### **NOTES**

#### ABOUT THIS PUBLICATION

This publication presents information about the career experience of employees. By presenting a number of demographic classifications and characteristics of the jobs of employees it provides insights into career opportunities of Australian workers. It provides information on employees with family responsibilities and on issues such as workplace flexibility and barriers to career development.

Statistics in this publication were obtained from the Career Experience Survey that was conducted throughout Australia in November 1998 as a supplement to the Australian Bureau of Statistics monthly Labour Force Survey.

Data from the survey relate to persons who were employees in their main job.

This survey collects details of the current job and changes in the job such as promotions, transfers and training opportunities. Other information available includes breaks away from work for six months or more and reasons for those breaks, educational attainment, number of dependent children, type of leave taken when the youngest child was born and childcare arrangements.

#### SUMMARY OF FINDINGS

**OVERVIEW** 

In November 1998 there were 7,006,600 employees in the Australian labour force. Of these:

- 5,100,200 had been with their current employer for one year or more and had experienced some change in their work in the previous 12 months;
- 296,300 had been with their current employer for one year or more and had no change in their work; and
- 1,610,100 employees had been with their current employer for less than one year.

CHANGES IN WORK


Information on changes in work in the last 12 months was collected from employees who had worked with their current employer for one year or more.

The most commonly reported changes were: 'more responsibility' (reported by 38% of these employees); 'new, different or extra duties' (36%) and 'a change in hours' (17%). Other changes include 'changed location', 'transfer' and 'promotion' (each at 7% to 9%). A small proportion reported 'no change at all' (5%).

These results are similar to those obtained in 1996.

Female employees were more likely to have had 'new, different or extra duties' (38%) and 'changed hours' (20%) than male employees (34% and 15% respectively). A similar proportion of male and female employees had been promoted (7%).

The proportion of full-time employees who were 'promoted' (8%) or 'transferred' (9%) was significantly higher than that of part-time employees (2% and 4% respectively).

Full-time employees were more likely to have had 'more responsibility' (42%) and 'new, different or extra duties' (39%) than part-time employees (25% and 26% respectively).

# CHANGES IN WORK continued

The most common change for part-time employees was a 'change in hours'. More than one-quarter (27%) of part-time employees had a 'change in hours' compared to only 14% of full-time employees.

Being given 'more responsibility' was the most common change reported by employees in all age groups except those aged 55 years and over. Employees aged 20–34 years were most likely to have been given 'more responsibility' (43%) compared to (34%) for those aged 45–54 years and (22%) for those aged 55 years and over.


Younger employees were more likely to be promoted or transferred than older persons. Some 11% of employees aged 20–34 years had been promoted and 11% had been transferred. In contrast, only 2% of those aged 55 years and over were promoted and 3% transferred.

A higher proportion of managers and administrators were promoted or transferred than employees in any other occupation group (13% promoted and 11% transferred). Associate professionals (10% promoted and 10% transferred) and intermediate clerical, sales and service workers (9% and 11% respectively) also had a high rate of promotion and transfer.

# LENGTH OF TIME WITH CURRENT EMPLOYER

In November 1998, 5,396,500 employees had been with their current employer for one year or more and 1,610,100 had been with their current employer for less than one year.

Full-time employees were more likely to have worked for their current employer for a greater length of time than those working part-time. An estimated 44% of full-time employees had worked for five years or more for their current employer compared to just 25% of part-timers. In contrast, 34% of part-time employees had worked less than one year for their current employer compared to 19% of full-time employees.

Similarly, permanent employees were more likely to have worked five years or more for their current employer than casuals—46% of permanent employees compared to 21% of casuals.

**FDUCATION AND TRAINING** 

Of those employees who had worked for their current employer for one year or more, 44% received some kind of education or formal training in the 12 months to November 1998. Employees who received some kind of education or formal training had higher rates of promotion and job transfer. Of those who received some kind of education or formal training, 11% gained a promotion and 12% transferred jobs, compared to 4% and 5% respectively for those who did not.

The majority (85%) of the 2,841,700 employees who studied for an educational qualification or attended a formal training course had received some assistance from their employer. Of those full-time employees who attended formal training or studied, a large proportion (89%) received some form of assistance from their employer. In contrast, 69% of part-time employees received assistance.

CARFFR BRFAKS

Of those employees who had worked for their current employer for six months or more, 182,100 (3%) had taken a break of six months or more from their current employment.

Two-thirds (66%) of employees who took a break of six months or more were women, most of whom (62%) cited family reasons as the main reason for their break. More than half (51%) of those women who had a break for family reasons had a child or children under 12 years of age.

