NOTES

ABOUT THIS ISSUE

This issue introduces a new commodity classification, based upon the Australian and New Zealand Standard Commodity Classification (ANZSCC) which was used in the previous (1993–94) issue of this publication. The classification covers the full range of manufacturing commodities produced and presents data at a broader level (in most cases) than for the 1993–94 collection. For more information, see paragraphs 4 and 5 of the Explanatory Notes.

BACKGROUND

This publication presents the value of sales and transfers out of commodities manufactured in Australia, compiled from the 1995–96 manufacturing survey together with limited commodity statistics compiled from the 1994–95 manufacturing survey. Data on the quantity of commodities produced are no longer collected as part of the annual manufacturing collection. Data relating to quantities produced were last collected and published for the 1993–94 reference year.

For many of the products included in this publication, corresponding imports and exports data are available. DATA AS CONTAINED IN THIS PUBLICATION

The data contained in this publication have been adjusted for deficiencies in the number of businesses recorded on the Australian Bureau of Statistics (ABS) business register. The nature of these adjustments and the reasons for making them are described in paragraphs 21 and 22 of the Explanatory Notes.

STATE DATA

Because of the nature of the sample design, State level production statistics are not available from the annual manufacturing collection. (However, State level production quantity data for a limited number of commodity items are available from ABS subannual production collections.)

NEW PUBLICATION— Manufacturing, Australia, 1997 (Cat. no. 8225.0) The first issue of *Manufacturing*, *Australia* (Cat. no. 8225.0) is to be released shortly. It is a new compendium publication about manufacturing businesses, which will cover topics such as industry performance, employment and output levels, export activity, cost structures and profits.

In general, data will be presented by broad level of manufacturing industry with most tables presenting data for total manufacturing and its nine major subdivisions. Selected data will be presented in terms of constant prices as well as current prices. You will have access to historical as well as the most recent data and there will be analysis of and commentary on major trends. INTRODUCTION

- **1** This publication presents the value of sales and transfers out of commodities manufactured in Australia, compiled from a survey of manufacturing establishments for each of 1994–95 and 1995–96. From the main sample of approximately 20,000 manufacturing establishments for each of the above years, a sub-sample of establishments was asked to supply information on commodities sold. Data on the quantity of commodities produced are no longer collected as part of the annual manufacturing collection. Data relating to quantities produced were last collected and published for the 1993–94 reference year.
- **2** The manufacturing collection is conducted on an annual basis. Businesses selected in the main sample were asked to provide data on employment, wages and salaries, turnover and the percentage of goods exported. A sub-sample of approximately 7,500 manufacturing establishments for 1994–95 and approximately 5,900 manufacturing establishments for 1995–96 were asked to supply additional information, including the value of sales and transfers out for commodities produced.
- **3** Details of principal commodities produced were previously collected as part of the 1993–94, 1989–90 and 1986–87 manufacturing censuses. In years prior to 1986–87, they were collected annually (except for 1985–86, when no census was conducted). Commodity data are, once again, being collected on an annual basis.
- **4** The commodity classification used in this publication is based on the Australian and New Zealand Standard Commodity Classification (ANZSCC) and covers the full range of manufacturing commodities produced, but presents data at a broader level (in most cases) than the ANZSCC. The ANZSCC covers approximately 2,500 commodities, whereas the classification used in this publication covers approximately 1,000 commodity groupings.
- **5** This new commodity classification was first used to code sales and transfers out of commodities produced for the 1994–95 collection. However, due to its experimental nature, data for a significant number of commodities for that year are not available for publication or dissemination. The commodity classification was modified prior to its use in the 1995–96 collection and data for the full range of commodities collected are included in this publication. Where comparable data are available for 1994–95, these data are also included.

