




MARCH QUARTER 1993 — KEY POINTS

TREND ESTIMATES

- The trend estimate of gross domestic product — average (GDP(A)), increased by 0.6% in the March quarter 1993.
- The growth recorded in March quarter follows a similar increase (0.7%) in December quarter 1992.
- The trend estimate of GDP(A) has increased by 2.6% since the March quarter 1992.
- The trends of all three independent measures of GDP (I, E and P) have shown modest growth over each of the last six quarters.
- The trend in GDP(A) per capita has increased marginally in each of the last six quarters, after declining for the previous two years.

SEASONALLY ADJUSTED ESTIMATES

- The movements in seasonally adjusted GDP(A) over the last three quarters are similar to those of the trend estimates, with consecutive percentage movements of 0.7%, 1.0% and 0.5% compared with 0.7%, 0.7% and 0.6% for the trend estimate in September 1992, December 1992 and March 1993 respectively.
- There is more diversity of movement between the three independent measures in the March quarter: GDP(I) grew by 1.0%, GDP(E) by 0.3% and GDP(P) by 0.1%.

REVISIONS THIS QUARTER

Revisions to the current price income and expenditure estimates have been mainly confined to the December quarter 1992. On the income side wages, salaries and supplements were revised down by \$615 million. However, significant upward revisions to gross operating surplus of corporate trading enterprises (\$403 million) and unincorporated enterprises (\$497 million) have more than offset the change to wages, salaries and supplements. On the expenditure side there were relatively small revisions to private gross fixed capital expenditure; largely offsetting revisions to the components of increase in stocks; and an upward revision of \$269 million to exports. The net effect of all revisions in December quarter 1992, in seasonally adjusted constant price terms, was to increase growth in GDP(I) from 0.2% to 0.4% and in GDP(E) from 1.3% to 1.8%.

Estimates for GDP(P) were revised in September and December quarters as a result of the availability of more complete survey data. In September quarter 1992 the estimates for several industries were revised down, with changes to Finance, property and business services and Community services being the most significant, while in December quarter 1992 the revisions to various industries were largely offsetting. In that quarter the largest revisions were to Construction (up \$238 million) and Finance, property and business services (down \$216 million). Consequently, the seasonally adjusted movements in GDP(P) were revised down by 0.4 percentage points in September quarter 1992 and up by 0.4 percentage points in December quarter 1992.

Revisions to trend GDP(A) were relatively insignificant, being limited to no more than 0.1% in any quarter.

CHANGES IN THIS ISSUE

Additional tables (Tables 7 and 9) have been included to provide contributions to growth in GDP(I) and GDP(P) in seasonally adjusted terms. Long-term current price series for gross farm product and gross non-farm product in trend, seasonally adjusted and original terms have been included in a new table (Table 72). Three additional selected analytical series (sales, private non-farm stock levels at average 1989-90 prices, and GDP(A) at average 1989-90 prices per capita) have been included in the long-term tables (see Tables 75 and 76). Consequently, three of the selected series previously published in Tables 72 and 73 have been moved to a new table, Table 77, which shows these three series in both trend and seasonally adjusted terms. Most tables have been re-numbered as a result of the changes outlined above.

FINAL CONSUMPTION EXPENDITURE

- Private expenditure rose by 0.2%. Declines in purchases of motor vehicles and net expenditure overseas partially offset increases in other items.

GROSS FIXED CAPITAL EXPENDITURE

- There was a seasonally adjusted fall of 0.1% in dwelling investment in March quarter 1993 with the result that trend growth in expenditure on dwellings (2.7%) was slower than in each of the previous four quarters.
- Business investment rose 0.2%. A decline of 2.7% in non-dwelling construction largely offset a 1.6% increase in equipment. The purchase of a power station from the public sector in Victoria in December quarter 1992 has had a marked effect on the seasonally adjusted growth in private business investment and public enterprises investment in the last two quarters (see page 8).

INCREASE IN PRIVATE NON-FARM STOCKS

- The wholesale trade and manufacturing industries continued to rundown their stocks. While the retail trade industry recorded a rundown in seasonally adjusted terms (\$179 million), its stocks still increased in trend terms.

EXPORTS OF GOODS AND SERVICES

- A seasonally adjusted fall of 3.7% resulted in a marked slow-down in the trend rate of increase in exports (0.7% in March quarter).

