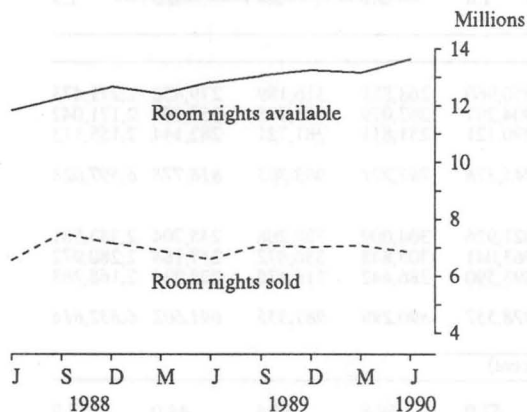

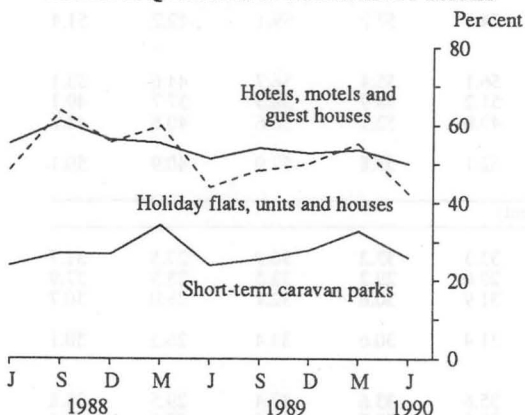
MAIN FEATURES**CHART 1: QUARTERLY ROOM NIGHTS AVAILABLE AND ROOM NIGHTS SOLD; HOTELS, MOTELS AND GUEST HOUSES**

Rooms available in Australian hotels and motels with facilities increased by 5.6 per cent to 150,686 in June quarter 1990 compared with 142,662 in June quarter 1989. Room nights sold, however, increased by only 3.6 per cent from 6.60 million to 6.83 million over the same period.

Consequently, during this period, the room occupancy rate for hotels and motels decreased to 50.1 per cent from 51.4 per cent (and 55.3 per cent in June quarter 1988).

The number of holiday units, flats and houses available for short term letting increased by 3.6 per cent compared with June Quarter 1989 to 32,137 in June quarter 1990, but unit nights occupied remained constant at 1.2 million.

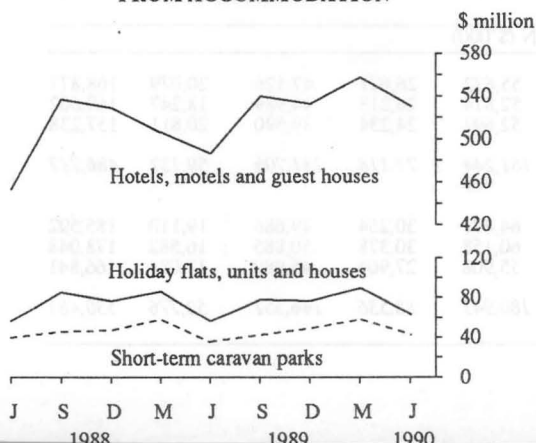
The occupancy rate for holiday units, flats and houses at 42.5 per cent in June quarter 1990 decreased compared with 44.0 per cent in June quarter 1989 and 48.6 per cent in June quarter 1988.

CHART 2: QUARTERLY OCCUPANCY RATES

In the same period, short-term caravan park capacity decreased by 2.0 per cent from 189,755 to 185,954 powered and unpowered sites and cabins. Capacity of long-term caravan parks, however, increased by 8.0 per cent to 98,850 sites and cabins.

The short-term caravan park site occupancy rate increased to 25.8 per cent in June quarter 1990 compared with 23.8 per cent in the June quarters of both 1989 and 1988.

Takings from accommodation for hotels and motels increased by 9.0 per cent from \$487m to \$530m in the period June quarter 1989 to June quarter 1990, while average tariff per room night sold increased by 5.2 per cent from \$74 to \$78.

