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## RETAIL SALES OF GOODS : AUSTRALTA <br> MONTH OF MAY 1965 (PROVISIONAL)

A sample survey of retail establishments in Australia is conducted by the Commonwealth Bureau of Census and Statistics each quarter. Sample estimates derived from a full response to that Survey, showing for each State retail sales classified by commodity groups, are published about three months after the end of each quarter. These estimates are subject to revision at a later stage when more precise information is available relating to trading by new businesses.
2. Preliminary quarterly figures f $_{2}$ which are published in less detail about seven or eight weeks after the end of each quarter, are compiled on the basis of a large response from the full quarterly sample. The movement over the corresponding quarter of the preceding year which is shown by the preliminary quarterly estimates of total value of retail sales in Australia (excluding motor vehicles, parts, petrol, etc.) normally differs by less than one per cent. from the corresponding movement shown by the estimates compiled from the ity sample and published about three months after the end of the quarter.
3. Provisional monthly estimates, which are publishecd aboư four weeks after the end of each month, relate only to the total value of retrel sales in Australia (excluding motor vehicles, parts, petrol, etc.) erid are based on monthly returns collected from a sub-sample of the establishments included, in the quarterly sample. The sub-sample is designed to provide an estimate lying within a relatively small range above or below the true figure so as to give an early approximate indication of trend. Undue significance should not be attached to very small movements, or to the exact magnitude of any movements, shown by provisional estimates. These estimates are subsequently adjusted in accordance with quarterly estimates when the latter become available。
4. The provisional estimate for May, 1965 is published in the table overleaf. This table also contains figures for earlier months.
5. Month to month changes in retail sales figures are affected not only by the same seasonal factors as are quarterly figures, but also by differences in the number of days in each month and by variation in types of trading day. As an example of variation in types of trading day, one month might include five Thursdays, Fridays and Saturdays and, of course, four of each of the other days of the week, whereas another month might include five Sundays, Mondays and Tuesdays. Adjustments for these factors have not been made in sales estimates in this bulletin, and this should be borne in mind when comparisons over time are being made.
