$ million (17\%) to $\$ 3,915$ million.

COUNTRY COMPOSITION OF EXPORTS


Merchandise imports for the year ended March 2000 were $\$ 104,802$ million, up $\$ 7,241$ million or 7\% on the previous year.

The imports commodity groups recording significant increases on the previous year were:

- machinery and transport equipment, up \$4,164 million (9\%) to \$49,208 million (due mainly to increased imports of Transport equipment (excluding road vehicles), and Telecommunications and sound recording and reproducing apparatus and equipment);
- mineral fuels, lubricants and related materials, up $\$ 2,190$ million (52\%) to $\$ 6,426$ million (due mainly to increased imports of Petroleum, petroleum products and related materials);
- chemical and related products, n.e.s., up $\$ 796$ million ( $7 \%$ ) to $\$ 12,108$ million (due mainly to increased imports of Organic chemicals, and Medicinal and pharmaceutical products); and
- miscellaneous manufactured articles, up \$288 million (2\%) to \$14,953 million (due mainly to increased imports of Articles of apparel and clothing accessories).

The only decrease was recorded for commodities and transactions n.e.c. in the SITC, down $\$ 727$ million ( $24 \%$ ) to $\$ 2,326$ million (due mainly to decreased imports of Gold, non-monetary (excluding gold ores and concentrates)).

## COMMODITY COMPOSITION (SITC SECTION) OF IMPORTS



Australia's major import sources for the year ended March 2000 were:

- USA, up $\$ 978$ million (5\%) to $\$ 22,178$ million;
- Japan, up $\$ 132$ million ( $1 \%$ ) to $\$ 13,678$ million;
- China, up $\$ 974$ million ( $16 \%$ ) to $\$ 6,926$ million;
- United Kingdom, up $\$ 58$ million (1\%) to $\$ 5,760$ million;
- Germany, down $\$ 358$ million ( $6 \%$ ) to $\$ 5,711$ million;
- Republic of Korea, down $\$ 222$ million (5\%) to $\$ 3,970$ million;
- New Zealand, up $\$ 322$ million (8\%) to $\$ 4,201$ million; and
- Singapore, up $\$ 1,415$ million ( $51 \%$ ) to $\$ 4,182$ million.

## AUSTRALIA'S TRADE IN CRUDE PETROLEUM

Between 1990-91 and 1998-99, the value of exports of crude petroleum remained relatively stable, fluctuating between a low of $\$ 1,350$ million in 1993-94 and a high of $\$ 1,973$ million in 1997-98. Over the same period, the value of imports of crude petroleum rose from $\$ 1,501$ million to $\$ 3,603$ million (a $140 \%$ increase), with a peak of $\$ 3,836$ million in 1996-97.

While positive balances of trade occurred in 1990-91 and 1991-92, the balance of trade in crude petroleum has since been negative in all financial years, reaching a peak deficit of $\$ 2,003$ million in $1998-99$.

GRAPH 1: ANNUAL VALUE OF EXPORTS AND IMPORTS OF CRUDE PETROLEUM


Exports of crude petroleum have decreased as a proportion of total merchandise exports, from a peak of $3.4 \%$ in $1990-91$, to a low of $1.9 \%$ in 1998-99. On the other hand, imports of crude petroleum have increased as a proportion of total merchandise imports, from a low of $3.1 \%$ in 1990-91 and 1991-92, to a peak of 4.9\% in 1996-97.

In recent quarters there has been strong growth in the value of both exports and imports of crude petroleum. Over the four quarters to March quarter 2000, the value of exports of crude petroleum totalled $\$ 3,491$ million, $118 \%$ higher than the 1998-99 total. In the same period, the value of imports of crude petroleum totalled $\$ 5,106$ million, $42 \%$ higher than the 1998-99 total.

The value of imports fell in the March quarter 2000, but remained at an historically high level. In the March quarter 2000, the balance of Australia's merchandise trade in crude petroleum became positive for the first time in its recent history.

Increases in the international oil price are the main determinant for the trends observed. Other factors include the commencement of production from significant new fields, some switching by Australian refineries to source crude petroleum from domestic production rather than imports, and the fall in the exchange rate for the Australian dollar against other currencies.

The unit of quantity used to record trade in crude petroleum is litres. Between 1990-91 and 1998-99 the volume of exports of crude petroleum increased by 3,649 million litres (42\%). Import volumes grew much more strongly over the same period, rising by 19,894 million litres (245\%). In 1990-91, Australia exported more crude petroleum (8,734 million litres) than it imported ( 8,132 million litres). Since that time, the volume of imports on a financial year basis has exceeded that of exports, with the gap generally growing over time.

