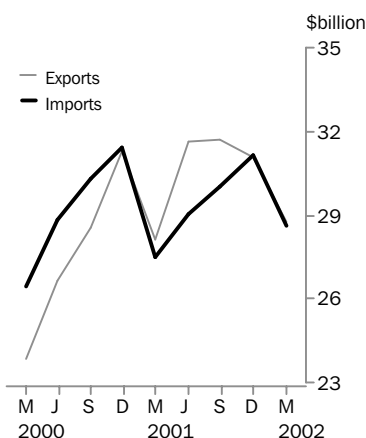

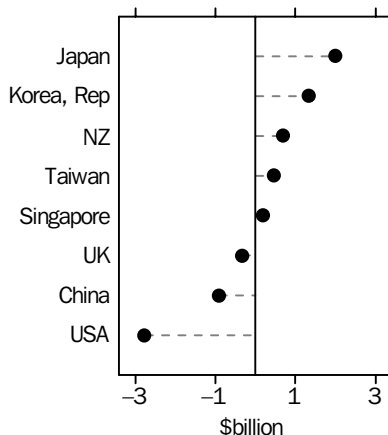

MARCH QTR KEY POINTS

BY COUNTRY

- The deficit with USA increased by \$317 million (13%) to \$2,766 million.
- The surplus with Japan increased \$253 million (14%) to \$2,004 million.
- The deficit with UK decreased \$144 million (30%) to \$335 million.

BY COMMODITY

MAJOR EXPORTS

- Cars and other road vehicles, down \$397 million (29%) to \$973 million.
- Beef, down \$249 million (23%) to \$843 million.
- Iron ore and concentrates, down \$216 million (16%) to \$1,154 million.

MAJOR IMPORTS

- Aircraft, up \$490 million (86%) to \$1,058 million.
- Telecommunications equipment, down \$436 million (36%) to \$791 million.

From 1 July 2002, the threshold for the reporting of an export entry to Customs will be raised to \$2,000 per consignment. While all goods that require a permit, regardless of the value of the goods, will be required to be reported to Customs, only those entries that exceed \$2,000 per consignment will be included in merchandise export statistics. More information on the change and its expected impacts on future merchandise export statistics will be included in an article in the next issue of this publication.

CHANGES IN THIS ISSUE

There were no changes in this issue.

REVISIONS

Revisions since the last issue of this publication have:

- decreased total merchandise exports for the December quarter 2001 by \$67 million, and decreased them for the year ended December 2001 by \$89 million.
- decreased total merchandise imports for the December quarter 2001 by \$32 million, and decreased them for the year ended December 2001 by \$32 million.

These movements combined to increase the merchandise trade deficit for the December quarter 2001 by \$35 million, and decreased the merchandise trade surplus for the year ended December 2001 by \$57 million.

QUARTERLY ANALYSIS AND COMMENTS

EXCESS OF MERCHANDISE EXPORTS OR IMPORTS

In the March quarter 2002, merchandise exports exceeded merchandise imports by \$197 million - about 1% of the value of exports. This followed a small deficit (\$45 million) recorded in the December quarter 2001.

The move from a deficit in the December quarter 2001 to a surplus in the March quarter 2002 was the result of a greater decline in imports than for exports. The March quarter normally shows a fall for both exports and imports.

One factor affecting Australia's trading performance has been a strengthening of the Australian dollar against our major trading currencies. The Australian dollar has increased 2% against the US dollar, 4% against the Euro, and 5% against the Yen between December 2001 and March 2002. 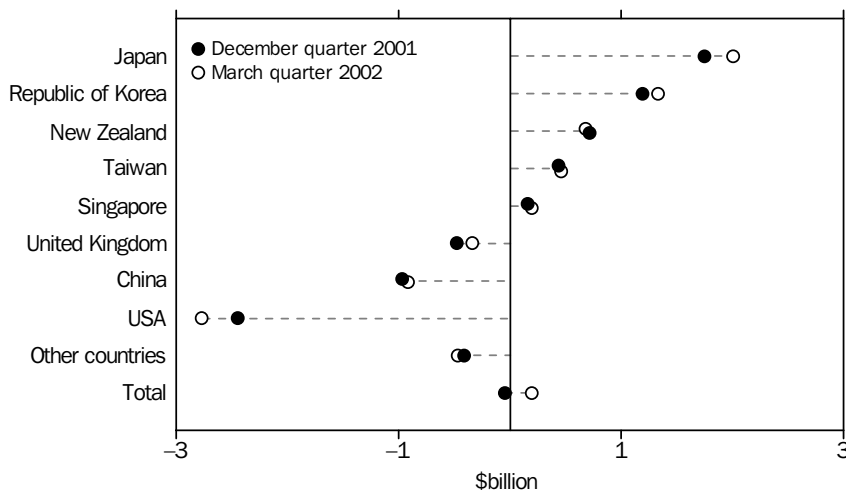
Australia's trading position improved with most of our major trading partners:

- Japan, the surplus increased \$253 million (14%) to \$2,004 million.
- United Kingdom, the deficit decreased \$144 million (30%) to \$335 million.
- Republic of Korea, the surplus increased \$140 million (12%) to \$1,334 million.
- China, the deficit decreased \$48 million (5%) to \$917 million.
- Singapore, the surplus increased \$43 million (27%) to \$201 million.
- Taiwan, the surplus increased \$24 million (5%) to \$462 million.

However, Australia's trade position worsened with:

- USA, the deficit increased by \$317 million (13%) to \$2,766 million.
- New Zealand, the surplus decreased \$36 million (5%) to \$684 million.

AUSTRALIA'S QUARTERLY TRADE WITH MAJOR COUNTRIES, Excess of exports (+) or imports (-)

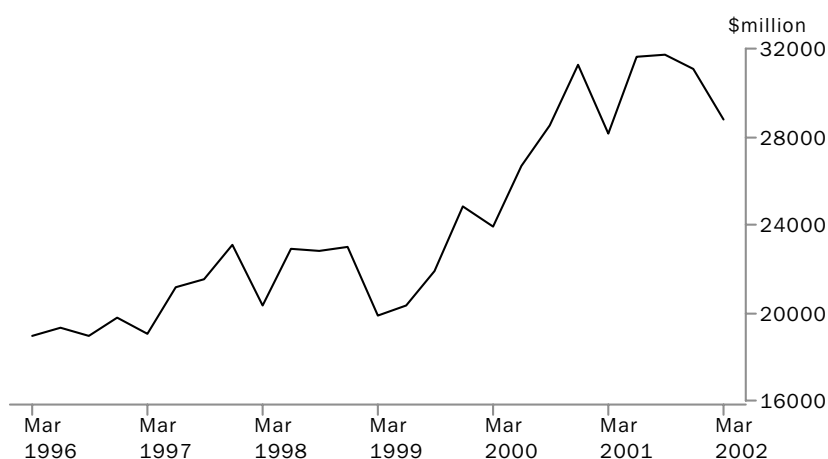


MERCHANDISE EXPORTS

Merchandise exports for the March quarter 2002 were \$28,787 million, down \$2,310 million (7%) from the December quarter 2001 (\$31,097 million). This follows the normal seasonal pattern. Exports have risen slightly since the March quarter 2001 (2%).

The Export Price Index fell by 1% during the March quarter 2002, mainly due to falls in the price of *Mineral fuels* (SITC group 3) and *Chemical and related products* (SITC group 5). Over the year the Export Price Index had increased by 1%. For more information on the Export Price Index, see *International Trade Price Indexes, Australia* (Cat. no. 6457.0). Estimates of chain volume measures for exports and seasonally adjusted data will be published in the March quarter 2002 issue of *Balance of Payments and International Investment Position, Australia* (Cat. no. 5302.0) to be released on 31 May 2002.