IMPORTS OF GOODS AND SERVICES

- The trend growth was zero in March quarter 1993. In seasonally adjusted terms, imports fell by 1.7%.

MARCH QUARTER 1993

AGRICULTURE, FORESTRY, FISHING AND HUNTING

- Increased by 1.2% in March quarter despite a 2.4% decline in seasonally adjusted terms. This industry has now grown by 8.4% since March quarter 1992, largely reflecting growth in the farm sector.

MINING

- Although the seasonally adjusted estimate increased by 1.8% in March quarter, it was not sufficient to result in a trend increase. In the last three quarters, this industry has declined by 0.4%, 0.7% and 0.5%. Lower oil and gas production is largely responsible.

MANUFACTURING

- Increased 1.1% this quarter, the third in succession after a long period of decline.

CONSTRUCTION

- Rose 0.6% in the March quarter and has now recorded growth in each of the last three quarters.

WHOLESALE AND RETAIL TRADE

- In seasonally adjusted terms, both the Wholesale and Retail industries declined in the March quarter. However, growth in the December quarter 1992 seasonally adjusted estimates was sufficiently strong for the trend growth to remain positive.

TRANSPORT AND STORAGE

- An increase of 1.1% in March quarter is largely due to significant growth in the Air transport sector which has now grown by 11.6% since March quarter 1992.

COMMUNICATION

- Increased by 1.7%, following increases of similar magnitude in previous quarters. Since March quarter 1992 this industry has grown by 8.5%.


WAGES, SALARIES AND SUPPLEMENTS

- Rose by 0.5% during the March quarter 1993.
- The rise reflects an increase of 1.1% in the underlying average earnings and a 0.6% fall in the number of wage and salary earners.

GROSS OPERATING SURPLUS


- GOS of private corporate trading enterprises grew by 3.2% in March quarter 1993, to a level 7.6% higher than in March quarter 1992.

ANALYSES AND COMMENTS

RELIABILITY OF CONTEMPORARY TREND ESTIMATES

Seasonally adjusted series include both the trend effects and all the irregular effects which influence movements in a series. As a result, they are generally not good indicators of the underlying behaviour of a series. On the other hand, trend estimates represent the underlying direction of the series, excluding seasonal effects and residual/irregular factors. Trend estimates are calculated by smoothing the seasonally adjusted series using a statistical procedure based on centred Henderson moving averages. The procedure used is designed to minimise distortions in the trend level, turning point shape and timing of turning points.

For the most recent quarters, insufficient data exist to use centred Henderson moving averages to calculate the trend values and so approximations to the Henderson moving averages are used for the latest three quarters. The result is that revisions to the trend estimates for the last few quarters are unavoidable, even if none of the original data have been revised. More details about trend estimation are contained in the ABS Information Paper *A Guide to Interpreting Time Series - Monitoring "Trends"; An Overview* (1348.0) which was released on 19 April 1993.

Potential revisions to trend estimates can be indicated by showing the effects of particular changes in seasonally adjusted estimates that might occur in the next quarter. The table below shows the trend estimates for the last few quarters and the values to which they would be revised if the notional movements in seasonally adjusted GDP(A) actually occurred in June quarter 1993.



Seasonally adjusted growth of 0.9% is required in June quarter 1993 to maintain the trend growth of 0.6% currently estimated for March quarter 1993. For comparison, the average growth in those quarters from September quarter 1959 to date for which a positive quarterly change was recorded is about 1.0%, while the average fall in those quarters in which declines were recorded is about 0.2%.

HOUSEHOLD SAVING RATIO


The proportion of household disposable income devoted to consumption in the March quarter was 93.4%. The balance, *household saving*, was 6.6%. Caution should be exercised in interpreting this ratio in recent years, because major components of household income and expenditure may still be subject to significant revisions. The impact of these revisions on the saving ratio can be quite marked, even causing changes in the apparent direction of the trend. The following graph presents the household saving ratio, derived from trend data, from March quarter 1977 onwards (see Explanatory Notes, paragraph 26).



PRIVATE NON-FARM STOCKS TO SALES RATIO

In trend current price book value terms, private non-farm stocks increased by \$348 million (0.6%) during March quarter 1993, while sales increased by \$626 million (1.0%). Consequently, the stocks to sales ratio decreased marginally from 0.918 to 0.915. The following graph presents the ratio of trend private non-farm stocks to trend sales at current prices from March quarter 1977 onward (see Explanatory Notes, paragraph 24).