SCOPE AND COVERAGE

6 The statistics in this publication relate to all manufacturing establishments which operated in Australia during the years ended 30 June 1995 and 30 June 1996, except for those manufacturers not employing staff at 30 June 1995 and 30 June 1996 (respectively) (such as sole proprietorships or family partnerships) which had not registered as group employers with the Australian Taxation Office. Though a substantial number, these businesses would contribute only marginally to aggregate data were they to be included. Also excluded is the production from establishments predominantly engaged in non-manufacturing activities but which also undertake limited manufacturing activities. However, except for a few commodities, the effect of this on production levels is marginal. In addition, the ABS attempts to obtain data for those businesses which ceased operation during the year, but it is not possible to obtain data for all of them.

STANDARD UNITS

Establishment

7 The establishment is the smallest accounting unit of a business, within a State or Territory, controlling its productive activities and maintaining a specified range of detailed data enabling value added to be calculated. In general, an establishment covers all operations at a physical location, but may consist of a group of locations provided they are within the same State or Territory. The majority of establishments operate at one location only.

Manufacturing establishment

8 An establishment predominantly engaged in manufacturing activities. The data collected for such establishments cover all activities of the establishment (including non-manufacturing activities). Conversely, there are some establishments predominantly engaged in non-manufacturing activities which also undertake limited manufacturing activities and which are excluded.

COMMODITY ITEMS COLLECTED

- **9** In summary, the value of sales and transfers out relates to goods sold or transferred during the year excluding goods resold without processing. In general, sales values represent the amounts received by manufacturers, minus sales taxes, excise duties and delivery or installation charges (where separately invoiced to customers). Exports are valued on a Free on Board basis. Transfers (goods produced then physically transferred elsewhere within the same business for sale or further processing) are valued at commercial value i.e. the amount that would have been received had the goods been sold to another business (also net of taxes, etc.). Further information on the valuation of goods sold or transferred is in paragraphs 10 to 13.
- **10** Manufacturing establishments were asked to report the value of sales of specified products that they had manufactured or that had been manufactured on commission for them. (See below for an explanation of the treatment of transactions which are carried out on a commission basis.)
- **11** The valuation which was sought was the factory selling value. The concept of factory selling value is the amount which was paid by the purchaser (after deducting discounts but ignoring trade-ins) to the manufacturer minus any sales taxes or excise duties payable to the government or any charges for delivery or installation. However, it was not always possible for manufacturers to net off the value of delivery or installation, so reported values will include those elements in some cases.
- **12** Where businesses operate more than one establishment, they are asked to report for each manufacturing establishment the value of those products which are manufactured and then transferred to another establishment either for sale or for further processing. Excluded are any products which are transferred to other establishments for storage or quality inspection, testing, etc. purposes.
- **13** Transfers out are valued at factory selling value or as near to that as practicable.

EXPLANATORY NOTES continued

PRODUCT 'MARKET' CONCEPT

- **14** Generally, the statistics in this publication, along with corresponding imports and exports data, provide a good indicator of the size of the 1994–95 and 1995–96 Australian market for a particular product.
- **15** However, caution is needed when using the data for this purpose for products which have significant amounts manufactured on a commission basis.

COMMISSION MANUFACTURING

- **16** Manufacturing on a commission basis involves one establishment manufacturing or assembling products using materials provided by another establishment (generally an establishment owned by a different business). The establishment which provides the materials retains ownership of those materials and, thus, of the manufactured products made from them.
- **17** As products can only be sold by their owner, only the owning establishment can report the value of sales (and transfers out) in the manufacturing collection. In the case of commission production, the owning establishment reports the sales of products made for it on commission whereas the establishment which actually manufactures the products does not report any sales of goods produced as it does not own them.
- **18** Provided that the owning establishment is a manufacturing establishment and is, therefore, included in the scope of the manufacturing collection, there will be no gaps in market measurement as a result of commission arrangements. However, where products are manufactured on commission for non-manufacturing establishments, the sales value of that manufacturing will not be represented by the statistics in this publication.
- **19** Commission manufacturing occurs to some extent in most manufacturing industries and quite commonly on behalf of non-manufacturers. However, the scale of commission operations of this type is not generally high, except for products related to the textile and clothing industries.