MERCHANDISE EXPORTS



Most export commodity groups recorded decreases between the December quarter 2001 and the March quarter 2002. The largest decreases were:

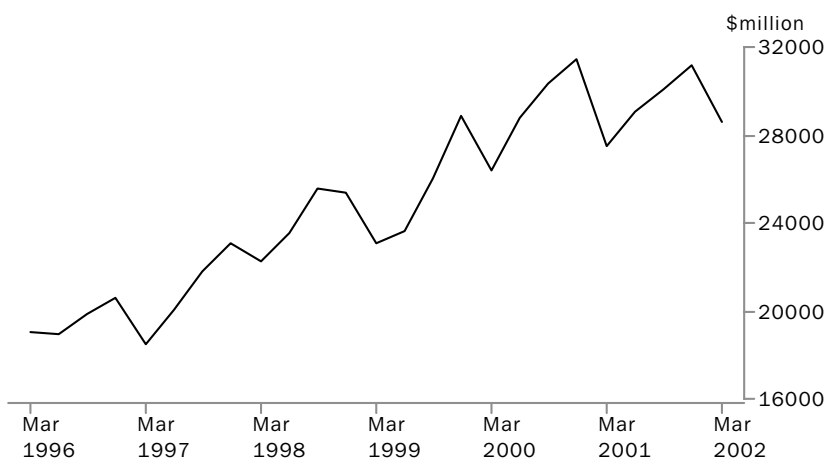
- *Machinery and transport equipment*, down \$843 million (21%) to \$3,211 million, due mainly to large decreases in Passenger vehicles (SITC 781) and Telecommunications equipment (SITC 764). These decreases were partially offset by an increase in Aircraft (SITC 792).
- *Crude materials, inedible, except fuels*, down \$579 million (10%) to \$5,160 million due mainly to large decreases in Iron ore and concentrates (SITC 281), Cotton (SITC 263) and Aluminium ores and concentrates (SITC 285). These were partially offset by an increase in Oil seeds and oleaginous fruits for extraction of vegetable oils (SITC 222), which has a different seasonal pattern due to the exports of canola seeds.
- *Food and live animals*, down \$562 million (10%) to \$4,996 million, due mainly to decreases in Beef (SITC 011) and Other edible meat and offal (SITC 012).
- *Miscellaneous manufactured articles*, down \$204 million (17%) to \$1,014 million due mainly to a large decrease in Optical goods (SITC 884).
- *Mineral fuels, lubricants and related materials*, down \$98 million (2%) to \$6,115 million, due to large decreases in Petroleum products and Natural and manufactured gas. These were partially offset by a large increase in Coal.

MERCHANDISE IMPORTS

Merchandise imports in the March quarter 2002 were \$28,590 million, a decrease of \$2,552 million (8%) from the December quarter 2001 value (\$31,142 million). This is consistent with the usual seasonal pattern.

The Import Price Index fell 3% during the March quarter 2002 with large price decreases in *Mineral fuels* (SITC group 3) and *Crude materials* (SITC group 2). For more information on the Import Price Index, see *International Trade Price Indexes, Australia* (Cat. no. 6457.0).

MERCHANDISE IMPORTS



Most import commodity groups recorded decreases with the largest being:

- *Machinery and transport equipment*, down \$1,680 million (12%) to \$12,452 million due mainly to decreases in Telecommunications equipment (SITC 764), Passenger vehicles (SITC 781), Heating and cooling equipment and parts (SITC 741), Sound recorders and reproducers (SITC 763), and Automatic data processing machines (SITC 752). These were partially offset by a large increase in Aircraft (SITC 792).
- *Miscellaneous manufactured articles*, down \$417 million (9%) to \$4,199 million.
- *Mineral fuels, lubricants and related materials*, down \$213 million (9%) to \$2,051 million due mainly to a decrease in Petroleum products.
- *Beverages and tobacco*, down \$116 million (39%) to \$179 million due mainly to a large decrease in Alcoholic beverages (SITC 112).

There was an increase in imports of *Chemicals and related products, nes*, up \$154 million (4%) to \$3,779 million due mainly to increases in Organo-inorganic compounds (SITC 515), Fertilisers (SITC 562), and Medicaments (SITC 542). There was a partially offsetting decrease in Inorganic chemical elements (SITC 522).

ANNUAL ANALYSIS AND COMMENTS

EXCESS OF MERCHANDISE EXPORTS OR IMPORTS

For the year ended March 2002, merchandise exports exceeded merchandise imports by \$4,368 million. This represented a considerable improvement in Australia's trade position compared to the year ended March 2001 when merchandise imports exceeded merchandise exports by \$3,465 million.