TREND**



IMPORTS TO SALES RATIO

The imports to sales ratio, trended, at current prices rose to 0.222 in March quarter 1993 from a level of 0.217 in December quarter 1992. Trend endogenous imports rose 3.1% while trend sales rose by only 1.0%. The following graph presents this ratio from March quarter 1977 onwards.

PRIVATE GROSS FIXED CAPITAL EXPENDITURE — NON-DWELLING CONSTRUC- TION AND EQUIPMENT

The December quarter 1992 estimates for non-dwelling construction and equipment were affected by a number of large one-off transactions. The sale of a power station by the Victorian government showed up as a significant increase in purchases from the public sector for both non-dwelling construction and equipment in December quarter 1992. A large part of the fall in these components in March quarter 1993 is due to this factor. The new equipment expenditure estimates were also significantly affected by purchases for the Goodwyn A off-shore platform and the OPTUS B1 satellite in December quarter 1992. There was only one significant "one-off" purchase in March quarter 1993 (a LNG tanker).

Details of recent transactions in second-hand assets between the private and public sectors are provided in the table below, along with investment on new equipment and new work on non-dwelling construction. All estimates are shown at average 1989-90 prices.

PUBLIC GROSS FIXED CAPITAL EXPENDITURE

The trend estimate of public gross fixed capital expenditure rose by 1.9% in March quarter. Public enterprise expenditure increased by 1.2% and general government increased by 2.7%. The rise in expenditure by public enterprises largely reflects the effects on movements between December quarter 1992 and March quarter 1993 of the power station sale in December quarter 1992 (noted above). In seasonally adjusted terms the quarterly changes were much more pronounced as a result of this factor. Public enterprise GFCE was up by 47.7% in seasonally adjusted terms in March quarter 1993.

ANALYSES AND COMMENTS *continued*

EXPORTS OF GOODS AND SERVICES

The implicit price deflator (IPD) derived from the trend estimates of exports increased by 1.3% in March quarter 1993. This contrasts with the 0.1% decline in the original fixed weighted index. Declines in the prices of gold and wool, which impacted on the fixed weighted index, are offset by the declining contribution of these items to the volume of exports. The increase in the relative weight of exported services is also a contributing factor to the IPD movement, as prices have increased more rapidly for services than for most exported goods.


IMPORTS OF GOODS AND SERVICES

The implicit price deflator (IPD) derived from the trend estimates of imports increased by 1.6% in March quarter 1993. The original fixed weighted index rose by 1.2%. A significant contribution to this rise is made by transport equipment. Both road vehicles and other transport equipment have experienced substantial price increases in the last few years. A major factor in this increase is the continuing decline in the value of the \$A relative to the Yen.

TERMS OF TRADE

The terms of trade (see Explanatory Notes, paragraph 16) declined 0.2% in March quarter 1993, reflecting the combined effects of increases of 1.3% in export prices and 1.6% in import prices. The exchange rate gains against some currencies apparent over the March quarter 1993 are offset by the longer term trend of declining export prices relative to import prices. The seasonally adjusted terms of trade for March quarter increased by 0.7%. The following graph shows the trend terms of trade (1989-90=100) from March quarter 1985 to March quarter 1993.


TERMS OF TRADE (1989-90 = 100)

REAL GROSS DOMESTIC INCOME

GDP at constant prices is a measure of the volume of goods and services produced in Australia. If the terms of trade change significantly over the period of comparison, then this measure of real GDP will not accurately reflect the change in real purchasing power of the income generated by domestic production. (See the *Notes on the estimates* section of the December quarter 1990 issue of this publication for a more detailed discussion.) A better measure of the real purchasing power of income generated by domestic production is GDP(I) at average 1989-90 prices adjusted for the terms of trade effect, which is referred to as *real gross domestic income*. The graph below shows trend GDP(I) at average 1989-90 prices and real gross domestic income from March quarter 1983 onwards.