AVERAGE UNIT VALUES FOR EXPORTS AND IMPORTS

The volume of exports of crude petroleum decreased steadily during the first half of 1999 , before registering strong growth. The March quarter 2000 volume was 5,809 million litres, the highest quarterly figure on record. After being steady for several quarters, the volume of imports of crude petroleum decreased in the March quarter 2000 to 4,792 million litres. This was the lowest quarterly figure since September quarter 1996.

Information on the prices paid and received for exports and imports of crude petroleum is not included on Customs records. However, by dividing the value of exports and imports by the respective trade volumes, a rough price measure (average unit value) can be derived. Use of average unit values calculated in this manner is often subject to a number of serious limitations as a measure of price change over time.
Users who are interested in price movements in export and import commodities should refer to Export Price Index, Australia (Cat. no. 6405.0) or Import Price Index, Australia (Cat. no. 6414.0). These indexes are currently being reviewed and an Information Paper on the review was issued in November 1999 - Information Paper: Review of the Import Price Index and Export Price Index, 1999 (Cat. no. 6424.0).

AVERAGE UNIT VALUES FOR EXPORTS AND IMPORTS continued

In paragraphs 7.13 to 7.15 of the Information Paper the possible uses and limitations of average unit values are discussed. Paragraph 16.13 of the System of National Accounts, 1993 (SNA93) makes similar comments.

Average unit values suffer from limitations as price estimators for commodities that are not homogeneous and are likely to be affected by changes over time in compositional mix or quality. For basic commodities in the mining and agricultural sectors, these limitations are generally considered to be less severe.

The average unit values (cents per litre) for exports and imports of crude petroleum decreased over the period 1990-91 to 1998-99, by $37 \%$ and $30 \%$ respectively. These movements largely reflect changes in international oil prices over this period.

International oil prices increased dramatically during the course of 1999 and this is reflected in the average unit values for quarterly exports and imports during this period. Between March quarter 1999 and March quarter 2000, the average unit value for exports rose from 11.8 to 25.9 cents per litre (119\%). Over the same period, the average unit value for imports rose from 11.0 to 25.4 cents per litre (131\%).

CHAIN VOLUME MEASURES FOR
EXPORTS AND IMPORTS

The various measures included in this article so far are either obtained directly from Customs records or derived from them. The measures used to assess volume and price changes suffer from a number of limitations, although these are considered to be relatively less significant for crude petroleum, than for many other commodities.

The ABS produces chain volume measures and price indexes which provide conceptually better measures of volume and price change. For exports and imports the measures normally published are at a more aggregated level of classification. For this article, previously unpublished chain volume measures and price deflators for crude petroleum are included.
Current price series for exports and imports reflect the influences of both volume and price changes. Chain volume measures provide estimates of the changes in the value of the series, after the direct effects of price changes have been eliminated i.e. they only reflect the volume changes.

The chain volume measures of exports and imports of crude petroleum appearing in this article are annually reweighted chain Laspeyres indexes referenced to current price values in a chosen reference year, currently 1997-98.

For further information on chain volume measures refer to the Information Paper: Australian National Accounts, Introduction of Chain Volume and Price Indexes (Cat. no.5248.0), which was released in March 1998.

The series included in this article commenced in September quarter 1995. The series show broadly similar movements for values, volumes and prices, for both exports and imports of crude petroleum, to those outlined earlier in this article for the period most affected by the international oil price rise.

Between March quarter 1999 and March quarter 2000, the value of exports (current prices) rose $358 \%$, the implicit price deflator for exports rose $119 \%$, and the exports chain volume measure rose $108 \%$. Over the same period, the value of imports (current prices) rose $54 \%$, the implicit price deflator for imports rose $128 \%$, and the imports chain volume measure fell $32 \%$.

In 1998-99, the 5 major countries of destination for Australia's exports of crude petroleum were the United States of America, Taiwan, Japan, Republic of Korea and Singapore. Taken together these accounted for $81 \%$ of exports to all countries. For the same period, the 5 major countries of origin for Australia's imports of crude petroleum were Indonesia, Viet Nam, Papua New Guinea, New Zealand and Saudi Arabia. Taken together these accounted for $80 \%$ of imports from all countries.

INTRODUCTION
RELATIONSHIP TO BALANCE OF
PAYMENTS STATISTICS

1 This publication contains quarterly statistics of Australia's merchandise trade with its major trading partners and selected country groups.

2 The merchandise export and import statistics in this publication are compiled in broad agreement with the United Nations' recommendations for the compilation of international trade statistics. The paragraphs below briefly describe the concepts and methods used in their compilation.