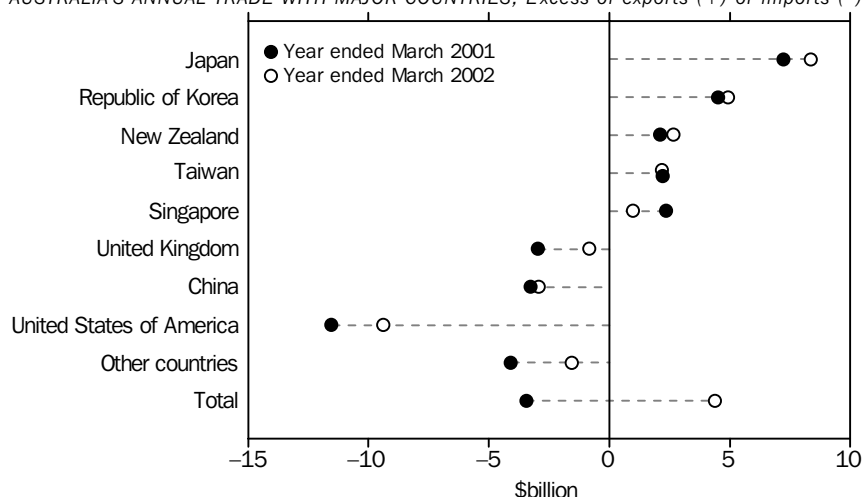
Australia had surpluses with:

- Japan, up \$1,122 million (16%) to \$8,357 million.
- Republic of Korea, up \$411 million (9%) to \$4,912 million.
- New Zealand, up \$561 million (27%) to \$2,665 million.
- Taiwan, down \$60 million (3%) to \$2,168 million.
- Singapore, down \$1,371 million (58%) to \$986 million.

Australia had deficits with:

- USA, down \$2,160 million (19%) to \$9,380 million.
- China, down \$344 million (11%) to \$2,931 million.
- United Kingdom, down \$2,215 million (71%) to \$851 million.

MERCHANDISE EXPORTS

Australia's merchandise exports for the year ended March 2002 were \$123,188 million, an increase of \$8,589 million (7%) over exports reported for the year ended March 2001. Between the March quarter 2001 and the March quarter 2002, the Export Price Index increased by 1%.

All commodity groups recorded increases in merchandise exports for the year ended March 2002 compared to the previous year. The largest increases were:

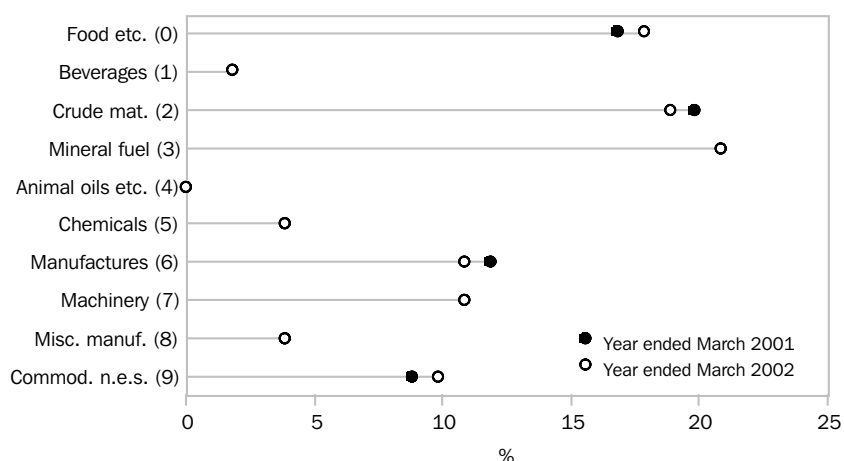
- *Food and live animals*, up \$2,154 million (11%) to \$21,822 million due mainly to increases in Beef (SITC 011), Other meat (SITC 012) and Wheat (SITC 041).
- *Mineral fuels, lubricants and related materials*, up \$1,551 million (6%) to \$25,651 million due mainly to large increases in Coal (SITC 321), up \$3,513 million (35%) and Natural gas (SITC 343), up \$124 million (5%), but significantly offset by decreases in Crude petroleum products (SITC 333) down \$1,524 million (20%) and Petroleum oils from bituminous minerals (SITC 334) down \$548 million (18%).