The majority (44%) of men took their most recent break from work of six months or more for personal reasons. In comparison, personal reasons were given by only 27% of women.

**CHILDCARE** 

Just over half (51%) of the 1,309,800 employees with children under 12 years of age reported that they used some form of childcare. Just under half (49%) of these employees used informal care only.

Employees whose youngest child was aged under six years were more likely to use childcare (59%) than those whose youngest child was aged 6-12 years (39%).

#### **EXPLANATORY NOTES**

INTRODUCTION

- **1** This survey was conducted as a supplement to the monthly Labour Force Survey (LFS). Respondents to the LFS who fell within the scope of the supplementary survey were asked about their career experience.
- **2** For further information about the LFS, see *Labour Force, Australia* (Cat. no. 6203.0). This monthly publication contains information about survey design, sample redesign, scope, coverage and population benchmarks relevant to the monthly LFS, which also apply to supplementary surveys. It also contains definitions of demographic and labour force characteristics, and information about telephone interviewing which are relevant to both the monthly LFS and supplementary surveys.

**SCOPE** 

- **3** In addition to those already excluded from the monthly LFS, students at boarding schools, patients in hospitals, residents of homes (e.g. retirement homes, homes for the handicapped), and inmates of prisons are further excluded from all supplementary surveys.
- 4 There were approximately 80,000 persons living in remote and sparsely settled parts of Australia who were out of scope of this survey. The exclusion of these persons has only minor impact on any aggregate estimates that are produced for individual States and Territories, except the Northern Territory. Please contact the person listed on the front cover of this publication if you require more information.
- **5** This survey was restricted to persons who were employees in their main job. Persons aged 15–20 years who are still attending school were excluded from this survey.

**COVERAGE** 

6 The estimates in this publication relate to persons covered by the survey in September 1998. In the LFS, coverage rules are applied which aim to ensure that each person is associated with only one dwelling and hence has only one chance of selection. See Cat. no. 6203.0.

### RELIABILITY OF THE **ESTIMATES**

- Estimates in this publication are subject to sampling and non-sampling errors:
- Sampling error is the difference between the published estimate and the value that would have been produced if all dwellings had been included in the survey. For further information on sampling error, refer to the Technical Notes on page 35.
- Non-sampling errors are inaccuracies that occur because of imperfections in reporting by respondents and interviewers, and errors made in coding and processing data. These inaccuracies may occur in any enumeration, whether it be a full count or a sample. Every effort is made to reduce the non-sampling error to a minimum by careful design of questionnaires, intensive training and supervision of interviewers and efficient processing procedures.

#### SEASONAL FACTORS

The estimates refer to information collected in the survey month and, due to seasonal factors, may not be representative of other months of the year.

#### CLASSIFICATIONS USED

- The educational attainment data item in this survey has been classified according to ABS Classification of Qualifications (ABSCQ) (Cat. no. 1262.0).
- 10 From August 1996, occupation data are classified according to ASCO — Australian Standard Classification of Occupations, Second Edition, 1997 (Cat. no. 1220.0).
- 11 From August 1994, LFS industry data are classified according to the Australian and New Zealand Standard Industrial Classification (ANZSIC), a detailed description of which appears in Australian and New Zealand Standard Industrial Classification (ANZSIC), 1993 (Cat. no. 1292.0). Like the previous Australian Standard Industrial Classification (ASIC), ANZSIC classifies businesses according to their economic activities, in a structure consisting of four levels (Division, Subdivision, Group and Class). Supplementary Survey data are coded at the Group level, as was the practice under ASIC.

#### COMPARABILITY OF SERIES

12 Revisions are made to population benchmarks for the LFS after each five-yearly Census of Population and Housing. The last such revision prior to this survey being conducted was made in February 1994 to take account of the results of the 1991 Census of Population and Housing. Estimates from supplementary surveys conducted between February 1994 and January 1999 were based on revised population benchmarks. Population benchmarks based on the results of the 1996 census were introduced to the LFS in February 1999.

# COMPARABILITY WITH MONTHLY LFS SURVEY

- 13 Since August 1994 the sample for supplementary surveys has been restricted to no more than seven-eighths of the sample. However, the sample for this survey has been restricted to four-eighths since the November 1996 survey. This reduction in sample size means that the standard errors for these surveys differ from those applicable to the February 1993 survey.
- **14** Due to differences in the scope and sample size of this supplementary survey and that of the monthly LFS, the estimation procedure may lead to some small variations between estimates from this survey and those from the LFS.