PERSONAL BENEFIT PAYMENTS

Personal benefit payments paid by the Commonwealth government are shown by purpose in Table 41. In March quarter 1993 there has been a change in the classification of certain payments between "Unemployment benefits", "Other benefits" and "Family and child benefits". Family Allowances and the Family Allowance Supplement were replaced on 1 January 1993 by the Basic Family Payment and the Additional Family Payment. Payments under each of these schemes are classified to "Family and child benefits". Under the new arrangements some payments relating to children, previously included in "Unemployment benefits" and "Other benefits", are included in "Family and child benefits" from the March quarter 1993.

EXPLANATORY NOTES

INTRODUCTION

1 This publication contains estimates of the components of GDP and national expenditure and supporting tables for the latest quarter, together with comparative estimates for the eight previous quarters and the last four financial years. Seasonally adjusted and trend estimates of the major aggregates and some selected series are also provided for the latest quarter, together with comparative estimates for the twelve previous quarters. The List of Tables, page 12, shows the full range of data provided.

CONCEPTS, SOURCES AND METHODS

2 These are documented in *Australian National Accounts: Concepts, Sources and Methods* (5216.0). In association with the introduction of constant price estimates at average 1989-90 prices, some of the methods used to derive constant price estimates were changed. The major changes are described in Section 4 of the Information Paper *Australian National Accounts: Introduction of Constant Price Estimates at Average 1989-90 Prices* (5243.0).

ACCURACY OF QUARTERLY ESTIMATES

3 Estimating for a period of less than one year presents special problems. It is often difficult to adhere strictly to definitions used in annual estimates when deriving quarterly ones. This is particularly the case for the quarterly measure of income, because it is not always possible to match the value of production for a quarter with the cost incurred in that production. Difficulties are also encountered in obtaining detailed data for short periods and in preparing consistent estimates from different sources with different accounting procedures and periods. Furthermore, the quarter-to-quarter growth in seasonally adjusted terms is very sensitive to the timing of recording a transaction. If the recording of a transaction is delayed by one quarter, seasonally adjusted movements will be distorted for three consecutive quarters. All these problems affect the accuracy of the current and constant price estimates and should be taken into account in interpreting the estimates.

REVISIONS

4 Most figures are subject to revision as more complete and accurate information becomes available. The revisions are of two types: those made to recent quarters and those made as a consequence of a redistribution across all quarters within a year following revisions to annual totals. Revisions made this quarter are discussed on page 2.

TREND ESTIMATES

5 Given the qualifications regarding the accuracy and reliability of the quarterly national accounts, the ABS considers that trend estimates provide the best guide to the underlying movements, and are more suitable than either the seasonally adjusted or original data for most business decisions and policy advice.

6 A trend estimate is obtained by removing the irregular component from the seasonally adjusted series. For estimates in this publication, it is calculated using a centred 7-term Henderson moving average of the seasonally adjusted series. Estimates for the three most recent quarters cannot be calculated using this centred average method; instead an asymmetric average is used. This can lead to revisions in the trend estimates for the last three quarters when data become available for later quarters, even if none of the original data for earlier quarters have changed.

7 If a series has a high "irregular" component, then the trend estimates will be subject to greater revision for the latest few quarters as data become available for subsequent quarters than would otherwise be the case. However, it is important to note that this

does not make the trend series inferior to the seasonally adjusted or original series. In fact, in such cases the effect of the irregular component on overall movements is likely to be even more marked in the seasonally adjusted and the original estimates than in the trend series.

8 For more information about ABS procedures for deriving trend estimates and analysis of advantages of using them over alternative techniques for monitoring trends, refer to the three ABS Information Papers:

IMPLICIT PRICE DEFULATOR (IPD)

9 The quarterly implicit price deflators (IPDs) are derived by dividing seasonally adjusted and trend current price estimates by the corresponding constant price estimates. Movements in IPDs can be greatly affected by changes in the physical composition of the aggregates and their components. For this reason, quarterly IPDs derived from seasonally adjusted or trend data are preferred to those using original data. The seasonal adjustment process itself is also a possible source of distortion. For further information see Appendix VI of *Australian National Accounts: Concepts, Sources and Methods* (5216.0).