MERCHANDISE EXPORTS

- *Machinery and transport equipment*, up \$1,205 million (9%) to \$14,099 million due mainly to increases in Passenger vehicles (SITC 781), Aircraft (SITC 792), and Automatic data processing and office machines (SITC 752). These were partially offset by decreases to Telecommunications equipment (SITC 764), Ships, boats and floating structures (SITC 793), and Internal combustion piston engines and parts (SITC 713).

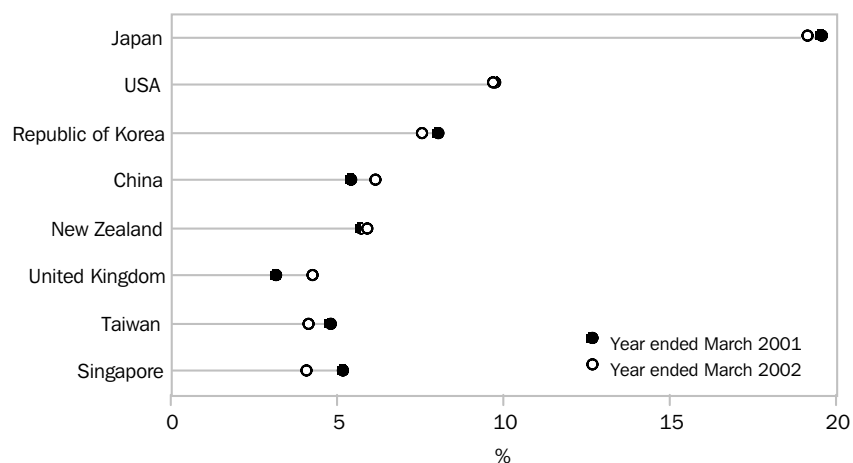
COMMODITY COMPOSITION (SITC SECTION) OF EXPORTS



Australia's major export destinations for the year ended March 2002 were:

- Japan, up \$1,163 million (5%) to \$23,709 million.
- USA, up \$770 million (7%) to \$12,096 million.
- Republic of Korea, up \$115 million (1%) to \$9,497 million.
- China, up \$1,394 million (22%) to \$7,738 million.
- New Zealand, up \$731 million (11%) to \$7,406 million.
- United Kingdom, up \$1,622 million (43%) to \$5,400 million.
- Taiwan, down \$461 million (8%) to \$5,221 million.
- Singapore, down \$935 million (15%) to \$5,144 million.

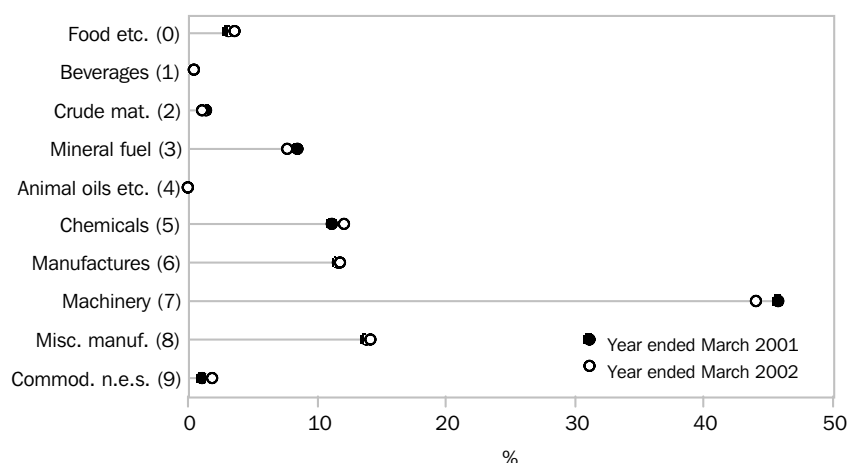
COUNTRY COMPOSITION OF EXPORTS



MERCHANDISE IMPORTS

Merchandise imports for the year ended March 2002 were \$118,820 million, an increase of \$757 million (1%) over imports for the year ended March 2001. The Import Price Index rose by 2% between the March quarter 2001 and the March quarter 2002.