#### PREVIOUS SURVEYS

**15** The Career Experience Survey has previously been conducted in February 1993, November 1996.

#### **ACKNOWLEDGMENT**

**16** Australian Bureau of Statistics publications draw extensively on information provided freely by individuals, businesses, governments and other organisations. 
#### **TECHNICAL NOTES**

INTRODUCTION

- 1 Since the estimates in this publication are based on information obtained from occupants of a sample of dwellings, they are subject to sampling variability, that is, they may differ from those that would have been produced if all dwellings had been included in the survey. One measure of the likely difference is given by the standard error (SE), which indicates the extent to which an estimate might have varied by chance because only a sample of dwellings was included. There are about two chances in three that a sample estimate will differ by less than one SE from the number that would have been obtained if all dwellings had been included, and about 19 chances in 20 that the difference will be less than two SEs. Another measure of the likely difference is the relative standard error (RSE), which is obtained by expressing the SE as a percentage of the estimate.
- 2 Space does not allow for the separate indication of the SEs of all estimates in this publication. A table of SEs for general application is given on page 37. Since they are averages based on calculations for a limited number of past surveys over a wide range of labour force characteristics these numbers will not give a precise measure of the SEs of a particular estimate but they will provide an indication of its magnitude.

CALCULATION OF STANDARD ERROR

**3** An example of the calculation and the use of SEs in relation to estimates of persons is as follows. Table 3 shows the estimated number of permanent part-time employees in Australia was 648,100. Since this estimate is between 500,000 and 1,000,000 the table of SEs shows that the SE for Australia will lie between 11,650 and 15,300 and can be approximated by interpolation as 12,700 (rounded to the nearest 100). Therefore, there are about two chances in three that the value that would have been produced if all dwellings had been included in the survey will fall in the range 635,400 to 660,800 and about 19 chances in 20 that the value will fall within the range 622,700 to 673,500. This example is illustrated in the diagram below.



CALCULATION OF STANDARD **ERROR** continued

As can be seen from the SEs, the smaller the estimate, the higher is the RSE. Very small estimates are thus subject to such high SEs (relative to the size of the estimate) as to detract seriously from their value for most reasonable uses. In these tables, only estimates with RSEs less than 25% are considered sufficiently reliable for most purposes. However, estimates with larger RSEs have been included and are preceded by an asterisk (e.g. \*3.4) to indicate they are subject to high SEs and should be used with caution.

PROPORTIONS AND **PERCENTAGES** 

Proportions and percentages formed from the ratio of two estimates are also subject to sampling errors. The size of the error depends on the accuracy of both the numerator and the denominator. A formula to approximate the RSE of a proportion is given below:

RSE 
$$(x/y) = \sqrt{[RSE (x)]^2 - [RSE (y)]^2}$$

Considering the example from paragraph 3, the 648,100 permanent part-time employees represent 35.3% of the 1,834,100 part-time employees. The SE of 1,834,100 is approximately 19,300 so the RSE is 1.1%. The RSE for 648,100 is 2.0%. Applying the above formula, the RSE of the proportion is  $\sqrt{(2.0)^2 - (1.1)^2}$  or 1.7%, giving a SE for the proportion (35.3%) of 0.6 percentage point. Therefore, there are about two chances in three that the proportion of permanent part-time employees is between 34.7% and 35.9% and 19 chances in 20 that the proportion is within the range 34.1% to 36.5%.

**DIFFERENCE** 

Published estimates may also be used to calculate the difference between two survey estimates (of numbers or percentages). Such an estimate is subject to sampling error. The sampling error of the difference between two estimates depends on their SEs and the relationship (correlation) between them. An approximate SE of the difference between two estimates (x-y) may be calculated by the following formula:

SE 
$$(x-y) = \sqrt{[SE (x)]^2 + [SE (y)]^2}$$

- While this formula will only be exact for differences between separate and uncorrelated characteristics or subpopulations, it is expected to provide a good approximation for all differences likely to be of interest in this publication.
- The imprecision due to sampling variability, which is measured by the SE, should not be confused with inaccuracies that may occur because of imperfections in reporting by interviewers and respondents, and errors made in coding and processing data. Inaccuracies of this kind are referred to as the non-sampling error, and they may occur in any enumeration, whether it be a full count or a sample. Every effort is made to reduce the non-sampling error to a minimum by careful design of questionnaires, intensive training and supervision of interviewers, and efficient operating procedures.

#### **GLOSSARY**

Break from work of six months or more

A period of six months or more away from current employer.

**Casual employees** 

Employees who were not entitled to either annual leave or sick leave in their current position. Persons for whom casual or permanent employee status could not be determined were included as casual employees for the purpose of this publication.