SEASONAL ADJUSTMENT : GENERAL METHOD

10 Data that are affected by seasonal factors are adjusted to remove the effects of these factors. The general methods for doing so are described in Appendix I of *Australian National Accounts: Concepts, Sources and Methods* (5216.0). Three important points should be noted here :

- The methods used in seasonal adjustment do not force the sum of the adjusted estimates for each quarter of a year to equal the original annual total.
- Where constant price estimates have no apparent seasonality in their implicit price deflators, the estimates are adjusted using the corresponding factors for current price estimates.
- Special methods have been used to adjust some components of gross farm product. These concern the adjustment of crop production where production/harvest only occurs in a couple of quarters each year. In these instances, the output for each financial year is distributed equally over the four quarters.

MEASURES OF GDP

GDP(I) INCOME APPROACH

11 GDP(I) is the sum of factor incomes, consumption of fixed capital (depreciation) and net indirect taxes. The preferred current price measure of GDP is GDP(I). It is the overall measure which is consistent with subsidiary measures such as national income and the other consolidated tables (such as the national income and outlay account). GDP(I) also provides the base year benchmarks for the constant price estimates of GDP(P). Constant price estimates of GDP(I) are derived by deflating current price estimates of GDP(I) by the implicit price deflator of CDP(E).

MEASURES OF GDP

**GDP(E)
EXPENDITURE APPROACH**

12 GDP(E) is the sum of all final expenditures, changes in stocks, and exports less imports. Constant price estimates of GDP(E) are the sum of all these components at average 1989-90 prices.

**GDP(P)
PRODUCTION APPROACH**

13 GDP(P) is calculated as the market value of goods and services produced by an industry (i.e. gross output) less the cost of goods and services used in the productive process (i.e. intermediate consumption). Constant price estimates of GDP(P) are the sum of constant price estimates (at average 1989-90 prices) for each industry.

**GDP(A)
THE AVERAGE**

14 While the three measures above are identical in concept, they can differ significantly in practice, especially in the short term, because of the different data sources used for each measure. Using the average of the three, GDP(A), smooths out these differences. GDP(A) is considered by the ABS to be the most satisfactory indicator of short-term seasonally adjusted or trend growth (see the Feature Article in the June quarter 1990 issue of *Australian National Accounts: National Income and Expenditure* (5206.0)).

ANALYSIS OF CONTRIBUTIONS TO GROWTH

15 Tables 6 to 9 present analyses of the contribution provided by each major component to the percentage change in trend and seasonally adjusted estimates of constant price GDP(I) and GDP(P). The figures in each table are additive within each quarter, unlike the percentage changes shown in other tables in this publication. The formula used to calculate the contribution of each aggregate to the growth in GDP is:

$$\frac{A(t) - A(t-1)}{GDP(t-1)} \times 100.0$$

where

- $A(t)$ = value of aggregate A in quarter under consideration
- $A(t-1)$ = value of aggregate A in preceding quarter
- $GDP(t-1)$ = value of GDP in preceding quarter.

TERMS OF TRADE

16 There are several ways of measuring the terms of trade. In this publication, the following index is used :

$$\frac{\text{Implicit price deflator for exports of goods and services}}{\text{Implicit price deflator for imports of goods and services}} \times 100.0$$

Estimates of the terms of trade are shown in Tables 13, 14, 22, 23, 75 and 76.

REAL GROSS DOMESTIC INCOME

17 GDP at constant prices is a measure of the volume of goods and services produced in Australia. If the terms of trade change significantly over the period of comparison, then this measure of real GDP will not accurately reflect the change in real purchasing power of the income generated by domestic production. (See the *Notes on the estimates* section of the December quarter 1990 issue of this publication for a more detailed

discussion of this issue.) A better measure of the real purchasing power of income generated by domestic production is GDP(I) at average 1989-90 prices adjusted for the terms of trade effect, which is referred to as *real gross domestic income* (or real GDI). The following adjustment is made to GDP(I) at constant prices to obtain an estimate of real GDI:

- exports of goods and services at current prices are deflated by the implicit price deflator for imports of goods and services
- the actual constant price value of exports is then deducted from this value, and
- the resultant terms of trade adjustment is then added to GDP(I) at constant prices to give real GDI presented in Tables 75 and 76.

GROSS PRODUCT PER UNIT OF LABOUR INPUT

18 Indexes of constant price gross product per person employed and per hour worked are commonly referred to as measures of labour productivity. However, it should be noted that these indexes reflect not only the contribution of labour to changes in product per unit of labour, but also the contribution of capital and other factors (such as managerial efficiency, economies of scale, etc.).

