Analysis of the ABS Survey of Employment Arrangements, Retirement and Superannuation CURF

Call for Articles

In early 2010, *The Australian Journal of Labour Economics (AJLE)* will publish a thematic issue devoted to articles utilising the Confidentialised Unit Record File (CURF) from the ABS Survey of Employment Arrangements, Retirement and Superannuation (SEARS), accessed through the Remote Access Data Laboratory™ (RADL™).

The ABS introduced the RADL™ in 2003. The facility allows approved clients access to selected CURFs at their desktop via a secure internet link. Using RADL™, clients can run on-line data analyses using SAS, SPSS and Stata. Because the CURFs are kept within the ABS environment, and client activity is monitored, the ABS is able to release more detailed CURF data via RADL™ than can be made available on CD-ROM. The ABS will provide support to assist potential authors in accessing and using RADL™ through the RADL Administrator (radl@abs.gov.au). The RADL Administrator is also the initial contact for support in relation to the particular survey files.¹

All papers submitted will be peer reviewed. The analysis contained in submitted papers should be novel. The determination of the final selection of papers lies with the AJLE. Deadline for Submissions: 31 August 2009