RELIABILITY OF ESTIMATES

20 For information on this subject, see the section Technical Note.

DATA ADJUSTED

- **21** All data in this publication have been adjusted to allow for lags in processing new businesses to the ABS business register, and the omission of some businesses from the business register. First, adjustments have been made to allow for new businesses which had commenced operations but for which details had not been processed to the ABS business register in time for inclusion in the annual manufacturing industry collection. Adjustments of this type will continue to be applied in future periods. Second, some adjustments have been made for businesses which had been in existence for several years, but, for various reasons, were not previously added to the ABS business register. The ABS is remedying these omissions and all of the omitted businesses will be included in estimates from the 1996–97 census.
- **22** The majority of businesses affected by these lags and omissions and to which both types of adjustments apply are small in size. As a guide, the effect on 1995–96 total Australian turnover is an adjustment of 0.2%.

COMPARABILITY WITH PREVIOUS STATISTICS

23 The 1994–95 manufacturing survey introduced an experimental commodity classification into the manufacturing collection. The classification was modified prior to its use in the 1995–96 manufacturing survey. For further information, see paragraphs 4 and 5 of these Explanatory Notes.

ACKNOWLEDGMENT STATEMENT

24 ABS publications draw extensively on information provided freely by individuals, businesses, governments and other organisations. Their continued cooperation is very much appreciated: without it, the wide range of statistics published by the ABS would not be available. Information received by the ABS is treated in strict confidence as required by the *Census and Statistics Act 1905*.

TECHNICAL NOTE DATA RELIABILITY

SAMPLE ERROR

The data contained in this publication have been obtained from a sample of manufacturers. As such, these data are subject to sampling variability; that is, they may differ from the figures that would have been produced if the data had been obtained from all manufacturers in the population. One measure of the likely difference is given by the standard error, which indicates the extent to which an estimate might have varied by chance because the data were obtained from only a sample of units. There are about two chances in three that a sample estimate will differ by less than one standard error from the figure that would have been obtained if the data had been obtained from all units, and about 19 chances in 20 that the difference will be less than two standard errors.

The standard error can also be expressed as a percentage of the estimate, and this is known as the relative standard error. The relative standard error for most of the data contained in this publication is 24% or less. Detailed relative standard errors can be made available on request.

The effects of sampling variability have a particular relevance to the data contained in this publication. This is because the sample design is based on a sample of manufacturers classified by industry (who then report a value for all of the individual commodities that they sell or transfer out), rather than being based on a list of manufacturers of the various commodities. The sample is also orientated towards the larger businesses. As a result, it is possible that where the value of sales and transfers out for a particular commodity is shown as nil, this could be purely because no manufacturers of that commodity were selected in the industry-based sample. Commodities with a minimal value of sales and transfers out could be purely of this size for similar reasons. The effect is particularly important where either there are few producers of a commodity or there are many producers of the commodity but they are all (or mainly) small in size.

NON-SAMPLE ERROR

The imprecision due to sampling variability, which is measured by the standard error, should not be confused with inaccuracies that may occur because of inadequacies in available sources from which the population frame was compiled, imperfections in reporting by providers, errors made in collection such as in recording and coding data, and errors made in processing data. Inaccuracies of this kind are referred to collectively as non-sampling error and they may occur in any enumeration, whether it be a full count or a sample.

While it is not possible to quantify non-sampling error, every effort is made to reduce it to a minimum. Collection forms are designed to be easy to complete and assist businesses to report accurately. Efficient and effective operating procedures and systems are used to compile the statistics. In addition, the ABS has undertaken a program of upgrading the business register. This on-going upgrade has resulted in improvements in the quality of the statistical series whose population frames are drawn from the register.
