

JUNE QTR KEY POINTS

THE TRANSPORT (FREIGHT) & STORAGE DIVISION INDEX

 the index rose 0.8% in the June quarter 2000 compared with 0.9% movement in the March quarter 2000.

- the index rose 1.6% between the June quarters 1999 and 2000.
- price increases in water transport (3.7%) and road transport (0.9%) were the main contributors to the overall increase in the index in the June quarter 2000.
- significant increases in the price of international sea transport (6.4%) resulted from higher demand.

THE PROPERTY & BUSINESS SERVICES DIVISION INDEX

- the index rose 2.0% in the June quarter 2000, up from 0.8% in the March quarter 2000.
- the index rose 6.3% between June quarters 1999 and 2000.
- prices of real estate agents services continued to rise (3.3%).
- price decreases in information storage and retrieval services (-4.9%) were due to productivity savings.
- increase in prices of advertising services (24.9%) were associated with the television ratings period.

EXPLANATORY NOTES

INTRODUCTION	1 In recognition of the increasing contribution of service industries to the Australian economy, the ABS has embarked on a long-term development program to progressively extend the scope of the producer price indexes into the service sectors of the economy. First results from this program were published in March 1999, by way of experimental indexes, in Information Paper: <i>Producer Price Index Developments</i> (Cat. no. 6422.0).
	2 This publication presents producer price indexes for the output of the Transport (freight) & Storage Division, and the Property & Business Services Division of the Australian and New Zealand Standard Industrial Classification (ANZSIC). Included are index numbers for each of the divisions and subdivisions and for selected groups and classes. The index numbers are calculated on the reference base 1998–99=100.0.
VALUATION BASIS	3 As services indexes are output indexes the valuation basis is basic prices. The basic price is the amount received by the service provider exclusive of taxes (less subsidies) on products, and transport and trade margins.
CLASSIFICATION	4 The service industry price index development work is being undertaken within the classification framework provided by the ANZSIC.
	5 The Transport (freight) & Storage Division and Property & Business Services Division indexes measure changes in prices of services provided by establishments classified respectively to ANZSIC Division I, Transport (freight) & Storage and ANZSIC Division L, Property & Business Services. Index numbers for these divisions are provided in tables 1 and 2.
	6 Tables 3 and 4 provide an analysis of the contribution of ANZSIC Subdivisions and Groups respectively to the Transport (freight) & Storage Division and the Property & Business Services Division indexes. For example, the Road Transport Subdivision contributed 48.91 index points to the Transport and Storage Division Index number of 101.21 for June quarter 2000. The three digit ANZSIC codes in these tables contribute to the totals of the two digit ANZSIC codes. For example Scientific research (781) index points of 0.68 contribute to the total Business services (78) index points of 44.99. The final column shows contributions to the change in the division index points, by each subdivision and group.
	7 Table 5 contains index numbers for the subdivisions and selected groups and classes of the ANZSIC Transport (freight) & Storage Division I. Transport indexes presented cover freight activities only. That is, passenger transport is excluded.
	8 Table 6 contains index numbers for the subdivisions and selected groups and classes of the ANZSIC Property & Business Services Division L.
WEIGHTS	9 The indexes are fixed weights indexes. The ANZSIC class indexes are aggregated to the relevant group, subdivision and division using weights derived from 1994–95 Input-Output production values, in combination with data from other ABS surveys and industry sources. The weights were revalued to reflect price levels in the reference base year, 1998–99.
PRICE MEASUREMENT	10 Prices are generally obtained from principal providers of the services concerned.
	11 Actual transactions prices are used in the indexes — that is, the prices that service providers actually charge buyers. Price series relate to a set of services

EXPLANATORY NOTES *continued*

PRICE MEASUREMENT continued	with fixed specifications. The aim is to incorporate in the indexes price changes for representative services of constant quality.
	12 The development of these new price collections has involved a wide range of diverse industries with different measurement problems. Accordingly, extensive consultation with industry associations and individual businesses has been undertaken to determine the most viable approach, on a case-by-case basis.
	13 Particular characteristics found within the services sector of the economy have complicated the task of price measurement.
	14 The tendency within many industries to provide unique, one-off services tailored to the needs of the individual customers has posed difficulties in establishing continuity of pricing to constant quality.
	15 The 'bundling' of a range of different component services within the one transaction or contract has required investigation of the feasibility of 'unbundling', that is, obtaining separate prices for each of the components of the total service. Where this has not proven to be feasible, the whole service bundle has been priced in total.

However, as discounts are sometimes negotiated between individual buyers and sellers in relation to particular transactions, the identification of representative discounts has not always been straightforward.
	17 The deregulation of some service industries leads to structural changes and more complex pricing practices. To deal with this, we are continually updating our samples to incorporate new businesses and reviewing pricing methodologies over time.
OTHER SERVICES PRICE INDEXES	18 Indexes have been established for most of the industry classes within the Transport (freight) & Storage Division and Property & Business Services Division.