COMMODITY COMPOSITION (SITC SECTION) OF IMPORTS



The import commodity groups that recorded the largest increases were:

- *Chemicals and related products, nes*, up \$1,138 million (8%) due mainly to increases in Medicaments (SITC 542), Inorganic chemical elements (SITC 522) and Perfumery, cosmetics or toilet preparations (SITC 553), partially offset by a decrease in Organo-inorganic compounds (SITC 515).
- *Food and live animals*, up \$461 million (11%) to \$4,588 million due mainly to increases in Animal feedstuff (SITC 081), Edible products and preparations, nes (SITC 098), and Meat (excl. beef) (SITC 012).

Several import commodity groups recorded the decreases, the largest being:

- *Machinery and transport equipment*, down \$1,623 million (3%) to \$52,707 million due mainly to decreases in Telecommunications equipment (SITC 764), Aircraft (SITC 792), Automatic data processing machines (SITC 752), Thermionic, cold cathode or photo-cathode valves, etc (SITC 776), and Motor vehicle accessories and parts (SITC 784). There was a partially offsetting increase in Passenger vehicles (SITC 781).
- *Mineral fuels, lubricants and related materials*, down \$879 million (8%) to \$9,468 million due mainly to a decrease in Petroleum oils and crude petroleum (SITC 333).
- *Crude materials, inedible, except fuels*, down \$279 million (14%) to \$1,738 million due mainly to decreases in Pulp and wastepaper (SITC 251) and Simply worked wood and railway sleepers (SITC 248).

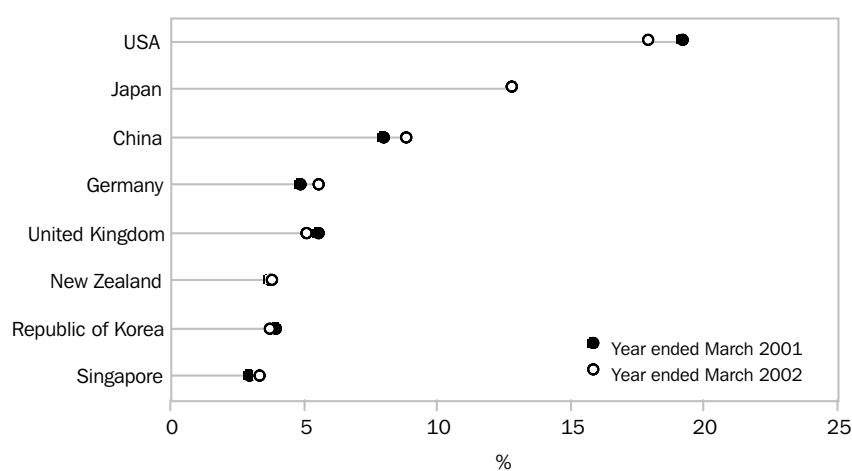

Australia's major import sources were:

- USA, down \$1,390 million (6%) to \$21,475 million.
- Japan, up \$40 million to \$15,352 million.
- China, up \$1,050 million (11%) to \$10,669 million.
- Germany, up \$867 million (15%) to \$6,832 million.
- United Kingdom, down \$502 million (7%) to \$6,251 million.
- New Zealand, up \$170 million (4%) to \$4,741 million.
- Republic of Korea, down \$296 million (6%) to \$4,585 million.
- Singapore, up \$436 million (12%) to \$4,158 million.

EXPLANATORY NOTES

INTRODUCTION

1 This publication contains quarterly statistics of Australia's merchandise trade with its major trading partners and selected country groups.

2 The merchandise export and import statistics in this publication are compiled in broad agreement with the United Nations' recommendations for the compilation of international trade statistics. The paragraphs below briefly describe the concepts and methods used in their compilation. More detailed information on methods used in compiling data can be found in *International Merchandise Trade, Australia: Concepts, Sources and Methods* (Cat. no. 5489.0). This publication can be accessed on the ABS website <URL:<http://www.abs.gov.au>> see Statistics; Statistical Concepts Library; ABS concepts, sources, methods and statistical framework; 5489.0 – International Merchandise Trade, Australia, CSM.

RELATIONSHIP TO BALANCE OF PAYMENTS STATISTICS

3 The basic source of balance of payments data on goods exports and imports is 'international merchandise trade statistics'. However, because of conceptual differences, various coverage, timing and (imports only) valuation adjustments are necessary before international trade statistics can be put on a balance of payments basis. For more information on the relationship between international merchandise trade statistics and balance of payments statistics on merchandise trade see Chapter 6 of *Balance of Payments and International Investment Position, Australia: Concepts, Sources and Methods* (Cat. no. 5331.0).