Change in hours

Any change in the number of hours usually worked per week.

Change in work

Any of the following changes occurring in the last 12 months in the main job for employees who had worked with their current employer for 12 months or more:

- promoted (excluding owner-managers of incorporated enterprises);
- transferred (excluding owner-managers of incorporated enterprises);
- changed hours;
- changed location;
- new, different or extra duties; or
- more responsibility.

### Changed location of employment

In capital cities and major towns each suburb is considered to be a different location. Where an employee works at different sites for the same employer (for e.g. a construction worker) their base of operations (e.g. the employer's office, depot, yard, etc.) is considered to be their place of work. Movements within the same building or between buildings in the same complex (e.g. school, hospital) are not considered to be changes of location.

**Current employer** 

The employer or business that the employee worked for in their main job in the reference week.

**Current position** 

The position in which the employee worked in their main job in the reference week. A position is defined as work for an employer with a particular set of duties and level of responsibility.

**Educational attainment** 

The highest qualification completed by the respondent, classified according to the *ABS Classification of Qualifications (ABSCQ)* (Cat. no. 1262.0).

#### **Employee**

A person who works for a public or private employer and receives remuneration in wages, salary, commission, tips, or piece-rates, or in their business, either with or without employees, if that business was incorporated. School students aged 15-20 years and persons who worked solely for payment in kind, were excluded from the scope of this survey.

### **Expected duration of main** iob

Length of time the employee expects to work for current employer.

### Formal assessment of performance

An assessment of an employee's work performance by the employee's supervisor or other nominated person.

#### Formal childcare

Includes any arrangements made for the care of children under 12 years of age in registered childcare, such as family day care or a childcare centre.

#### Formal training

Includes any work-related courses that the respondent attended. These training courses were required to be given with structured course notes and/or conducted by a presenter. These courses are usually conducted away from the respondent's work area, at a predetermined time and place.

#### **Full-time employee**

Employees who answer 'yes' to the question 'Is your main job full-time?'.

#### Industry

The industry of the employer at the location where the employee works, classified according to the Australian and New Zealand Standard Industrial Classification (ANZSIC), 1993 (Cat. no. 1292.0).

### Length of time in current position

The length of time in the position in which the employee worked during the reference week. The length of time the employee has held their current position can exceed the length of time they have worked for their employer where their employer is a business which has changed ownership but, where the employee's position has not changed.

### Length of time with current employer

The length of time the employee has worked for that employer/business in all positions.

### Main English-speaking countries

Comprises Canada, Ireland, New Zealand, South Africa, United Kingdom and the United States of America.

#### Main job

The job in which most hours were usually worked.

## Most recent period of employment

Employees who had been previously employed by their current employer/business, terminated that employment through resignation, retrenchment or redundancy and then subsequently were re-employed by the same employer, are considered to have had more than one period of employment. Employees who have had extended periods of leave, whether paid or unpaid (e.g. maternity leave), are considered to have had only one period of employment with that employer.

**Occupation** Classified according to the Australian Standard Classification of

Occupation, ASCO — Australian Standard Classification of Occupations,

Second Edition (Cat. no. 1220.0).

Owner managers of incorporated enterprises

Persons who reported that they worked in their own business, either with or without employees, and that business was a limited liability

company. These persons are classified as employees.

**Part-time employees** Employees who answered 'no' to the question 'Is your main job

full-time?'.

**Post-school qualifications** Any of the following educational qualifications completed by the person:

bachelor degree or higher, undergraduate diploma, associate diploma,

skilled vocational qualification or basic vocational qualification.

**Promotion** A permanent increase in wage or salary and an increase in responsibility

or complexity of work. Temporary promotions, acting and temporary

higher duties are excluded from this category.

Sector Classification of a respondent's employer as a public or private

enterprise. Public sector includes local government authorities, government departments, agencies and authorities created by, or reporting to, the Commonwealth Parliament and State Parliaments. In November 1998, there were 42,503 persons for whom sector could not be determined. These persons were included in the private sector for the

purpose of this publication.

Size of location Number of persons employed at the location of the respondent's main

job.

Transfer A change of position without a change in either the level of responsibility

or wages or salary. Both employer-initiated and employee-initiated

transfers are included.

Weekly earnings Amount of 'Last total pay' from wage and salary job prior to the interview

> (i.e. before taxation and other deductions had been made). For persons paid other than weekly, earnings were converted to a weekly equivalent. No adjustment was made for any back payment of wage increases or

prepayment of leave, etc.
