## SECIION XIV.-STATE FREE EMPLOYMENT: BUREAUX. .

1. General. -In the following paragraphs, particulars are given of 1 the operations of the various State Labour Bureaux. In Labour Roport No. 6 (page 130), attention was drawn to the fact that the systems adopted in the several States for the registration of applications for work and from employers are not uniform, and that the comparisons whioh can be drawn from the figures shewing the results of the operations of these Bureaux are subject to certain limitations.
2. Applications and Positions Filled, 1913 to 1918.-The following table shews the total number of applications for employment and from employers, and the number of positions filled in the Commonwealth during the yoars 1913 to 1918.

During the year 1918 out of overy 1000 applicints for work 551 obtained positions against 446 for the year 1017. The number of applieants for work was slightly larger, and the number of positions filled, 12 jer cent. greater, during the year 1918 than during 1917.

Altention has already been drawn to the fact that there is considerable diversity in the nature and scope of the work ordinarily carried out by the Bureaux in the various States. For example, in some States in which cortain Governnent Dopartments obtain workers from tho Labour Bureaux, the number of workers is natiurally larger in comparison with tho number in the same groups in other States. Thus, of the positions filled in Group IX. (Rail and Tramway Services), 18 per cent. were filled in New South Wales, 54 per cent. in Qucensland, and 27 per cent. in South Australia. In Victoria only 85, in Western Austrolia only 19, and in Thasmania no positions were filled in this group. Practically the whole of the positions filled in Group XIII. (Domestic, Hotels, cte.) wère
in three States, New South Wales, Queensland and Western Australia. Of the positions filled in this group, 6596, or 82 per cent., as against 5571 , or 86 per cent. in 1917, were for female domostic workers, and the whole of these positions were filled in the three above-mentioned States, these being the only States which make special provisions for female workers. In the manufacturing groups (I. to VI.) 47 per cent. of the applicants obtained positions.
5. Applications and Positions Filled during 1918, Males and Females. -The.following table gives particulars, for male and.femble workers separately, of the number of applications for employment, and from employers, and the number of positions filled during the year 1918 :-

Of the total number of registrations for employment during the year 1918, 73,690 , or 89.5 per cent. (against 87.5 per cent. in 1917) wore made by males, and 8638 , or 10.5 per cent., by females. The number of positions filled for males twas 38,439 , or 84.6 per cent. (against 83 per cent. in 1917), and for females, 6977, or 15.4 per cent.

For every 1000 applications for employment from male workers, $52 \%$ positions were filled in 1918, as against 423 in 1917, while for every 1000 applications from female workers, 808 were filled, as against 606 in 1917.