SOURCE OF DATA

4 International merchandise trade statistics are compiled by the Australian Bureau of Statistics from information submitted by exporters and importers or their agents to the Australian Customs Service (Customs).

SCOPE

5 Merchandise trade covers all movable goods which add to (imports) or subtract from (exports) the stock of material resources in Australia.

Excluded are:

- direct transit trade, i.e. goods being trans-shipped or moved through Australia for purposes of transport only;
- ships and aircraft moving through Australia while engaged in the transport of passengers or goods between Australia and other countries; and
- non-merchandise goods, consisting primarily of goods moving on a temporary basis (e.g. mobile equipment; goods under repair; goods for exhibition; and passengers' effects).

EXPLANATORY NOTES

COVERAGE

6 The United Nations' recommendations for the compilation of merchandise trade statistics recognise that the basic source used by most compiling countries—the customs record—will not be able to capture certain transactions. In Australia the following types of goods which fall within the scope of merchandise trade, are excluded because customs entries are not required:

- migrants' and passengers' effects exported or imported; and
- parcel post exports for values not exceeding \$2,000 and parcel post imports for values not exceeding \$1,000.

For exports only:

- fish and other sea products landed abroad directly from the high seas by Australian ships; and
- individual transaction lines (within an export consignment) where the value of the goods is less than \$500.

For imports only:

- bunkers, aviation fuel and stores supplied abroad to Australian ships and aircraft; and
- From July 1998 individual transaction lines (within a formally entered import consignment) where the value of goods is less than \$250 are not processed by ABS and are excluded from import statistics.

In addition, although merchandise trade statistics should include illegal transactions, such as smuggled goods, these transactions are omitted as there is no practical way to collect this information.

BASIS OF COMPILATION

7 The merchandise trade statistics in this publication are recorded on a general trade basis, i.e. exports include both Australian produce and re-exports, and imports comprise goods entered directly for home consumption together with goods imported into bonded warehouses.

8 Australian produce is defined as goods, materials or articles which have been produced or manufactured in Australia. Processing and assembly operations that leave imported components and products essentially unchanged are not considered as production or manufacture.

9 Re-exports are defined as goods, materials or articles originally imported into Australia which are exported in the same condition or after undergoing minor operations (e.g. blending, packaging, bottling, cleaning, husking and shelling) which leave them essentially unchanged. Information on re-exports is shown in table 25.

STATISTICAL PERIOD

10 Exports are recorded in the calendar month in which the goods departed from Australia.

11 Imports are generally recorded statistically in the calendar month in which the import entries are finalised by the Customs. Import entries may be lodged early and finalised prior to arrival, or their finalisation may be delayed because of the various validation checks carried out by Customs. Currently, approximately 85% of total import trade by value shown for a particular month reflects shipments which arrived in that month, while approximately 10% reflects shipments which arrived during the previous month with the remaining 5% by value arriving in earlier or later months. For individual commodities these percentages may vary considerably.

12 Occasionally significant delays occur in the lodgement, rather than processing, of import entries. In rare circumstances, and only when the affected entries are for significant values, they are recorded statistically in the month that they should have been lodged and finalised.

EXPLANATORY NOTES

VALUATION

13 The value of exports is the free on board (f.o.b.) transactions value of the goods expressed in Australian dollars. Goods shipped on consignment are initially valued at the f.o.b. Australian port of shipment equivalent of the current price offering for similar goods of Australian origin in the principal markets of the country to which the goods are despatched for sale. Exporters who do not know the value of the goods at shipment, and enter an approximate value, must subsequently submit an entry either confirming or revising the estimated return.

14 The value of imports is the Australian Customs Value. Goods are valued at the point of containerisation (in most cases) or the port of shipment, or at the customs frontier of the exporting country, whichever comes first.

COUNTRY

15 For the purposes of international merchandise trade statistics, a country is defined as a geographical entity which trades, or has the potential to trade, with Australia in accordance with Customs provisions.