CHART 3: QUARTERLY TAKINGS FROM ACCOMMODATION

For holiday units, flats and houses, accommodation takings increased by 11.9 per cent during the year to \$63m in June quarter 1990.

Compared with the same quarter last year, accommodation takings for short-term caravan parks increased by 18.9 per cent to \$42m in June quarter 1990. Accommodation takings for long-term caravan parks increased by 18.5 per cent to \$40m over the same period.

EXPLANATORY NOTES

Introduction

1. This publication contains results, for Australia and each State and Territory, of the quarterly surveys of tourist accommodation establishments.

Scope and Coverage

2. Up to the June Quarter 1986 survey a tourist accommodation establishment was defined, for the purpose of the survey, as an establishment which predominantly provides short-term accommodation (i.e. for periods of less than 2 months) available to the general public. Commencing with the September Quarter 1986 survey, the definition was extended to include all caravan parks (whether predominantly providing short-term or long-term accommodation). This change was made because predominantly long-term caravan parks also provide a significant number of sites for short-term accommodation.

3. Commencing with September Quarter 1987, the scope of the tourist accommodation survey was expanded to include holiday flats, units and houses (HFUs) available to the general public for short-term accommodation.

4. Although efforts have been made to validate the statistics relating to HFUs, some caution should be exercised in the interpretation of these results. In collecting this information it was difficult, not only to accurately identify all inscope HFUs, but also to ensure that misreporting did not occur. For example, where a HFU is listed with more than one letting entity there is a chance of multiple reporting resulting in an over enumeration of HFUs available for letting and a corresponding under enumeration in occupancy rates. It is also possible that some units regarded as out of the scope of the survey, such as 'time share', have been included. These particular deficiencies are not considered to invalidate the trends which are apparent in the data and should not greatly affect the data on unit nights, unit lettings and takings.

5. Tourist accommodation establishments currently included in the survey are:

- (a) *Licensed hotel with facilities.* An accommodation establishment which is licensed to operate a public bar, provides a bath or shower and toilet in most guest rooms, and has breakfast available for guests.
- (b) *Motel, licensed or unlicensed, private hotel or guest house with facilities.* An accommodation establishment which provides a bath or shower and toilet in most guest rooms and has breakfast available for guests but is not licensed to operate a public bar. This category also includes motels that are licensed to serve liquor with meals.
- (c) *Caravan park.* An accommodation establishment which provides powered sites for caravans and toilet, shower and laundry facilities for residents. A *short-term caravan park* is one which is

predominantly occupied by short-term residents (i.e. guests staying for less than 2 months). A *long-term caravan park* is one predominantly occupied by long-term guests (i.e. residents staying for 2 months or more).

- (d) *Holiday flats, units and houses.* Flats, units and houses which are available to the general public for short-term accommodation (i.e. for periods of less than 2 months) and are operated either by owners or managers who have sole letting rights to at least 5 flats, units or houses or by real estate agents for short-term letting, where the majority of such flats, units or houses are self-contained in terms of cooking, bath (or shower) and toilet facilities and do not have breakfast available for guests.

6. Data collected and published for each type of establishment include both long-term and short-term residents at these establishments.

Definitions

7. *Number of establishments* - the number of tourist accommodation establishments within the scope of the survey which operated during the survey period. Included are those establishments which operated for any part of the quarter or which closed temporarily for the quarter because of seasonal reasons. Generally speaking establishments comprising more than one type of accommodation activity referred to in paragraph 5 above (e.g. a motel with attached caravan park) are treated as two separate establishments. However, self-contained units, flats, cabins etc. attached to hotels/motels or to caravan parks are included in the capacity for those establishments and are not treated as separate holiday flat, unit or house establishments.

8. *Number of letting entities* - for holiday flats, units and houses, the number of owners, managers or real estate agents within the scope of the survey who operated for any part of the survey period.

9. *Guest rooms* - the maximum number of rooms, units, suites, etc. available for accommodating paying guests at hotels and motels with facilities during the survey period.

