


State growth rate





Capital city growth










Where do migrants live?





Overseas-born population – Australia 1966-2016













Median personal income






Changes in dwelling tenure






Housing costs – mortgage repayment

Mortgage repayments and household income






Rent and household income

% of households paying >30% monthly income









However the case is different for the major non-Christian religio Reflecting recent trends in migration, the proportion of people reporting a religion other than Christianity in the Census increased 2006 to 8.2% in 2016. Although the increase spreads across most non-Christian religions, it was mainly driven by Hinduism (0.7%

1.9% in 2016), Islam (1.7% to 2.6%) and Sikhism (0.1% to 0.5%). The increase in the proportion of Hinduism and Sikhism is as a re