3 The basic source of balance of payments data on goods exports and imports is 'international merchandise trade statistics'. However, because of conceptual differences, various coverage, timing and (imports only) valuation adjustments are necessary before international trade statistics can be put on a balance of payments basis. For more information on the relationship between international merchandise trade statistics and balance of payments statistics on merchandise trade see Chapter 6 of Balance of Payments and International Investment Position, Australia: Concepts, Sources and Methods (Cat. no. 5331.0).

4 International merchandise trade statistics are compiled by the Australian Bureau of Statistics from information submitted by exporters and importers or their agents to the Australian Customs Service (Customs).

5 Merchandise trade covers all movable goods which add to (imports) or subtract from (exports) the stock of material resources in Australia.

Excluded are:

- direct transit trade, i.e. goods being trans-shipped or moved through Australia for purposes of transport only;
- ships and aircraft moving through Australia while engaged in the transport of passengers or goods between Australia and other countries; and
- non-merchandise goods, consisting primarily of goods moving on a temporary basis (e.g. mobile equipment; goods under repair; goods for exhibition; and passengers' effects).

6 The United Nations' recommendations for the compilation of merchandise trade statistics recognise that the basic source used by most compiling countries-the customs record-will not be able to capture certain transactions. In Australia the following types of goods which fall within the scope of merchandise trade, are excluded because customs entries are not required:

- migrants' and passengers' effects exported or imported; and
- parcel post exports for values not exceeding $\$ 2000$ and parcel post imports for values not exceeding $\$ 1000$.


## For exports only:

- sales of aircraft (and parts or components) which were imported into Australia prior to 1 July 1987 for use on overseas routes;
- fish and other sea products landed abroad directly from the high seas by Australian ships; and
- from 1 July 1986 individual transaction lines (within an export consignment) where the value of the goods is less than $\$ 500$. Prior to that date, the value level was $\$ 250$.

For imports only:

- bunkers, aviation fuel and stores supplied abroad to Australian ships and aircraft;
- prior to 1 July 1987 the delivery of certain ships and aircraft (and parts and components) intended for use on overseas routes; and
- consignments screened free or entered on informal clearance documents (ICDs) for values not exceeding $\$ 250$ are excluded. From July 1998 individual transactions lines (within a formally entered import consignment) where the value of goods is less than $\$ 250$ are not processed by ABS and are excluded from import statistics.
In addition, although merchandise trade statistics should include illegal transactions, such as smuggled goods, these transactions are omitted as there is no practical way to collect this information.

7 The merchandise trade statistics in this publication are recorded on a general trade basis, i.e. exports include both Australian produce and re-exports, and imports comprise goods entered directly for home consumption together with goods imported into bonded warehouses.

8 Australian produce is defined as goods, materials or articles which have been produced or manufactured in Australia. Processing and assembly operations that leave imported components and products essentially unchanged are not considered as production or manufacture.
9 Re-exports are defined as goods, materials or articles originally imported into Australia which are exported in the same condition or after undergoing minor operations (e.g. blending, packaging, bottling, cleaning, husking and shelling) which leave them essentially unchanged. Information on re-exports is shown in Table 25.

10 From January 1988, exports are recorded in the calendar month in which the goods departed from Australia. Prior to January 1988, exports are recorded in the month in which the entries were processed by the Customs. For further details on the impact of the changed compilation basis on the merchandise export series refer to the article 'Changed timing basis for compilation of merchandise exports statistics' in the June 1992 issue of this publication.

11 Imports are generally recorded statistically in the calendar month in which the import entries are finalised by the Customs. Import entries may be lodged early and finalised prior to arrival, or their finalisation may be delayed because of the various validation checks carried out by Customs. Currently, approximately $85 \%$ of total import trade by value shown for a particular month reflects shipments which arrived in that month, while approximately $10 \%$ reflects shipments which arrived during the previous month with the remaining $5 \%$ by value arriving in earlier or later months. For individual commodities these percentages may vary considerably.

12 Occasionally significant delays occur in the lodgement, rather than processing, of import entries. When the affected entries are for significant values, they are recorded statistically in the month that they should have been lodged and finalised.

13 The value of exports is the free on board (f.o.b.) transactions value of the goods expressed in Australian dollars. Goods shipped on consignment are initially valued at the f.o.b. Australian port of shipment equivalent of the current price offering for similar goods of Australian origin in the principal markets of the country to which the goods are despatched for sale. Exporters who do not know the value of the goods at shipment and enter an approximate value must subsequently submit an entry either confirming or revising the estimated return.

14 The value of imports is the Australian Customs Value. Goods are valued at the point of containerisation (in most cases) or the port of shipment, or at the customs frontier of the exporting country, whichever comes first.