10. *Bed spaces* - the maximum number of bed spaces (excluding cots) available to accommodate paying guests at hotels and motels with facilities during the survey period. Three-quarter beds are classified as single beds; double beds are counted as two bed spaces.

11. *Guest arrivals* - the total number of paying guests counted on the first night they stayed at the accommodation establishment during the survey period.

12. *Room nights sold* - the total number of nights each guest room is occupied by a paying guest during the survey period.

13. *Guest nights* - the total number of nights each paying guest stayed during the survey period.

14. *Room occupancy rate* - the proportion of guest rooms occupied to the number of guest rooms available during the survey period expressed as a percentage.

15. *Bed occupancy rate* - the proportion of bed spaces occupied to the number of bed spaces available during the survey period expressed as a percentage.

16. *Average length of stay* is expressed in a number of days and calculated:

(a) for hotels, motels and guest-houses, by dividing guest nights by guest arrivals; and

(b) for holiday flats, units and houses, by dividing unit nights by unit lettings.

17. *Room nights available* - the total number of guest rooms multiplied by the number of days in the quarter.

18. *Powered sites* - the maximum number of sites with provision for connection to electric power supply which are available at caravan parks for accommodating paying guests during the survey period. Included are powered sites occupied by on-site vans.

19. *Unpowered sites* - the maximum number of sites with no provision for connection to electric power supply which are available at caravan parks for accommodating paying guests during the survey period.

20. *Cabins, flats, etc.* - the maximum number of cabins, flats, units and villas which are available at caravan parks for accommodating paying guests during the survey period.

21. *Site nights* - the total number of nights each powered/unpowered site, cabin, flat, etc. is occupied by a paying guest during the survey period.

22. *Sites occupied by long-term residents* - the total number of sites occupied by long-term residents (i.e. guests who have stayed continuously for 2 months or more) at the end of the survey period.

23. *Site occupancy rate* - the proportion of site nights to the total caravan park capacity available during the survey period expressed as a percentage. Unoccupied vans are treated as vacant sites.

24. *Units* - the maximum number of holiday flats, units and houses available for short-term accommodation.

25. *Unit nights* - the total number of nights each holiday flat, unit or house is occupied during the survey period.

26. *Unit occupancy rate* - the proportion of unit nights to total units available during the survey period expressed as a percentage.

27. *Unit lettings* - the total number of times a holiday flat, unit or house was occupied by a new tenant, counted only on the first night it was occupied by the new tenant.

28. *Takings from accommodation* - revenue received from the provision of short-term and long-term accommodation at tourist accommodation establishments. Takings from meals are excluded. Takings from accommodation for each month represent the takings received during that month. Where payments are received in advance of, or after, the provision of accommodation to guests, the monthly figure for takings from accommodation may not necessarily bear a direct relationship to the number of guests accommodated during the month. Rental and storage fees paid to caravan parks for the keeping of private vans in parks are included in the takings of the month they are received.

29. *Star grading* - the grading of hotels and motels with facilities and is based on the classification system used by members of the Australian Automobile Association (AAA). The gradings are allocated according to a points system based on the amenities and facilities available to guests. Details of the grading scheme are contained in the RACV-RAASA members' publication "Australian National Tourguide", or the individual tour guides produced by members of the AAA.

30. Up to the December quarter 1989, the star gradings of some establishments in Western Australia were based on the Licensing Court of Western Australia classification system. However from the March quarter 1990, all star gradings were based on the AAA classification system.

Unpublished statistics

31. The ABS may also make available on request certain unpublished tourist accommodation statistics, including employment statistics. A charge may be made for this information.

Related publications

32. Publications for Australia, and each State and Territory, are released by the respective offices of the ABS. Tourist accommodation statistics for past quarters are available in earlier publications commencing with the September Quarter 1975. These and some unpublished statistics for certain small areas within States (e.g. local government areas or combinations of local government areas) are available upon request. From September Quarter 1980 a dissection of the statistics shown in this publication, according to size of establishment, is available on request for each State (Territories excluded).
