I refer to your request submitted 01/05/2023 for access to documents under the Freedom of Information Act 1982 (FOI Act) relating to:

- "1. Documents sent by ABS Senior Executive Staff between 1 October 2022 and 1 May 2023 to the Bureau of Meteorology expressing concerns regarding their name re-branding to 'The Bureau'.
- 2. For the same time period, documents sent internally between ABS SES related to the re-branding of Bureau of Meteorology to 'The Bureau'."

Charges

On 25/05/2023 you were sent an estimate of charges letter, where you were informed the total charge for your request was \$233.00. On 21/06/2023 you responded to this letter, requesting a waiver or reduction on the basis that:

"the estimated hours and quoted charge amount for these hours seems high for what is an already refined scope of the request. Additionally, the information would be in the public interest. It's related to the rebrand of the BOM which was heavily covered by media in recent months and was funded by taxpayers. This information would be used to create a media report, on a news website without a paywall meaning it has a greater potential to reach and benefit more Australia. In light of this information request being of such broad public benefit, I'm hoping the fee can we waived or at least reduced."

Decision and Reasons for Decision

I have decided to grant you a full waiver of charges on the basis that the release is in the public interest.

I have taken the following factors into account in making my decision to reduce or not impose the charges, in line with section 29(5) of the FOI Act:

- a) whether the payment of the charge, or part of it, would cause financial hardship to you; and
- b) whether the giving of access to the document in question is in the general public interest or in the interest of a substantial section of the public.

I have also taken the following factors into account in making my decision, in line with section 4.99 of the FOI Guidelines:

- Whether a commercial or personal benefit or advantage will be derived from giving access to the material:
- Whether the documents are of general public interest or of interest to a substantial section of the public;
- If the information in the documents is publicly available; and
- Whether a substantial volume of documents has been requested and the level of work required to process the request.

Given the importance of the FOI Act in increasing public scrutiny and encouraging public debate.