16 For exports, 'country' refers to the country to which the goods were consigned at the time of export. Where the country of consignment is not known at the time of export, and where it is impossible to determine the destination, goods are recorded as 'Destination Unknown'. Tables 7 and 33 which show exports by country also include the item "Ship and aircraft stores". "Ship and aircraft stores" comprise fuel, food and other goods loaded onto foreign owned vessels and aircraft to be consumed during international journeys.

17 For imports, 'country' refers to the country of origin of the goods, which is defined as the country of production for Customs purposes. Where the country of origin is not known at the time of import and where it is impossible to determine the origin, goods are recorded as 'Origin Unknown'. Goods reported with country of origin 'Australia' (i.e. goods of Australian origin exported and subsequently re-imported) are shown as country 'Australia (Re-imports)' and are included in the Asia Pacific Economic Co-operation country group.

18 Wherever possible, statistics for countries and country groups for all time periods included in this publication reflect the composition of those countries and country groups on the last day of the reference period of this publication. Thus, after the German Democratic Republic and the German Federal Republic were reunited, statistics for all periods both before and after re-unification refer to the combined entity (called Germany in country classified statistics).

19 However, in the case of a country that breaks into a number of component entities, it is not possible to provide data for earlier periods for the new entities. For example, from October 1991, Estonia, Latvia and Lithuania are each separately identified in the statistics, but for earlier periods trade data for these three republics are included indistinguishably in data for the USSR.

20 The country groups shown in this publication are selected economic groups with which Australia trades, namely:

Asia Pacific Economic Co-operation (APEC);

Association of South-East Asian Nations (ASEAN);

Developing Countries (DCs);

European Union (EU).

EXPLANATORY NOTES

COUNTRY *continued*

21 A list of the countries included in each of the above groups is shown in the Appendix. Country groups may not be mutually exclusive e.g. Indonesia is included in APEC, ASEAN and as a Developing Country. The countries that belong to more than one group are identified with a footnote in the Appendix.

22 More details on the composition of countries identified in these statistics are available from the *Classification Manager* on Canberra 02 6252 5409.

COMMODITY CLASSIFICATION

23 Commodity export and import statistics in tables 9 to 24 of this publication are presented according to the codes and descriptions of the third revision of the United Nations' *Standard International Trade Classification* (SITC Rev3) which came into effect in January 1988. The ABS has added dummy codes to take account of Australia's treatment of gold coin, whether or not legal tender, and other legal tender coin and confidential items.

STATE

24 State information for exports presented in table 25 refers to the State in which the final stage of production or manufacture occurs.

25 State information for imports presented in table 26 refers to the State where imported goods were released from Customs control, also called the State of final destination. The State of final destination is not necessarily the State in which the port of discharge of the goods is located. Goods can be forwarded interstate after discharge either under Customs control or not, but are recorded as being imported into the State where they are released by Customs.

INDUSTRY OF ORIGIN

26 Export and import statistics classified by subdivisions of the Australian and New Zealand Standard Industrial Classification (ANZSIC) are shown in tables 27 and 28. The statistics are compiled by allocating statistical items of the Australian Harmonized Export Commodity Classification (AHECC) and the Harmonized Customs Tariff to the ANZSIC industry of origin based upon the primary activities of those industries with which the commodities are primarily associated. A full description of ANZSIC classes is contained in the publication *Australian and New Zealand Standard Industrial Classification (ANZSIC), 1993 Edition* (Cat. no. 1292.0).

BROAD ECONOMIC CATEGORIES

27 Merchandise trade in tables 29 and 30 are classified according to the categories of the United Nations' *Classification By Broad Economic Categories* (BEC). The BEC classifies international merchandise trade statistics for the purposes of general economic analysis according to the main end use of the commodities traded. The statistics are compiled by allocating the statistical items of the AHECC and the Harmonized Customs Tariff to the appropriate BEC.

CONFIDENTIALITY

28 Restrictions are placed on the release of statistics for certain commodities for reasons of confidentiality. These restrictions do not affect total export and import figures, but they can affect statistics at all levels in country and commodity tables. For information on the confidentiality restrictions and their impact upon the statistics in this publication, analysts should refer to the feature article on *Data Confidentiality* in the December 1999 issue.

EXPLANATORY NOTES

RELIABILITY

30 Statistics for recent periods should be considered preliminary. Revisions to previously published data frequently occur due to continuing data quality checks.