15 Changes in Customs valuation introduced from 1 July 1989 with the Customs and Excise Legislation Amendment Act 1989 are likely to have marginally raised Customs valuations. Data for periods from 1 July 1989 are therefore not fully comparable with data for previous periods. However, investigations of imports valuations, for years before and after the change have shown no measurable effect on the valuation of imports that can be attributed to the change in legislation. For details of the changes in legislation see the note 'Change in the Valuation of Imports' at the beginning of the Explanatory Notes of the 1989-90 issue of Foreign Trade, Australia: Comparative and Summary Tables (Cat. no. 5410.0).

16 For the purposes of international merchandise trade statistics, a country is defined as a geographical entity which trades, or has the potential to trade, with Australia in accordance with Customs provisions. External territories under Australian administration are treated as separate countries while self-governing territories and dependent territories under the administration of other countries may be treated as individual countries in Australian international merchandise trade statistics

17 For exports, 'country' refers to the country to which the goods were consigned at the time of export. Where the country of consignment is not known at the time of export, and where it is impossible to determine the destination, goods are recorded as 'Destination Unknown'. Tables 7 and 33 which show exports by country also include the item "Ship and aircraft stores". "Ship and aircraft stores" comprise fuel, food and other goods loaded onto foreign owned vessels and aircraft to be consumed during international journeys.

18 For imports, 'country' refers to the country of origin of the goods, which is defined as the country of production for Customs purposes. Where the country of origin is not known at the time of import and where it is impossible to determine the origin, goods are recorded as 'Origin Unknown'. Goods reported with country of origin 'Australia' (i.e. goods of Australian origin exported and subsequently re-imported) are shown as country 'Australia (Re-imports)' and are included in the Asia Pacific Economic Co-operation country group.

19 Wherever possible, statistics for countries and country groups for all time periods included in this publication reflect the composition of those countries and country groups on the last day of the reference period of this publication. Thus, after the German Democratic Republic and the German Federal Republic were reunited, statistics for all periods both before and after re-unification refer to the combined entity (called Germany in country classified statistics).

20 However, in the case of a country that breaks into a number of component entities, it is not possible to provide data for earlier periods for the new entities. For example, from October 1991, Estonia, Latvia and Lithuania are each separately identified in the statistics, but for earlier periods trade data for these three republics are included indistinguishably in data for the USSR.

21 The country groups shown in this publication are selected economic groups with which Australia trades, namely:

- Asia Pacific Economic Co-operation (APEC);
- Association of South-East Asian Nations (ASEAN);
- Developing Countries (DCs);
- European Union (EU).

22 A list of the countries included in each of the above groups is shown in the Appendix. Country groups may not be mutually exclusive e.g. Indonesia is included in APEC, ASEAN and as a Developing Country. The countries that belong to more than one group are identified with a footnote in the Appendix.

23 More details on the composition of countries identified in these statistics are available from the Classification Manager on Canberra (02) 62525409.

24 Commodity export and import statistics in Tables 9 to 24 of this publication are presented according to the codes and descriptions of the third revision of the United Nations' Standard International Trade Classification (SITC Rev3) with the addition of dummy codes to take account of Australia's treatment of gold coin, whether or not legal tender, and other legal tender coin and confidential items.

25 Tables 31 and 32 of this publication are presented according to the second revision of SITC up to December 1987 and according to SITC Rev3 from January 1988. See Appendix B of the 1988-1989 issue of Foreign Trade Australia: Comparative and Summary Tables (5410.0) for details of Divisions significantly affected by this change.

26 State information for exports presented in Table 25 refers to the State in which the final stage of production or manufacture occurs.

27 State information for imports presented in Table 26 refers to the State where imported goods were released from Customs control, also called the State of final destination. The State of final destination is not necessarily the State in which the port of discharge of the goods is located. Goods can be forwarded interstate after discharge either under Customs control or not, but are recorded as being imported into the State where they are released by Customs.

28 Exports and imports statistics classified by subdivisions of the Australian and New Zealand Standard Industrial Classification (ANZSIC) are shown in Tables 27 and 28. The statistics are compiled by allocating statistical items of the Australian Harmonized Export Commodity Classification (AHECC) and the Harmonized Customs Tariff to the ANZSIC industry of origin based upon the main economic activities of those industries with which the commodities are primarily associated. A full description of ANZSIC classes is contained in the publication Australian and New Zealand Standard Industrial Classification, 1993 Edition (Cat. no. 1292.0).

29 Merchandise trade in Tables 29 and 30 are classified according to the categories of the United Nations' Classification By Broad Economic Categories (BEC). The BEC classifies international merchandise trade statistics for the purposes of general economic analysis according to the main end use of the commodities traded. The statistics are compiled by allocating the statistical items of the AHECC and the Harmonized Customs Tariff to the appropriate BEC.
