The classification allows us to have increased precision in our data reporting. This better reflects current industry standards and the workforce landscape and allows more detail and granularity with our work. This means, we can increase our responsiveness to

labour market trends and provide stronger insights to identify and communicate areas for upskilling, training and investment. Accurate statistics can also be collected on new occupations which allows us to map the workforce in relevant industries and map existing data to emerging occupations.

Through OSCA, and higher quality data, our products and research will reflect the current skills, roles and qualifications in demand. This ensures that education providers, training programs and workforce policies meet real world requirements and support a more capable and job ready workforce.