19 When analysing labour productivity indexes it is critical to note that they are subject to the vagaries of the growth (or business) cycle as well as the effects of any measurement error in either output or labour input. Differences in the amplitude and phase of the output and input cycles can result in labour productivity indexes deviating substantially from their longer term trend. Analytical work undertaken within the ABS suggests that movements in employment and hours worked tend to lag movements in GDP. Over a 20 year period, the lag at turning points in the growth cycle varied between zero and four quarters, with the average being between two and three quarters. The implication is that, in the period of the growth cycle when the growth in output is declining, indexes of labour productivity are likely to decline, particularly if rapid growth in GDP is abruptly ended. Conversely, labour productivity indexes are likely to grow strongly when the economy comes out of a cyclical trough.

20 A simple way to estimate the underlying trend in labour productivity is to compare the values of a labour productivity index spanning a growth cycle e.g. from the peak of one growth cycle to the peak of another. Note that such estimates rest on the assumption that labour is being utilised to the same degree at each growth cycle peak. Average annual growth rates, over growth cycles, of estimates of gross product per hour worked in the *market* and *non-farm market sectors* are shown in *Australian National Accounts: Multifactor Productivity* (5234.0).

MARKET AND NON-FARM MARKET SECTORS

21 The estimates of gross product at constant prices for two industries: Finance, property and business services; and Community services are derived using either deflated input cost data or hours worked as indicators of output. As such, the estimates cannot adequately reflect changes in productivity. For the purposes of measuring changes in productivity, it is therefore preferable that these industries be excluded. The constant price gross product of a group of industries referred to as the *market sector* is defined to be GDP(P) less the above two industries, less Public administration and defence (which is defined to be in the non-market sector, even though an estimate of productivity change is now produced for that industry), less ownership of dwellings (for

which capital stock is used as the indicator of output), plus the imputed bank service charge related to these industries.

22 A second industry group, referred to as the *non-farm market sector*, comprises the market sector *less* Agriculture, forestry, fishing and hunting. Productivity estimates derived for this group are free of the effects caused by the volatility of Agricultural production caused by changing seasonal conditions.

INDEXES OF EMPLOYMENT AND HOURS WORKED

23 The quarterly employment indexes used to derive the gross product per person employed indexes comprise all labour engaged in the production of goods and services and include not only civilian wage and salary earners but also employers; self-employed persons; persons working one hour or more without pay in a family business or on a farm; and members of the Australian defence forces. For details of how the employment and hours worked estimates are formed refer to Section 23 of *Australian National Accounts: Concepts Sources and Methods* (5216.0), and also Section 4 of the Information Paper *Australian National Accounts: Introduction of Constant Price Estimates at Average 1989-90 Prices* (5243.0) which describes changes in methods introduced in conjunction with the rebase of constant price estimates to average 1989-90 prices.

PRIVATE NON-FARM STOCKS TO SALES RATIO

24 The ratio is presented in Tables 75 and 76. The denominator of this ratio, in current price terms, is defined as :

- private final consumption expenditure on goods
- plus private gross fixed capital expenditure on dwellings, non-dwelling construction and equipment
- plus public gross fixed capital expenditure
- plus exports of non-rural goods.

IMPORTS TO SALES RATIO

25 The ratio is endogenous imports (imports of goods excluding fuel, certain large items of equipment and certain other government imports) to sales (as defined in paragraph 24 above). This ratio is presented in Tables 75 and 76.

HOUSEHOLD SAVING RATIO

26 This is the ratio of household saving to household disposable income, where household saving is the difference between household disposable income and private final consumption expenditure. The ratio is a memorandum item in Tables 31 and 32 and is also shown in Table 74.

GDP(A) PER CAPITA

27 This is the ratio of GDP(A) to an estimate of the resident Australian population. For all but the most recent quarters, the resident population data are drawn from *Australian Demographic Statistics* (3101.0). For the most recent quarters, estimates are made by extrapolating from the latest available data.

DATA ON FLOPPY DISK

28 All quarterly series in this publication are available in spreadsheet format on floppy disk, *Australian National Accounts: Quarterly Data on Floppy Disk* (5228.0). These data generally run from September quarter 1959. An important exception is GDP(P) and its components which run from September quarter 1974.
